3 WHEREAS, Jeff David Tainatongo Barcinas was born on January 18,
4 1956, a proud son of Guam, and;

5 WHEREAS, Dr. Jeff D.T. Barcinas, affectionately referred to as Dr. Jeff 6 by his friends and colleagues, leaves the University of Guam as the Vice 7 President of University and Community Engagement, after decades of service, 8 leaving behind a legacy of excellence in higher education on Guam, and;

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Jeff graduated from Father Duenas Memorial High 10 School, in June 1974, then attended the University of Guam from June 1972 to 11 May 1976, eventually transferring to California State Polytechnic University in Pomona, California and obtaining his Bachelor of Science Degree in
 Agriculture Business Management in June 1979, and;

WHEREAS, not wanting to rest on his academic laurels, Dr. Jeff 3 pursued higher education obtaining a Master of Arts degree in Agricultural 4 Economics from Washington State University in Pullman, Washington in 5 August 1981 in which his Master's Project titled, Small Farm Record Book 6 7 System was eventually published as a Cooperative Extension Manual. He then 8 continued his education reaching his goal of obtaining a Doctor of Philosophy(Ph.D.) degree in Agricultural Education the Ohio State University 9 in Columbus Ohio in December of 1989, with an emphasis on Extension 10 11 Education, Research & Statistics, Administration in Higher Education, and Evaluation, and; 12

13 WHEREAS, Dr. Jeff was first hired at the University of Guam in August 5, 1979 as an Extension Agent I, and was quickly promoted through the ranks 14 reaching the position of Extension Agent IV in August of 1991. The following 15 year, he was promoted to Associate Dean of the Cooperative Extension 16 17 Service at the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. In August of 1996, Dr. Jeff was chosen as the new Dean of the College of Agriculture and Life 18 19 the University of Guam and Director of the Agriculture at Sciences 20 Experiment Station and Director of the Cooperative Extension Service, 21 positions that he held until May 2003, with the exception of the Directorship 22 of the Cooperative Extension Service which he held until October 2007, and;

23 WHEREAS, as Dr. Jeff's ability as an administrator became well known, 24 he was called on to serve the University community in many other positions. 25 In August 2000, he was named Acting Vice President for Academic Affairs, 1 then served as the Acting Associate Vice President for Enrollment 2 Management and Student Services from April 2002 to May 2003, a role that 3 endeared him to the students of the University of Guam and earned him their 4 respect, and;

2003, by the wisdom 5 of the WHEREAS. in May University Administration, Dr. Jeff was named Acting Vice President, University and 6 7 Community Engagement, and in March 2005, was permanently appointed the 8 Vice President, University and Community Engagement, a position he has held until his retirement from the University of Guam and the Government of 9 10 Guam, and;

WHEREAS, as Vice President, University and Community Engagement, 11 12 Dr, Jeff's primary duties were, establishing the new initiative of the President 13 in establishing the engagement agenda for the University of Guam, including the strengthening of the Land Grant Mission of the University of Guam in the 14 15 area of Public Service; Focusing on strengthening the federal and local 16 relations, including regional and national government partners and Increasing the revenue opportunities 17 for the Professional organizations; Lifelong English 18 Development and Center, Language Institute, 19 Telecommunications and Distance Education Operations, and TRIO programs 20 and other auxiliary units. Finally, he was tasked with initiating a University-21 the wide extension program working Cooperative Extension Service 22 component and expand the extension outreach opportunities from local 23 government, business and industrial sector, private organizations, and the community of Guam with the University of Guam as the 'resource of choice', 24 25 and:

