- 7 Defense Policy from the Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island; and
- 8 WHEREAS, his first flying experience was when he started taking
- 9 lessons from a college buddy in 1964 in a Cessna 120, N-4639-N; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Captain Owen served our country in the United States
- 11 Marines from 1966 through 1970, in the Nebraska Air National Guard from
- 12 1979 through 1994, and in the United States Air Force Reserve from 1994
- 13 through 1996; and
- 14 WHEREAS, his Marine service included a tour in Vietnam with fifty-
- 15 five (55) fighter-bomber combat missions and he has logged forty-six (46) day
- 16 and night carrier landings as a Marine Corps Aviator; and
- 17 WHEREAS, during his professional flying career, including twenty (20)
- 18 years with Continental Airlines and twenty-seven (27) years of military
- 19 tactical aviation, he has flown the following types of aircraft: Marines, Air
- 20 National Guard, and Air Force Reserve: T-37B Tweetybird, T-38A Talon, T-
- 21 A4F and J Skyhawk, A-6A and KA-6D Intruder, T-33A Shooting Star, RF-4C
- 22 Phantom II, F-15 Eagle, F-16 Falcon; and with Continental Airlines: DC-10
- 23 (Second Officer, First Officer and Captain), B-737 (Captain), B-747 (First
- 24 Officer), B-757/767 (Captain); and
