Relative to honoring Atkins Kroll, Inc. on its selection as the 2007 Business Laureate of the Year and a sincere *Biba Complianos* and sincere appreciation on its 90th year of outstanding continuous contributions for the betterment of our Island Community and its people.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- 2 WHEREAS, Atkins Kroll and Co., Ltd was established by G. David Atkins
- 3 and Clifton Kroll in San Francisco in 1906 to facilitate trade between the United
- 4 States and Australia; and
- 5 **WHEREAS,** in 1914, at the invitation of appointed Guam Governor, Captain
- 6 W.B. Maxwell, USN, through the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce, the
- 7 founders established Atkins Kroll (Guam) Ltd. to coordinate the copra trade in
- 8 the Pacific Islands; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Atkins Kroll, Inc. Inc. is the oldest corporation on Guam growing
- 2 alongside Guam's economy since its establishment over 90 years ago; and
- 3 **WHEREAS**, a chronology of Atkins Kroll, Inc.'s major accomplishments
- 4 reads: 1914 Atkins Kroll (Guam) Ltd. was established on Guam to coordinate
- 5 the growing copra trade in the Pacific islands; 1915 Annie M. Campbell arrived
- 6 on Guam for Atkins Kroll with 12 automobiles, 250,000 feet of lumber, 650 tons
- 7 of general merchandise and 26 chickens; 1915 Atkins Kroll was designated as
- 8 agents for Liverpool and London and Globe Insurance Co., Ltd.; Atkins Kroll
- 9 supplies Victor Records and Victrolas for the people of Guam; Atkins Kroll
- 10 began importing Ford cars, trucks, tires and spare parts; 1917 Atkins Kroll
- 11 completes and launches its 48-foot gasoline tug powerboat named the Kavara
- 12 built entirely on Guam, beginning a tradition of training and developing the local
- 13 workforce for specialized skills; and
- 14 WHEREAS, in 1918: Atkins Kroll acquires a coconut plantation in northern
- 15 Guam to raise cattle in order to supply the island with meat; 1921 Atkins Kroll
- 16 was appointed agent for Chevrolet automobiles and accessories; and 1922 --
- 17 Atkins Kroll opens 300-acre copra plantation in Tarague with two (2) furnished
- 18 houses and a windmill to generate electricity; 1923 -- Atkins Kroll establishes

- 1 agent relationship with Singer Sewing Machines, Armour Products and Indian
- 2 Motorcycles; 1924 on April 26, 1924 Atkins Kroll's general manager, Mr. H.U.
- 3 Umstad, organizes with local businessman C.C. Butler, the first meeting of the
- 4 Guam Chamber of Commerce; 1925 Atkins Kroll becomes agent for Buick
- 5 motorcars. It's general manager, Mr. H.U. Umstad, manages the Agana Cubs
- 6 baseball team; 1926 Atkins Kroll becomes agent for Brunswick tires and tubes;
- 7 Atkins Kroll's Agana Cubs wins the 1926 Guam Baseball Series and are
- 8 presented the trophy; 1927 in March 1927, Atkins Kroll's Agana Cubs are in first
- 9 place in the baseball league standings between the Navy, Marines, and
- 10 Education. The Cubs win the Guam Baseball Series that year; 1930 the Atkins
- 11 Kroll Tarague copra plantation is closed due to continuing low market prices;
- 12 and
- WHEREAS, in 1934 Atkins Kroll establishes agent relationship with Ford
- 14 Motor Company, General Motors Company, Victor Phonograph and Victor
- 15 Records; 1937 Atkins Kroll adds Nasco Oil Stoves, Coal stoves, petroleum
- 16 products, building materials, plumbing supplies, beds, paints, oils and varnishes
- 17 to its product lines; 1938 Atkins Kroll sells American-made popular bicycles
- 18 and becomes agent for Dollar Line; 1939 Atkins Kroll becomes agent for

