Relative to recognizing the accomplishments and dedication of the late Army Major Henry S.N. Ofeciar, and to extend sincere condolences to his family on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY I LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, the late Army Major Henry S.N. Ofeciar was born on July 5, 1970 to his proud parents, Agnes San Nicolas Rillera, Pedro Ofeciar, and Leonard Mendiola

Rillera, was called to his eternal reward on Monday, August 27, 2007 at the age of

WHEREAS, the official word from the Army is that Major Henry S.N. Ofeciar

died on August 27 from injuries sustained in an attack in Jalalabad as a result of small

arms fire and RPGs. Ofeciar was assigned to the 1st Infantry Division out of Fort

9 Riley, Kansas; and

10 WHEREAS, those who knew him best describe "Hank", as he was

affectionately known, as truly an officer and a gentleman. Since his passing, the

countless recollections about the man that we've likewise been told describe a happy

person and proud islander, dedicated to his family, his friends, his country and his

homeland. When our nation needed him to serve in a time of crisis, without hesitation,

15 Hank knew that it was an obligation to serve his armed forces he so loved and

cherished. Hank knew that freedom was not free. He knew that there were a number of soldiers before him that paid the ultimate price so that we could partake in the freedom that we all sometimes take for granted; and

WHEREAS, Hank's easy-going, playful nature juxtaposed the heart of a true soldier. Having received his commission from the Army in 1993 after graduating from the University of Guam, Hank went on to earn a master's degree in finance from Syracuse University. His duties posted him all over the world, most recently with the formidable 1st Infantry Division out of Fort Riley, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, in the words of Major General Donald Goldhorn, commandant of the Guam National Guard, "Major Ofeciar served with flawless distinction as a leader of a dedicated training team responsible for working with the Afghan Police;"

WHEREAS, Major Ofeciar during his lifetime was many things to the many people who had the privilege of knowing him – he was a jokester, confidant, steadfast listener, that comforting smile when you needed someone to be there for you, and that type of person that would call you out of the blue and welcome you over, even after years of being away; and

WHEREAS, the history he helped to forge and the flag he gave his life to defend doesn't shield the pain felt by those he leaves behind. His parents, in-laws, and scores of acquaintances shed tears, both for the man that's no longer with us, but also with pride for the manner in which he gave his life. Hank literally died doing what he lived to do; and

WHEREAS, I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, together with I Maga'lahen Guåhan on behalf of a truly grateful people, honor the life of a hero and welcome home our brother, Major Henry S.N. Ofeciar, a man of faith, courage and conviction. A man of honor. To his family, friends and all those whose lives were touched by Major Henry S.N. Ofeciar, I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, together with I Maga'lahen Guåhan, want you to know that the people of Guam stand

with you as we remember the life and the legacy of this brave soldier. Our sincerest condolences and our deepest gratitude and our support during this very difficult time; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* joins our island community to pay tribute to the late Army Major Henry S. Ofeciar, an outstanding young man who cared for America and now becomes one of America's heroes who made the ultimate sacrifice. His memory will forever live in the hearts of the Family and the people of Guam. More importantly, Army Major Henry S. Ofeciar will forever be remembered in the minds and hearts of his parents, siblings, his family at the Guam Army National Guard and the people of Guam; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** that *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, remember Army Major Henry S.N. Ofeciar for his unselfish service to the United States of America and the people of Guam and for making the ultimate sacrifice in combat while serving in the United States Armed Services on August 27, 2007; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Family of the late Army Major Henry S.
