## I MINA' BENTE ÑEUBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN TWENTY-NINTH GUAM LEGISLATURE 2007 (FIRST) Regular Session

RELATIVE TO REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT TO EXTEND THE APPLICATION AND COVERAGE OF MEDICARE ENTITLEMENTS TO ITS ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS WHO HAVE EARNED THESE MEDICARE BENEFITS AND WHO CHOOSE TO OBTAIN QUALITY HEALTH AND MEDICAL CARE SERVICES IN THE PHILIPPINES.



## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA' BENTE ÑEUBI NA LIHESLATURAN **GUÅHAN:**

WHEREAS, over the years many of Guam's residents have acquired 3 quality health and medical care services from healthcare clinics and medical 4 hospital facilities in Guam or in various locations throughout the United States, to include Hawaii, Los Angeles-California, Seattle-Washington, etc., through the application and use of their Medicare health entitlements; and,

WHEREAS, in recent years a growing number of Guam residents have sought quality medical care at facilities such as St. Luke's Hospital, Makati Medical Health Center, Asian Hospital, and others, located in the Philippines, which is geographically within close proximity to Guam (with a flight time of slightly over three hours); and

WHEREAS, the much closer geographical location of the Philippines medical facilities, combined with the less restrictive cost of medical care and 1 travel expenses, allows for a greater number of Guam patients to have family

2 members and friends accompany them and offer direct supervision or

assistance on the medical trip as they receive much-needed healthcare

4 services; and

WHEREAS, many Guam residents who have earned their U. S. Medicare benefits and entitlements have expressed an interest in obtaining necessary medical treatment in the Philippines, which in most instances result in lower medical treatment costs, lesser travel time, and a reduction in travel expenses; and

WHEREAS, the level of treatment being administered by some of the medical hospital facilities in the Philippines have been appropriately recognized by medical hospital affiliates in the United States for their provision of good, quality medical care that is equivalent to or better than the minimum medical care standards required in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Guam residents and U. S. citizens, who are eligible Medicare beneficiaries, should be provided the opportunity to obtain medical and health care services in medical hospitals and facilities of their choice, in compliance with Medicare program requirements; particularly to include medical facilities in the Philippines, as this would result in lower costs and allow for family members to provide necessary support and assistance during this time of personal need; and

WHEREAS, the United States of America and the Republic of the Philippines have been mutual economic and political partners, friends, and allies for more than one hundred years, whereupon the extension of Medicare entitlements for qualified U. S. citizens receiving medical treatment in the Philippines would further reinforce this relationship and promote the sharing of resources within the healthcare industry; and

WHEREAS, recent actions and decisions have been made that further recognize the special relationship between the United States of America and the Philippines which include: Filipino veterans who served in the U. S. Army during World War II recently obtained their U. S. citizenship and the benefit of retaining up to 75% of their Supplemental Security Income (SSI) when they return to the Philippines; Filipino Veterans have also recently been granted additional healthcare benefits by the U. S. Congress; since July, 2003, U. S. Medicare recipients from Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands who obtain medical care in the Philippines are provided limited reimbursement for specific medical care treatment services that is not available in Guam and the CNMI; and, health insurance companies in the U. S., to include the Tricare health plan for active duty and retired military personnel, have permitted health insurance coverage for medical services obtained in the Philippines; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina' Bente Ñuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan (Twenty Ninth Guam Legislature)* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, respectfully request the United States Government, through the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services and the U. S. Congress (if necessary), to extend the application and coverage of Medicare entitlements to its eligible recipients who have earned these Medicare benefits and who choose to obtain quality health and medical care services in the Philippines,

1 consistent with Medicare rules, regulations, quality assurances, cost-2 effectiveness, and other Medicare program requirements; be it further

RESOLVED, that I Mina Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan (Twenty Ninth Guam Legislature) does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, request the support of the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam Delegate to the U. S. House of Representatives, to aggressively pursue this effort in realizing the extension of Medicare healthcare benefits coverage to qualified recipients who receive medical treatment and healthcare services in the Philippines; and to coordinate the timely and effective implementation of this unique and much-needed healthcare service upon its approval by the appropriate U. S. Governmental authorities for the benefit of eligible Guam residents; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to The Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United States of America; The Honorable Harry Reid, Majority Leader, United States Senate; The Honorable Nancy Pelosi, Speaker, U. S. House of Representatives; The Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam Delegate, U. S. House of Representatives; The Honorable Mike Leavitt, Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services; Mr. Tom Scully, Director of the Center for Medicare Services, U. S. Department of Health and Human Services; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