- 1 American President Lines and S.S. Admiral Halstead. AK's general manager,
- 2 Fred Fall was elected treasurer of the Rotary Club. 1940 Atkins Kroll ships assist
- 3 in the American defense efforts in the Micronesia area; 1941 Atkins Kroll
- 4 becomes agent for San Miguel Brewery and Goodrich International Rubber Co.;
- 5 1942 at the request of the U.S. government, Atkins Kroll organized the Pacific
- 6 Coast Copra Committee to handle all sales and distribution of copra and palm
- 7 kernels for the Commodity Credit Corporation on the Pacific Coast during
- 8 WWII; and
- 9 WHEREAS, in 1949 - Atkins Kroll Insurance Division is formed. Atkins Kroll 10 is incorporated with the #1 corporate certificate; 1954 - Atkins Kroll wins bid to 11 take over the government-controlled Island Trading Company to handle the 12 collection and marketing of copra produced in the Trust Territory; Atkins Kroll 13 divisions now include: General Motors, insurance, steamship, general imports, 14 beer and accounting; 1960 - Atkins Kroll expands operations to the Northern 15 Marianas with the opening of Microl Corporation; 1961 - Atkins Kroll establishes 16 agency relations with Pacific Far East Lines, Inc.; Atkins Kroll becomes insurance representative for New Zealand Insurance Co., Lloyds of London and GM 17 18 distributors;1964 - Atkins Kroll contracted by Copra Stabilization Board to

- 1 market copra for the Trust Territories; 1970 Atkins Kroll acquires the Toyota
- 2 automobile franchise; 1971 AKtion Travel Service opens on June 10, 1971; 1974 -
- 3 Inchcape Group, an international organization with headquarters in London,
- 4 acquires Atkins Kroll, Co., Ltd.; 1987 Atkins Kroll acquires the Yamaha
- 5 franchise; Toyota dealership outlets open in Anigua and Dededo; Atkins Kroll
- 6 divisions now include: automotive, hotel & restaurant, wines & spirits, shipping,
- 7 consumer products, and insurance;
- 8 **WHEREAS,** in 1989 Atkins Kroll celebrates its 75th Anniversary; 1991 -
- 9 Atkins Kroll launches the Lexus franchise; 1992 invested heavily in facilities to
- 10 improve level of customer service; 1995 Atkins Kroll winds down Yamaha
- 11 franchise which is eventually sold; Atkins Kroll closes its hotel & restaurant,
- 12 wines and spirits and consumer products divisions; construction of the General
- 13 Motors/Mercedes Benz parts & service buildings, and the Mercedes Benz sales
- 14 building is completed. Atkins Kroll Insurance is purchased by AON Insurance;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, in 1998 Atkins Kroll leaves the shipping business, after 84 years
- 17 of offering a diversified line of products and services. Atkins Kroll is now purely
- 18 an automobile sales and service business; 1999 Atkins Kroll discontinues the

- 1 Mercedes-Benz line; 2000 2003 technological upgrades of over \$100,000.00;
- 2 2003 Atkins Kroll achieves 41% market share; 2000 2004 Atkins Kroll
- 3 maintains number one auto dealership status with 45% market share; 2004 -
- 4 Atkins Kroll completes renovation and expansion of the Atkins Krol Body Shop;
- 5 2006 Atkins Kroll increased market share to 50%; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Atkins Kroll's tremendous contribution to the people of Guam
- 7 has been through automotive services, sales of consumer products, insurance
- 8 and shipping services, employment opportunities for hundreds of residents, and
- 9 major civic contributions to numerous non-profit organizations year after year;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, Atkins Kroll's contributions to the community include donations
- 12 to the American Red Cross (Guam Chapter) for typhoon relief aid, the annual
- 13 Relay for Life for cancer victims, the annual Guam Liberation Day Parade, Make-
- 14 a-Wish Foundation, Guam's Baseball Leagues, Junior Achievement, Boy Scouts
- of America and Special Olympics. Atkins Kroll is a founding member of the
- 16 Guam Chamber of Commerce and the Rotary Club of Guam; and
- 17 WHEREAS, as an active member of our community, Atkins Kroll, Inc. and
- 18 continues to contribute towards the prosperous growth of our Island. Atkins

- 1 Kroll, Inc. operates a variety of businesses that employ hundreds of local
- 2 residents and for 90 years continues to provide essential services to the people of
- 3 Guam; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Atkins Kroll, Inc. actively helps the People of Guam through its
- 5 contributions in numerous civic, community, and religious activities; and, now
- 6 therefore, be it
- 7 **RESOLVED**, that the members of *I Mina' Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*
- 8 honor Atkins Kroll, Inc. on their nomination as the Guam Chamber of
- 9 Commerce's 2007 Business Laureate and will join other distinguished members
- 10 of the Guam Business Hall of Fame and further extend to the company a sincere
- 11 Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' for the outstanding contributions they have
- 12 made for the betterment of our Island Community; and, be it further
- RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature
- 14 attests to, the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter
- 15 transmitted to Atkins Kroll, Inc., the Guam Chamber of Commerce and to the
- 16 Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I Maga'lahen Guåhan.
