WHEREAS, since 1983, SGI has been accredited as a Non-governmental 4 Organization (NGO) by the United Nations, and with its status as a NGO, SGI 6 has worked tirelessly to encourage harmony and coexistence between nations; and

WHEREAS, SGI was founded on Islan Guåhan on January 26, 1975, with one hundred fifty-eight (158) delegates from fifty-one (51) countries attending this auspicious occasion, to begin the grassroots activities of peace, education and culture, based on the humanistic outlook of Nichiren Buddhism; and

WHEREAS, Islan Guåhan was chosen as the venue to conduct the first World Peace Conference, given that a century of peace should begin from Islan Guåhan which suffered so terribly from the ravages of war; and

WHEREAS, during the conference SGI members nominated Mr. Daisaku Ikeda as the new president, at which time Mr. Ikeda called upon the members of SGI to devote their lives to planting seeds of peace throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, in commemoration of the 25th Anniversary of the founding of SGI, the First Pacific Islands New Millennium Peace Conference was held on Islan Guåhan, in which the participants adopted a resolution expressing the fundamental principles of human equality and the inherent dignity of life; and WHEREAS, Mr. Ikeda, whose belief is that only through that personal

interaction and dialogue across cultural and philosophical boundaries can

1 human beings nurture trust and understanding that is fundamental for lasting

- 18 Complex, Guam, SGI-USA will host a festival celebrating "Diverse Culture";

- WHEREAS, on January 17 through 21, 2005, at the University of Guam,

- 22 College, SGI-USA; the Indian Community of Guam; the African-American
