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- WHEREAS, the late Mrs. Esther Taitano Underwood was born on
- 4 March 14, 1913 to Juan San Nicolas Taitano and the former Rosario Sablan
- 5 Flores; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood was married to John Joseph Underwood,
- 7 with whom she had nine children Annie, Rosario (deceased), James, Carmen,
- 8 John, Richard, Mary (deceased), Francis (deceased), and Robert; and
- WHEREAS, after graduating from the eighth (8th) grade in 1928, Mrs.
- 10 Underwood at the age of fifteen (15) began her distinguished education
- 11 career; and
- 12 WHEREAS, like many of her contemporaries and teaching colleagues,

- 1 Mrs. Underwood began to advance the education of their students first, before
- 2 taking advantage of the opportunity to advance their own; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood and those who taught in the classroom
- 4 before World War II paved the way for education as we know it today, their
- 5 training and their resources were very limited, but they improvised and used
- 6 their imagination and their own enthusiasm for learning to produce countless
- 7 number of students, who could read and write, continue the life-long process
- 8 of learning, and who could think for themselves; and
- 9 WHEREAS, in addition to teaching young minds and touching of young
- 10 hearts, Mrs. Underwood also taught adult evening classes in Sumay from 1935
- 11 to 1937; and
- 12 WHEREAS, after World War II, Mrs. Underwood taught junior high
- 13 grades at Agana Heights and Sinajana; and
- WHEREAS, in 1957, Mrs. Underwood earned her Associate Arts Degree
- 15 from the Territorial College of Guam; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood was offered a scholarship to the University
- of California to major in special education, later changing her mind to attend
- 18 Long Beach State College at her own expense, where she received her
- 19 Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1963; and
- 20 **WHEREAS**, after returning to Guam, Mrs. Underwood taught at C.L.
- 21 Taitano Elementary in Sinajana; and
- WHEREAS, in 1964, Mrs. Underwood became the assistant principal at
- 23 Tamuning Elementary, and in 1966 she was assigned as the assistant principal
- 24 at Wettengel Elementary and served also as its acting principal; and

WHEREAS, the island community recognizes the contributions of Mrs. 1 Underwood in making sure the island's youth are educated and productive 2 members of society; and 3 WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood will be remembered as one of Guam's 4 Pioneer of Education; and 5 WHEREAS.
