RELATIVE TO EXPRESSING THE OPPOSITION OF *I MINA'* BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN ON H.R. 5509 INTRODUCED IN THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES; AND TO EXPRESSING THE OPPOSITION OF *I MINA'* BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN ON S. 2674 INTRODUCED IN THE UNITED STATES SENATE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA' BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN

- 3 WHEREAS, we as an island community and as a country owe a debt of
- 4 gratitude to all veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces for protecting our freedoms;
- 5 WHEREAS, we have a moral responsibility to our wounded veterans to
- 6 assure them of all the support they need to function independently when they
- 7 return from duty;

- 1 WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guahan, the Guam Legislature, is concerned with
- 2 the provisions of America's Wounded Warrior (S. 2674) introduced in the United
- 3 States Senate;
- 4 WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guahan is equally concerned with the Nobel
- 5 Warrior Act (H.R. 5509) introduced in the United States House Representatives;
- 6 WHEREAS, the two measures, as proposed, drastically change the
- 7 disability compensation system for America's veterans;
- 8 WHEREAS, the measures are loosely based on the recommendations of the
- 9 President's Commission on Care for America's Wounded Warriors, also known
- 10 as the Dole/Shalala Commission, but the specifics of these bills would do great
- 11 harm to most veterans;
- 12 WHEREAS, if passed into law, S. 2674 and H.R. 5509, would offset VA
- 13 Disability Compensation by Social Security when the veteran ages 65;
- 14 WHEREAS, S. 2674 and H.R. 5509, as written, would apply to all currently
- 15 discharging veterans and any veteran under the U.S. Department of Veterans
- 16 Affairs (VA) current compensation system who files a subsequent claim for
- 17 additional benefits;

- 1 WHEREAS, under S. 2674 and H.R. 5509, once under the new system the
- 2 veteran cannot return to the current system;
- WHEREAS, under S. 2674 and H.R. 5509, protection for ratings in effect for
- 4 10 or more years would no longer apply;
- 5 WHEREAS, S. 2674 and H.R. 5509 would require the VA Secretary to
- 6 examine or consider: (a) the extent to which disability compensation may be used
- 7 as an incentive to undergo treatment; (b) the appropriate injuries to be covered
- 8 under the new disability rating system; and (c) "age" as a determining factor
- 9 when considering average loss of earnings capacity;
- 10 **WHEREAS**, S. 2674 and H.R. 5509 amend the law to provide the Secretary
- with authority to adopt and apply a rating schedule for "specific injuries" which
- would expressly limit VA authority over the Rating Schedule and places the
- authority in the hands of Congress;
- 14 WHEREAS, S. 2674 and H.R. 5509 provide for a quality of life payment,
- but only does so for those enrolled in the "new" compensation system;
- WHEREAS, S. 2674 and H.R. 5509 are discriminatory in that it allows or
- 17 suggests the VA may take into account the effect on potential future earnings

- 1 caused by the age of the veteran at the time a disability rating is assigned,
- 2 effectively allowing the VA to compensate an older veteran at a lower percentage
- 3 of disability than a younger veteran for the exact same disease or injury;
- WHEREAS, S. 2674 and H.R. 5509 provide that (a) as frequently as the VA
- 5 considers it appropriate, the VA must reevaluate and adjust the disability rating
- 6 for any veteran receiving compensation; (b) the VA must take into account any
- 7 adjustments in the rating schedule that occurred since the last assignment of a
- 8 rating; and (c) the frequency of reevaluations would be determined by an
- 9 examining physician;
- 10 WHEREAS, this places physicians back in the rating business, allowing for
- 11 frequent "adjustments" to a veteran's rating based on perceived improvement,
- and further allows reductions based on a change in the rating criteria even when
- 13 no improvement in the disability is shown;
- 14 WHEREAS, Disabled American Veterans, a 1.2 million-member
- organization of disabled veterans, opposes S. 2674 and H.R. 5509 because the
- 16 measures transitions veterans into the new system in a manner that will

- 1 overwhelm the VA's claims process and subject participants to scrutinizing
- 2 reexaminations indefinitely, or until a physician directs otherwise;
- 3 WHEREAS, the United States of America has the moral responsibility and
- 4 capacity to provide the best possible care to all veterans who were injured while
- 5 fighting to protecting our country and the freedoms we enjoy; and now therefore
- 6 be it
- 7 **RESOLVED,** that I Mina' Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, the Twenty-
- 8 Ninth Guam Legislature, on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby express
- 9 its opposition to S. 2674 introduced in the U.S. Senate;
- 10 **RESOLVED**, that I Mina' Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, the Twenty-
- 11 Ninth Guam Legislature, on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby express
- its opposition to H.R. 5509 and any other legislation which is detrimental to
- and/or discriminatory against this nation's veterans; and be it further
- 14 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to
- the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be transmitted to the Honorable
- 16 Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Member of Congress; to the Honorable Robert C. Byrd,
- 17 President Pro Tempore of the Senate; to the Honorable Harry Reid, Majority

- 1 Leader of the Senate; to the Honorable Mitch McConnell, Minority Leader of the
- 2 Senate; to the Honorable Daniel Akaka, Chairman of the Senate Committee on
- 3 Veterans' Affairs; to the Honorable Nancy Pelosi, Speaker of the House; to the
- 4 Honorable John Boehner, House Republican Leader; to the Honorable Robert
- 5 Filner, Chairman of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs; to the Honorable
- 6 Ike Skelton, Chairman of the House Armed Serves Committee; to Secretary of
- 7 Veterans Affairs James Peake, M.D.; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho,
- 8 Governor of Guam.
