WHEREAS, the mission of Big Brothers Big Sisters has been to help children reach their potential, as it continues to be the leader in one-to-one youth service for more than a century, developing positive relationships that have a direct and lasting impact on the lives of young people, mentoring children ages six (6) through eighteen (18) throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, the mentoring programs of Big Brothers Big Sisters – which have been endorsed by Presidents and First Ladies including: Theodore Roosevelt, Calvin Coolidge, Bill Clinton and Laura Bush have shown, through national research, that positive relationships between youth and their Big Brothers and Big Sisters mentors have a direct and measurable impact on children's lives. By participating in our youth mentoring programs, Little Brothers and Sisters are forty-six percent (46%) less likely to begin using illegal drugs, twenty-seven percent (27%) less likely to begin using alcohol and fifty-two percent (52%) less likely to skip school; and

WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Guam seeks to provide the same quality volunteer and professional mentoring services for children and youth and assists them in achieving their highest potential as they grow to become responsible men and women; and

WHEREAS, the corporate mentoring partners with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Guam such as: the Bank of Guam, the Bank of Hawaii and the Citibank, N.A. have unconditionally devoted their time and efforts to positively influence students around the island; and

1 WHEREAS, students attending Price Elementary School, Maria Ulloa Elementary School, Carbullido Elementary School, Tamuning Elementary 2 School, Marcial Sablan Elementary School, Agueda I. Johnston Middle School, 3 Vicente S.A. Benavente Middle School, F. B. Leon Guerrero Middle School and 4 Untalan Middle School were able to receive support through intervention and 5 prevention programs, as well as educational and community involvement, 6 7 allowing each child to achieve their potential and function in society with a 8 greater degree of independence; and 9 WHEREAS, the community mentor partners with Big Brothers Big 10 Sisters of Guam such as: Island Girl Power!, the Mangilao Mayor's Office, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the Department of 11 Youth Affairs, with their support, hard work and dedication, continue to 12
