Relative to endorsing and supporting the Department of *Chamorro* Affairs and the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency in their efforts to secure Guam's bid to host the Twelfth (12th) Festival of Pacific Arts in 2016.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, the Festival of Pacific Arts (FESTPAC), which is the 4 equivalent of the Olympics of Cultural Arts, was conceived by the Conference 5 of the South Pacific Commission (now the Pacific Community) in an attempt 6 to combat the erosion of traditional customary practices. The Festival of Pacific Arts grew out of the desire, expressed by Pacific Island leaders, for the
peoples of the region to share their cultures and establish deeper
understanding and friendship between countries; and

WHEREAS, beginning in 1972, delegations from the various Pacific 4 Island Countries and territories have come together every four (4) years to 5 6 share and exchange their culture at the Festival of Pacific Arts. Today's twenty-seven (27) participating countries and territories include: American 7 8 Samoa, Australia, Cook Islands, Easter Island, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji Islands, French Polynesia, Hawaii, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Nauru, New 9 Caledonia, New Zealand, Niue, Norfolk Island, Northern Mariana Islands, 10 11 Palau, Papua New Guinea, Pitcairn Islands, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tokelau, 12 Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, Wallis and Futuna, and Guam, with the number of 13 participants exceeding more than two thousand (2,000) people; and

WHEREAS, the Festival of Pacific Arts is recognized as a major international cultural event, and is the largest gathering in which Pacific peoples unite to gain respect for and appreciation of one another within the context of the changing Pacific; and

WHEREAS, trade, social visits and exchanges of dance, music, food and crafts have served as opportunities for islanders to learn from one another, and have assisted in the dynamic transformation of culture. Today, the Festival of Pacific Arts helps maintain a sense of place among island communities: awareness that, although a group of people may reside on tiny atolls far from island neighbors, they are part of a greater Pacific-wide culture. Recognition of a common Pacific identity can be a strong motivating force for individual communities to revive and cherish their own traditional forms of
cultural expression; and

3 WHEREAS, Pacific Islanders were traditionally raised in an environment that taught them their local language, history and traditional 4 5 knowledge and skills, but many ways of passing on these traditions and skills 6 are disappearing. A realization of what has been missing in the more 7 Westernized island cultures is one of the reasons young islanders train long 8 and hard for each Festival, seeking to uncover the secrets of ancient music and 9 chants, costumes, body art and language. To be selected as part of an island's 10 delegation to the Festival is a great honor. The Festivals have no 11 competitions, and performers do not seek to compete with one another, but 12 the Festival has stimulated a new sense of cultural pride among islander's 13 young and old, generating excitement, pride and promise for the arts and 14 cultures in the region. It enables young contemporary artists and performers 15 to express themselves and their talent and helps to bridge the gap between 16 traditional cultural expressions and the aspirations of our youth; and

WHEREAS, the Festival of Pacific Arts makes a significant contribution 17 to the evolution of Pacific Island identities. For the region, the Festival of 18 19 Pacific Arts promotes unity by encouraging mutual appreciation and respect 20 for one another's cultures. It also improves political and economic stability by developing a deeper sense of solidarity and unites the geographically isolated 21 22 territories, Pacific Island countries and facilitating inter-regional 23 communication; and

1 WHEREAS, the Festival is also an important instrument in the 2 preservation of the performing and production skills underlying the broad 3 variety of cultural expressions in the Pacific. Expertise and skills in crafts 4 have been rediscovered and revitalized, while traditional and ceremonial 5 performances have been rediscovered, revived and, in some cases, updated. 6 Tourism and related industries have also benefited, with the proceeds often 7 going to local communities; and

8 WHEREAS, each Festival attracts increasing numbers of spectators and 9 visitors from within the region itself, and it also draws the attention of the 10 global community, to the point that the Festival has become a major tourist 11 attraction. Today, the Festival is the principal platform for collective 12 participation in expressions of traditional and contemporary culture in the 13 Pacific region; and

WHEREAS, hosting the Twelfth (12th) Festival of Pacific Arts will be one of Guam's major cultural, technical, and economic challenges, requiring broad community participation and cooperation. The Festival will also provide tremendous opportunities for social and cultural exchanges especially with the exposure of local products, all of which can be used to enhance tourism within the host country; and

WHEREAS, the *Chamorro* people have seen a cultural revival over the past decade, as evidenced by the many organizations involved in the performing arts. The *Dinana Minagof* competition is a prime example of an annual island-wide competition and display of Guam's performing artists that helps to foster the *Chamorro* cultural revival. Additionally, the number of *Chamorro* visual artists has also grown, with more and more young men and
women learning the arts of carving, *galaide* building, weaving, etc.; and

WHEREAS, Guam will see an increase in its population in excess of twenty-five (25,000) new residents by 2015, primarily due to the movement of Marines and their dependents to Guam. Hosting the Twelfth (12th) Festival of Pacific Arts will provide an opportunity to educate newcomers of the significance of the Pacific region's cultures, especially that of the *Chamorros;* and

9 WHEREAS, the General Manager of the Guam Visitors Bureau, together with the Executive Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities 10 11 Agency, the President of the Department of Chamorro Affairs, the President of the Guam Chamber of Commerce, and the Chairman of the Guam Museum 12 13 Foundation, are herein directed to assess all options to construct a Performing Arts Center, Cultural Center, Guam Museum, and Convention Center to be 14 15 available for use prior to FESTPAC 2016. These plans *shall* be presented to I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than 16 January 15, 2010. These plans shall include cost-estimates and identification of 17 potential public and private funding sources to pay for these facilities; and 18

WHEREAS, in the history of the Festival of Pacific Arts, Guam has yet to serve as a host nation. By hosting the Twelfth (12th) Festival of Pacific Arts in 2016, it will be an opportune time for the people of Guam to involve and educate the thousands of newcomers to our island about who we are as *Chamorros,* coupled with the uniqueness of our culture as Pacific Islanders and the importance of maintaining, perpetuating and respecting our cultural
identity; now, therefore, be it

3 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does 4 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, petition the Secretariat of the Pacific 5 Community to grant Guam the rights to host the Twelfth (12th) Festival of 6 Pacific Arts in 2016; and be it further

7 **RESOLVED**, that upon acceptance of Guam's invitation to host the Twelfth (12th) Festival of Pacific Arts in 2016, I Maga'lahen Guåhan, the 8 9 Governor of Guam, shall convene the Festival Organizing Committee for the 2016 Festival of Pacific Arts. The Organizing Committee will bring together 10 Guam's performing and visual artist groups, government agencies, and civic 11 12 and professional groups dedicated to the organization of such an event and 13 the perpetuation of Guam's culture and language; and *shall* also consist of two (2) Members of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, to be appointed by the Speaker, two (2) 14 representatives of the Mayors Council, one (1) representative each from the 15 University of Guam, Guam Visitors Bureau, Guam Community College, and 16 the Guam Public School System, to be appointed by the heads of those 17 18 institutions; and be it further

19 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the 20 Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be 21 thereafter transmitted to the Secretariat of the Pacific Community, Dr. Jimmie 22 Rodgers, Senior Deputy Director-General; to Mr. Yves Corbel, Deputy 23 Director-General, Secretariat of the Pacific Community; to the President of the 24 Guam Chamber of Commerce; to the President of the Department of *Chamorro* Affairs; to the Executive Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and
Humanities Agency; to the Honorable Jose T. Terlaje, President of the Mayors
Council of Guam; to the Chairman of the Guam Museum Foundation; to the
Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam's Delegate to the United States

5 Congress; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I Maga'lahen Guåhan.
