Relative to requesting the United Nations to admit Taiwan to meaningfully participate in the activities of the United Nations specialized agencies.

- WHEREAS, the Taiwan began its campaign in 1993 to be a member of the
- 4 United Nations; and
- 5 WHEREAS, this year, since the election of the new government in Taiwan,
- 6 Taiwan has decided to ask for inclusion in the UN specialized agencies, such as the
- 7 World Health Organization (WHO) and the International Maritime Organization
- 8 (IMO), and other agencies relative to dealing with global issues; and
- 9 **WHEREAS**, the people of Taiwan are in general support of the UN campaign;
- 10 and
- WHEREAS, the issue of failure to include an economy with Twenty Three
- 12 Million people is a breach of the UN system, and Taiwan has been denied
- participation in conferences, mechanisms, and conventions dealing with important
- 14 global issues that affect all the peoples of the world; and
- WHEREAS, Taiwan has not been able to establish a direct access and
- 16 communication with the WHO on disease prevention and implementation of the

1 International Health Regulations, and does not have timely assistance when 2 epidemics such as SARRS occur; and

WHEREAS, since Taiwan does not have direct access to the IMO, it does not have first hand information on shipping matters, and the validity of Taiwan's Seaman's Certificates has been frequently challenged, despite Taiwan having the world's 10th largest shipping capacity; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan is the world's 18th largest economy and the 20th largest outbound investor and with this economic strength Taiwan wishes to directly interact with other developing countries by offering technical and humanitarian assistance, to the benefit of all; and

WHEREAS, membership in the UN specialized agencies, with their functional and technical nature, would help promote peace and cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region; the two sides of the Taiwan Strait would be able to set aside differences and strengthen cooperation on issues of mutual concern, thereby reducing misunderstanding and friction gradually, thus the possibility of conflict in the Taiwan Strait will be greatly reduced and the stability and prosperity in the Asia-Pacific region will be further strengthened; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina' Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, supports Taiwan's appeal to the United Nations to have full participation in the United Nations specialized agencies to ensure the fundamental rights of Taiwan's Twenty Three Million people and promote the welfare of all mankind; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the President, Taiwan; to the Director General, Taipei Economic and Cultural Office
