1 WHEREAS, Mrs. Sison has been a devoted wife to her husband Peter

2 and a nurturing mother to her children, Robert, Randall, Linda and Arlene;

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4 WHEREAS, Mrs. Sison received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in

5 English/Speech for Secondary Education with a minor in Library Science

6 from the University of Guam in 1972. She became employed by the

7 Department of Education as an Assistant Librarian at John F. Kennedy High

8 School and thus began her distinguished educational career; and

9 WHEREAS, Mrs. Sison earned a Master's Degree in Educational

Administration and Supervision from the University of Guam in 1975; and

11 WHEREAS, because of her exemplary dedication and hard work as an

Assistant Librarian, Mrs. Sison was promoted to Head Librarian at Dededo

Junior High School, now known as Vicente S.A. Benavente Middle School, a

position she served in well and faithfully for twenty four (24) years until her

15 retirement in September 30, 2000; and

16 WHEREAS, from 1982 to 1983, Mrs. Sison spearheaded the "Save the

Children" Program, which featured solutions to child abuse, drug abuse and

juvenile delinquency and Guam Senators were impressed by the Program that

they provided funding to send two (2) students to attend the "Save the

Children Hearing in Washington, D.C.; and

21 WHEREAS, in 1991, Mrs. Sison coordinated a letter writing campaign

with Judy Salas' seventh (7th) grade Gifted and Talented Education (GATE)

class to the servicemen and women serving in the Persian Gulf War, and a

valentine to President George H. W. Bush, and in recognition of the students'

- 1 efforts, President George H. W. Bush sent a letter thanking the students for
- 2 their concerns about the Persian Gulf War; and
- 3 WHEREAS, in 1994, Mrs. Sison was the first librarian at Dededo Middle
- 4 School to computerize the entire library collection into the Columbia Library
- 5 System thus making it easier for students, faculty and staff to locate books and
- 6 AV materials; and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Sison was a prominent figure in lobbying the passage
- 8 of Public Law 22-140, making it possible to expand the library facilities of
- 9 Dededo Middle School in 1996, and after her retirement, in recognition of her
- 10 contributions to the school, the library was named in her honor; and
- 11 WHEREAS, in 1998, Mrs. Sison was instrumental in persuading
- 12 Governor Gutierrez to purchase twelve (12) state of the art computers for the
- 13 use of the students; and
- 14 WHEREAS, during her tenure as Head Librarian, Mrs. Sison offered her
- 15 time and efforts to school activities such as Public Relations Officer for the
- 16 Parent Teacher Organization; the Dededo Middle School Faculty/Staff Social
- 17 Club; the School Level Improvement Program; the National Library Week
- 18 Reading Program; the Celebrity Readers Reading Program; the Read-A-Thon
- 19 Program; the Science Fair Contributor and Supporter; the Future Teachers of
- 20 America; the Dededo Middle School Readers Club; and served as a Certified
- 21 Facilitator for Rainbows for All Children and as a Chamorro Week Supporter
- 22 and Promoter; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Mrs. Patricia Santos Sison has been bestowed with the
- 24 honor of being one of Guam's Premiere Educators by the Guam Chapter of

- 1 the Phi Delta Kappa and is being inducted into the "Guam Educator's Hall of
- 2 Fame"; now, therefore, be it
