Relative to honoring, commending and congratulating the St. Paul Assembly of God's Church on its 30^{th} Anniversary and for all its spiritual contributions, dedication, guidance and spreading of God's word to the community and the people of Guam; and to extend a heartfelt *dangkolo na si Yu'os ma'ase* for its efforts to continue its good work and Christian responsibilities in our society.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, in 1958, Dr. Jon Pineda arrived on Guam and established
himself at the Yigo First Assembly of God Church. His Senior Pastors were
Carter, Buchette, Flewelling and Wiles. In 1961, Pastor John Burke took over

the leadership of the Yigo First Assembly of God Church. Immediately, he
saw the passion and the potential the young Pastor Jon Pineda had for the
Lord; and

4 WHEREAS, in 1972, Pastor Burke assigned Pastor Jon to take over a 5 young bible study group that was opened in the home of Greg and Irene Calvo. The Bible Study group increased in numbers. In 1975, Pastor Burke 6 released Pastor Jon to establish a new church, which would reach the local 7 people of Guam. Taking a few families with him, Pastor John planted the 8 9 church's roots across from the home of Greg and Irene Calvo. It was a small quonset hut that had no bathrooms, but it was a place to worship God as one 10 family; and 11

WHEREAS, in 1976, Typhoon Pamela devastated the island and 12 13 destroyed the little blossoming church. The word of the Lord came to Pastor Jon that he had to continue the ministry by breaking bread house to house, 14 thus the birth of the "care cell system". The worshippers met at the Kinsella 15 16 home in Agat, the Calvo home in Tamuning, and the Tydingco home in 17 Mangilao, and for a short time, they were able to hold a Bible Study at the home of Fr. Tim in Talofofo where nuns, priests, and the neighbors attended; 18 19 and

WHEREAS, two (2) months after Typhoon Pamela, the Burkes went on furlough, leaving Pastor Jon to shepherd the Yigo Assembly of God and the little Tamuning Church. The services were combined. At this time, another quonset hut was opened for Friday night youth services where members from Yigo, Tamuning, and another Pentecostal church sought counseling at a coffee shop located in front. The location eventually took the name "Teen
 Challenge"; and

3 WHEREAS, in 1977, upon the return of the Burkes, Pastor Jon was once again released to shepherd the Tamuning Church. The Lord opened up a 4 space at 7th and 9th floors of the ITC building. In 1982, the official name of the 5 Tamuning church became "Guam Christian Charismatic Church". In 1984, 6 the church had to move once again. Teen Challenge became the new location. 7 8 The coffee shop was closed down to expand the church and other parts of the 9 Quonset hut were refurbished to accommodate the growing needs of the Guam Christian Charismatic Church family; and 10

WHEREAS, from 1985 to 1987, negotiations to purchase property on 11 12 Route 16 was being made. In the end, Pastor Jon was able to purchase the property, which was appraised at the time for \$3M, for a miraculous sum of 13 One Hundred Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$135,000.00). However, the Lord 14 did not allow Teen Challenge to occupy the new location. In 1990, the church 15 offices were moved from the quonset hut to the Sunrise Apartments to once 16 again make room for the growing church. In 1992, with no more room to 17 expand, the church opened a second morning service; and 18

WHEREAS, in 1995, Senator Arriola sponsored a bill that changed zoning for the target location of the new church from agricultural and commercial, to a school zone, making it possible to finally break ground. After many years of waiting, Pastor Jon saw that it was time to build a \$3.4M multi-purpose structure located on Route 16 just below Motorola. The church once again needed room to grow. So in a year's time, ground was broken and construction began; and WHEREAS, in 1997, Teen Challenge moved to its new location, a one
building multi-functional facility. With the new building came a new vision
and a new name. The church is now called Saint Paul Assembly of God
Church, noting that the Apostle Paul had a great love for missions. In the fall,
a school was also founded, and initially was blessed with over one hundred
(100) students, ranging from K3-12th grades; and

WHEREAS, in 2001, Pastor Jon groomed his son, Pastor Paul, to take 7 over the leadership. This vision has always been to reach the island, the outer 8 9 islands, and all of Asia Pacific. Throughout the years, Pastor Jon had groomed many leaders to reach the world. However, Pastor Jon knew that 10 the time was coming when that vision would be taken to new heights through 11 his sons. In 2004, Pastor Paul spoke to the church leaders, preparing them for 12 the pouring of "fresh water" from the Lord. He shared the vision that God 13 had given him for the church. Fifteen (15) new ministries arose, one of which 14allowed the church to step into an arena it was always hesitant to walk into-15 reaching the government leaders of Guam. Forums were held and the gospel 16 17 was shared with our government officials breaking ground in their hearts for a great moving of the Lord; and 18

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2005, Pastor Jon announced that he was going to move on to a different ministry, reaching the people of Mindanao and other remote places. He stated that he would turn over the ministry through which he and his wife had so faithfully served the Lord to his son the Rev. Paul Pineda. The vision remains the same and will always be--to reach the world for God. But a new generation has come and there are still so many new and exciting things that God will show us in the years to come; now, therefore, be
