Relative to extending *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'us Ma'ase'* to Captain James Kent Radike, M.D., F.A.C.P., for his outstanding professionalism and devotion to his patients and to the people of Guam.

3 WHEREAS, Captain James Kent Radike, M.D., F.A.C.P., has been 4 serving as a staff physician with the U.S. Naval Hospital (USNH) Guam 5 specializing in internal medicine/infectious diseases since his second tour of 6 duty in Guam began in January of 2006; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Radike has been married to his wife Susan, for twenty
 (20) years, and they have three (3) children, Nick (17), Katie (16) and Madie
 (12); and

4 WHEREAS, recognizing the importance of relationships and taking care 5 of others, the Radike family has made the unselfish decision to relocate to 6 Pensacola, Florida so the family can be near to and care for Dr. Radike's ill 7 father; and

8 WHEREAS, Dr. Radike's career in medicine began in the 1980s, receiving his Bachelor of Science degree in Microbiology in 1984, and his 9 10 medical degree in 1988, both from the University of Oklahoma; and 11 completed his internship in psychiatry at Portsmouth Naval Hospital, 12 Portsmouth, Virginia in 1989; and subsequently was accepted in 1992 into an 13 internship program specializing in internal medicine from the University of Oklahoma's College of Medicine in Oklahoma City, fulfilling his residency 14 15 requirement in July 1995; and immediately entering a fellowship program in infectious diseases, both with the University of Oklahoma's College of 16 17 Medicine in Oklahoma City, completing his fellowship in July 1997; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Radike, in addition to his duties as a staff physician
with the United States Navy, has been serving since November 1997, as a
Diplomat, Infectious Disease, American Board of Internal Medicine; a
Diplomat, Internal Medicine, American Board of Internal Medicine (from
August, 1995 through 2015); and as Diplomat to the Federal Licensing
Examination Board in 1989; and

24 WHEREAS, from 1989 to 1999, Dr. Radike was a certified instructor 25 with ACLS, as well as a BCLS/ATLS provider, thereby assisting would-be

physicians, and has earned membership in numerous prestigious professional
 organizations, including the Infectious Diseases Society of America, Armed
 Forces Infectious Diseases Society, American Society of Microbiology,
 American College of Physicians, American Legion, Naval Institute, Navy
 League, and Phi Beta Kappa; and

6 WHEREAS, Dr. Radike's professional journey as a medical doctor began here in Guam more than seventeen (17) years ago, where he worked as 7 a staff physician with the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam's Emergency Medicine 8 Department, serving in the following capacities: an ACLS Instructor, NALS 9 Instructor, Clinical Instructor at EMT School, Member of the Infection Control 10 Committee and a Member of the Ambulatory Care Committee; and while 11 12 working as a staff physician, Dr. Radike was selected to serve as Head of the 13 Naval Communications Station Medical Clinic, holding this position from 14 August 1990 through July 1991; and

WHEREAS, he then served his next tour of duty as a General Medical
Officer and ACLS instructor at USNH Millington in Tennessee from July 1991
through July 1992, and was again selected to head the Branch Medical Clinic
from January 1992 through July 1992; and

WHEREAS, he was awarded courtesy staff privileges from September
1993 through June 1997 in the Emergency Medical/Internal Medicine division
at the Presbyterian Hospital in Oklahoma City, and also served as the staff
physician at the Occupational Health Center in Oklahoma City (March 1994
through June 1997); and

WHEREAS, from July 1997 through December 1998, Dr. Radike worked
as staff physician at Stillwater Medical Center in Stillwater, Oklahoma, and

while on Individual Ready Reserve (January 1999 through May 2001), he operated a solo medical practice, while maintaining staff privileges at Stillwater Medical Center in Stillwater, Oklahoma, where he concurrently served as Medical Director, and Vice President for Medical Affairs; also oversaw performance improvement for the medical staff, heading the Infection Control Committee, and serving on the Performance Improvement and Education Committees; and

8 WHEREAS, from January through November 1999, Dr. Radike was the 9 medical director for the Payne County Health Department in Oklahoma, and 10 from January 1999 through July 2000, was physician advisor to the Oklahoma 11 State Department on HIV/STD Affairs, concurrently serving as the 12 secretary/treasurer for the Payne County Medical Association through 13 September 2000; and

WHEREAS, after more than two (2) years on reserve status, Dr. Radike returned to active duty and was named staff physician at the Naval Medical Center Portsmouth, and while there also held the title of Associate Program Director for Research with the Internal Medicine Department, headed the Internal Medicine Research Committee and the subcommittee for Clinical Blood-Borne Pathogens, and served as a member of the Blood-Borne Pathogen Committee; and

WHEREAS, in addition to being a highly skilled physician and decorated military officer, Dr. Radike is also a veteran of Operation Enduring Freedom; was deployed to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba from July through November 2002 where he served as Assistant Officer-In-Charge, Fleet Hospital Fleet 20; and was appointed Director, Medical Services Directorate as a Senior Medical Officer and a staff physician (December 2002 to May 2003),
and in that capacity was part of Operation Iraqi Freedom, Kuwait from March
through May 2003 (Fleet Hospital 15), and from May 2003 through May 2005,
went on to serve as Deputy Commander for Clinical Services at Portsmouth's
Fleet Hospital; and

6 WHEREAS, Dr. Radike took part in Operation Iraqi Freedom II, being deployed to Kuwait from July 2004 through February 2005 (EMF P), then from 7 May 2001 through January 2006, he served as a staff physician at the Naval 8 Medical Center in Portsmouth, where he was physician head, within its Multi-9 10 Specialty Clinics, Internal Medicine Line (May 2003 through June 2004), 11 division head of the Infectious Diseases (May 2003 through October 2005), and Physician Advisor to Performance Improvement Department (October 2001 12 through July 2004); and 13

WHEREAS, he was also a member of the Executive Committee for Medicine (October 2001 through July 2004), and an Assistant Professor of Medicine with the Department of Medicine, F. Edward Hebert School of Medicine, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences; and is presently serving the people of Guam in his current role at the U.S. Naval Hospital; and

WHEREAS, throughout his many years as a physician and Naval Officer, Dr. Radike has made significant presentations in his areas of expertise, including "Cerebrospinal Fluid Nitrate Levels are Elevated in Patients with AIDS," presented at the Grand Rounds, University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center for Internal Medicine in 1997; "Evaluation of Fever in the Returned Traveler," presented at the 2001 North Carolina Healthcare

Fellowship Annual Meeting, Winston-Salem, North Carolina; and
 "Bioterrorism Agents," presented at Elizabeth City Coast Guard Medical
 Clinic, Elizabeth City, North Carolina in 2001; and
