Relative to urging Congressional Delegate Madeleine Z. Bordallo (D-Guam), and Congressional Delegate Eni Faleomaveaga (D-American Samoa) to request from the Comptroller General of the United States a report on the status of claims and an update on the service delivery of healthcare to veterans in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam and American Samoa.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, since the United States government began allowing the people of Guam to become members of the United States Armed Forces, a tradition of service has grown among the young adults of our island, and many Guamanians have distinguished themselves by serving their country, island and people with great distinction; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam strongly support all of the many veterans of
American wars, and our island has the singular distinction of having suffered more
casualties on a per capita basis than any other territory, state or insular area of the
United States in both the Korean conflict and the Vietnam War; and

11 WHEREAS, the growing number of active duty, guard, and reserve service 12 members from Guam who have toured or are serving tours of duty in the War on 13 Terror will continue to correspond to an increase in the number of veterans who will be 14 eligible for and who will be seeking veterans services; and

WHEREAS, the Honolulu Regional Office of the Department of Veteran Affairs
is responsible for administering VA benefit programs under the leadership and

direction of the Under Secretary for Benefits for the Veteran's Benefits Administration;
 and

WHEREAS, the Honolulu Regional Office serves the veterans of Hawaii and the
Western Pacific insular areas of the United States which include American Samoa,
Guam, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; and

6 WHEREAS, in November 1998 the U.S. General Accounting Office conducted a
7 study entitled "Veterans' Healthcare: Service Delivery for Veterans in Guam and the
8 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands" (GAO/HEHS-99-14); and

9 WHEREAS, the report was made at the request of then Guam Congressional 10 Delegate Robert A. Underwood, who asked GAO to (1) describe how VA currently 11 meets Guam and CNMI veterans' healthcare needs, (2) estimate future demand from 12 veterans, and (3) estimate the cost a veterans' inpatient ward at the U.S. Naval Hospital 13 in Guam; and

WHEREAS, it was noted in the report that while veterans in Guam would prefer more medical services based in Guam thereby avoiding the need for medical evacuations to Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu and other medical facilities in the U.S. Mainland, there is an insufficient workload reported by U.S. Navy officials in Guam to warrant providing such services in Guam; and

WHEREAS, while the report evaluated the quality of care given to veterans in Guam and the CNMI, it did not evaluate the processing of related claims at the Honolulu Regional Office, such as the average length of time it takes claims to be resolved and whether there is disparity in the level of attention or amount taken to resolve claims for veterans in the U.S. Pacific insular areas versus those who are within driving distance of the VA's medical center and regional office in Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, veterans in Guam routinely raise their frustrations with the claims process, and because of these frustrations they instead choose not to seek the VA services to which they are rightfully entitled, and discourage other veterans from seeking such services; now, therefore, be it

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1 **RESOLVED**, that I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guahan does hereby, on 2 behalf of the people of Guam, request the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam 3 Delegate to Congress and the Honorable Eni Fa'aua'a Hunkin Faleomavaega, Jr., 4 American Samoa Delegate to Congress to request Acting Comptroller General Gene L. 5 Dodaro to direct the Government Accountability Office to conduct a study and report 6 on the status of veteran claims from American Samoa, Guam, and the Commonwealth 7 of the Northern Marianas Islands, to include a comparison of the claims processing for 8 Hawaii veterans vs. those from American insular areas; and be it further

9 **RESOLVED**, that I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guahan does hereby, on 10 behalf of the people of Guam, further request the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, 11 Guam Delegate to Congress and the Honorable Eni Fa'aua'a Hunkin Faleomavaega, Jr., 12 American Samoa Delegate to Congress to request that Acting Comptroller General Dodaro direct the Government Accountability Office to update and include American 13 Samoa in GAO's November 1998 report "Veterans' Healthcare: Service Delivery for 14 Veterans in Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands;" and be it 15 16 further
