3 WHEREAS, the late Mrs. Esther Taitano Underwood was born on 4 March 14, 1913 to Juan San Nicolas Taitano and the former Rosario Sablan 5 Flores; and WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood was married to John Joseph Underwood,
 with whom she had nine (9) children: Annie, Rosario (deceased), James,
 Carmen, John, Richard, Mary (deceased), Francis (deceased), and Robert; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from the eighth (8<sup>th</sup>) grade in 1928, Mrs.
Underwood, at the age of fifteen (15), began her distinguished educational
career; and

WHEREAS, like many of her contemporaries and teaching colleagues,
Mrs. Underwood advanced the education of her students first, before taking
the opportunity to advance her own; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood and those who taught in the classroom before World War II paved the way for education as we know it today; their training and their resources were very limited, but they used their imagination and their enthusiasm for learning to produce countless numbers of students who could read and write, continue the life-long process of learning, and think for themselves; and

WHEREAS, in addition to teaching young minds and touching young
hearts, Mrs. Underwood also taught adult evening classes in *Sumay* from 1935
to 1937; and

WHEREAS, after World War II, Mrs. Underwood taught junior high
grades at Agana Heights and Sinajana; and

WHEREAS, in 1957, Mrs. Underwood earned her Associate Arts Degree
from the Territorial College of Guam; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood was offered a scholarship to the University
of California, to major in special education, but later changed her mind to

attend Long Beach State College at her own expense, where she received her
 Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1963; and

WHEREAS, after returning to Guam, Mrs. Underwood taught at C.L.
Taitano Elementary in Sinajana; and

WHEREAS, in 1964, Mrs. Underwood became the Assistant Principal at
Tamuning Elementary, and in 1966, was assigned as the Assistant Principal at
Wettengel Elementary, serving as its Acting Principal; and

8 WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood will be remembered as one of Guam's
9 Pioneers of Education; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Underwood has been bestowed with the honor of
being one of Guam's premiere educators, by the Guam Chapter of the Phi
Delta Kappa and is being inducted into the "Guam Educator's Hall of Fame"
now, therefore, be it
