Relative to recognizing the week of May 21st to 28th, 2005 as "Safe Boating Week" and commending members of the Guam Safe Boating 2005 Planning Committee for their continued efforts in raising awareness of the importance of recreational boaters wearing life jackets.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, as an island community, we are blessed with opportunities
 to engage in recreational boating and other water activities that are both
 enjoyable and have inherent risks; and
- 6 WHEREAS, recreational boaters and their passengers can greatly

increase their chance of surviving serious accidents by wearing a personal
 floatation device (PFD) while boating; and

3 WHEREAS, operator-controllable factors are the cause of the vast 4 majority of boating accidents over the comparatively low percentage of 5 accidents due to the boat, equipment or environmental factors; and

6 WHEREAS, the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary, Flotilla 24 Guam, 7 is committed to improving boating safety, and, during the week-long 8 observance of "Safe Boating Week" from May 21st-28th, 2005, has planned 9 many activities and exhibits designed to enhance public awareness of boating 10 safety, improve vessel safety through free inspections, and present 11 opportunities for the exchange of information with federal and local officials 12 that have oversight of boating safety; and

13 WHEREAS, the United States Coast Guard Section Guam Command 14 Center coordinated two hundred thirty-three (233) Search and Rescue cases, 15 of which one hundred thirty-two (132) answered were stress alarms; two (2) 16 vessels were found adrift, un-manned; three (3) vessels were run aground; 17 one (1) aircraft emergency; thirty-three (33) capsized, disabled, or disoriented 18 vessels; five (5) diving accidents; three (3) flare signals; two (2) mayday 19 broadcasts; twenty (20) medically evacuated off-island; seven (7) calls for 20 overdue vessels; twenty-three (23) persons in water rescues; two (2) vessels 21 taking on water; and

WHEREAS, the United States Coast Guard's published "Boating Statistics 2002" provides laudable facts attributed to the exemplary efforts of the agency, including that boating fatalities have declined in the United States every year since 1997; eighty-five percent (85%) of those who drowned in serious boating accidents in 2002 were not wearing life jackets on board
 resulted in the tragic deaths of five hundred twenty-four (524) boaters and
 passengers, including twenty-eight (28) children; more than fifty-six percent
 (56%) of boating fatalities result from capsizing, falling over board, flooding,
 or unpredictable in-water experiences; and

6 WHEREAS, the National Safe Boating Council observes that, "although 7 boating fatalities and injuries have declined over more than two (2) decades, the 8 numbers remain high"; and

9 WHEREAS, knowledge and skills are important to reduce human error 10 and improve judgment, and if our people are aware of the risks they are likely 11 to take precautionary measures to protect themselves and their family and 12 friends; and

13 WHEREAS, the national theme for this year's observance is "Boat 14 Smart-Boat Safe-WEAR IT!" exemplifying the continuing effort of instilling 15 the lifesaving value of wearing personal floatation devices (PFD's); and

WHEREAS, a unified concern to improving activities and greater 16 17 prospects for successful outcomes in ocean-related endeavors has resulted in 18 the formation between various organizations, listed below, whose interests 19 are closely aligned with those of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 24 20 Guam, including the Guam Fishermen's Co-op, the Guam Jet Sport Racing 21 Association, the Marianas Paddlesports Racing Association, the Marianas 22 Yacht Club, the Sumay Yacht Club, the Guam Sailing Federation, the 4-H Kayak Club and the Sea Cadet Corps; and 23

24 WHEREAS, this year the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 24 Guam

and the U.S. Coast Guard, along with the support of the Guam Police 1 2 Department Territorial Boating Safety Office SEAS & Harbor Patrol Unit; the 3 Guam Fire Department, Fire Rescue; the Port Authority of Guam, the 4 Department of Parks and Recreation; the Guam Coastal Management 5 Program, the Bureau of Statistics and Plans; the HC-5 Helicopter Squadron; the Personal Watercraft Dealers Association; and the National Weather 6 7 Service are all working as the 2005 "Safe Boating Week" Planning Committee, taking part in a nationwide campaign to promote boating safety; now, 8 9 therefore, be it

10 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, 11 on behalf of the people of Guam, commend and congratulate the 2005 "Safe 12 Boating Week" Planning Committee and recognizes the week of May 21st to 13 28th, 2005 in observance of "Safe Boating Week" together with this year's 14 national theme: "Boat Smart, Boat Safe, WEAR IT!"; and be it further
