## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA' BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, National Recovery Month takes place every September and is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT); and

WHEREAS, the theme for National Recovery Month this September 2008 is "Join the Voices For Recovery – Real People, Real Recovery"; and