WHEREAS, as a result of his combination of education, talent, drive, 1 2 and ability, Dr. Jeff was appointed to sit on several organizations, panels, and committees including; Advisory Member for Region IX - Southwest States 3 4 and Pacific Basin Regional Water Quality Program from September 2007 - to 5 Present; USDA National Program Review Team for Region IX – Southwest States and Pacific Basin Regional Water Quality Program - September 2008 -6 7 Honolulu, Hawaii; Farm Bill Committee representative for Insular Areas, 8 Board on Agriculture, National Association of State University and Land Grant Colleges, Washington, D.C. - 2004 - November 2008; Western Region 9 10 Extension Committee on Program (ECOP) Representative for Programs - 4 11 year appointment- (ECOP is the National Umbrella for programming of the Cooperative Extension Service across all 106 land grant institutions) -12 13 February 2004 - October 2007; Federal Liaison for Insular Area Land Grant 14 Institution for Federal Programs and serve with other key members across the 15 1994 and 1890 Land Grant Institutions working closely with the federal 16 partners; Governor Felix Camacho and Lt. Governor Kaleo Moylan Education 17 Transition Team Chairman - 2001-2002; Member on Articulation Committee 18 between 1862's, 1890's, 1994's, and Insular Area Land Grant Institutions. 19 Resolution passed by the Administrative Heads and the Board on Agriculture 20 to encouraged the full cooperation and partnership between the land grant 21 American Samoa Community College Land Grant Program institutions; 22 USDA Federal Review Team - Appointment by United States Department of 23 Agriculture, Cooperative State Research, Education, and Extension Service; 24 and many others, and;

WHEREAS, Dr. Jeff is the recipient of many awards among which are; 1 Director Emeritus - Western Association of Cooperative Extension Directors, March 2 2008; NASULGC Plaque of Recognition for Service as member of the Extension 3 Committee on Organization and Policy, November 2007; Top Ten Donor – University 4 of Guam Endowment Foundation - 2007; Lifetime Donor - University of Guam 5 Endowment Foundation – 2002; Nominated and Selected International Distinguished 6 Scientific Leader, 2002; Nominated and Selected Outstanding Young Man of 7 America, 1981, 1989; Inducted in Chi Omicron Gamma Honorary Fraternity, 8 9 University of Guam, 1990; Inducted into Gamma Sigma Delta, Agricultural Honorary 10 Fraternity - Ohio State University Beta Chapter, 1988; Nominated for Who/ Who's in 11 Guam in Twentieth Century, 1990; and numerous other certificates of appreciation 12 and recognition for various University and community work, and;

WHEREAS, Dr. Jeff has been a driving force in the University in the 13 14 writing and obtaining of federal grants that has enabled the University to provide services to the people of Guam, some of those grants include; 15 16 Innovations Grant for Accountability Workshop for Insular Areas. United Stated Department of Agriculture, Cooperative State Research, Education, and 17 Extension Services, Washington, D.C. 2004. - \$25,000 and with supplemental 18 19 reserve for \$25,000; Sea Grant Program in Guam, United States Department of Commerce, National Office on Atmospheric Administration, National Sea Grant 20 Office, Washington, D.C. \$100,000 with a second year funding for extension and 21 22 programs; Project Youth Empowerment. Youth-at-Risk USDA Grant. Cooperative Extension Service. United States Department of Agriculture: Washington, D.C. -23 24 \$150,000; Animal Waste Management in Guam. Water Quality Initiative USDA Grant. Cooperative Extension Service. Untied States Department of Agriculture: 25 26 Washington, D.C. - \$66,000; and many others, and;

WHEREAS, in addition to his many positions that he has held in the 1 2 University, Dr. Jeff has also been very active in University and College 3 Committees and activities. 1994; Resource Person, Marianas Council on Resource Conservation and 1 Development- 1991-1994; served as Chairman, Marianas Council on Resource 2 Conservation and Development - 1993 - 1994; was the Co-Coordinator, 3 Governor Task Force on Development of Agricultural Policy - 1991 1994; 4 served as the CALS Liaison, Soil and Water Conservation Districts; Member, 5 Young Men's League of Guam - June 1981 - present; Scholarship Committee 6 Chairman, Young Men's League of Guam. - June 1990 - 1994; Vice President, 7 Young Men's League of Guam - June 1985 - May 1986; Secretary, Young Men's 8 League of Guam - June 1983 - June 1984; Member, Knights of Columbus -9 10 Council No.5666 Guam - March 1982 - 1994; Charter Grand Knight, Council No. 11508. Merizo, Guam. November 1994 - present; and Member, Knights of 11 12 Columbus Assembly 1555 Guam - 4th degree, June 1992 – present, and;

13 WHEREAS, Dr. Jeff D.T. Barcinas, dedicated his career to advancing the 14 land grant mission of the University of Guam and established a positive 15 working relationship with the staff, faculty, administrators and students of the 16 University of Guam; now, therefore, be it
