Relative to recognizing the month of October 2007 as "Family Violence Awareness Month" and commending practitioners and advocates who help raise awareness and support victims of family violence and recognizing the significant contributions these individuals and organizations have made, and continue to make, to reduce the crime of family violence.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'BENTE NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN

3 **WHEREAS**, family violence is a physical, sexual, emotional or verbal 4 abuse directed against a person who is the abuser's intimate partner or 5 relative; and WHEREAS, family violence affects people regardless of age, sexual
 orientation, physical ability, marital status, ethnicity, culture, education,
 religion, or economic status; and

4 WHEREAS, children in homes where abuse among adults occur are 5 often neglected at a rate of fifteen hundred percent (1,500%) higher than the 6 national average in the general population; and

WHEREAS, studies show that children from violent homes have higher
risks of alcohol or drug abuse and juvenile delinquency; are six (6) times more
likely to commit suicide; are twenty four (24) times more likely to commit
sexual crimes; and fifty (50) times more likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; and

WHEREAS, in Fiscal Year 2006, there were more than two thousand sixty five (2,065) cases of abuse and neglect referred to the Child Protective Services at the Department of Public Health and Social Services, which more than sixty nine (69) cases were directly related to family violence; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health and Social Services Adult Protective Services received more than one hundred eighty nine (189) referrals, most of which were the result of abuse of the elderly and disabled; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Police Department reported three (3) people lost their lives as a result of family violence; one thousand three hundred five (1,305) family violence cases, of which more than six hundred twenty one (621) individuals were arrested and three hundred twenty three (323) cases still pending; two hundred thirty six (236) rape cases and two hundred fifteen (215) sex offenses were reported and eighty two (82) cases of abuse and neglect with three hundred fifty two (352) referrals for violence or neglect by
 family members were also reported; and

WHEREAS, Healing Hearts Crisis Center-Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse served one hundred thirteen (113) victims of family violence and sexual assault; approximately one thousand thirty two (1,032) victims were given services provided by non-government organizations; and the Department of Law processed nine hundred forty two (942) cases in fiscal year 2006 while the Superior Court of Guam processed four hundred thirty eight (438) cases; and

10 WHEREAS, the Family Violence and Sexual Assault Task Force, STOP, 11 VAW sub grantees, government and non-government organizations, faith-12 based organizations and other community partners have joined forces to 13 directly confront this crisis, including: the Alee Shelter - Catholic Social Services; Anderson Family Support Services - Fleet & Family Support 14 15 Services; Archdiocese of Hagåtña; Attorney General of Guam – Department of Law, Crime Victim Response Unit; Department of Corrections - Parole 16 Division/Training; Guam Public School System; Department of Mental Health 17 18 and Substance Abuse - Healing Hearts Crisis Center (HHCC); Department of Public Health and Social Services; Department of Youth Affairs; Erica's House 19 - Visitation Center; I Maga'lahen Guåhan's Community Outreach - Federal 20 21 Programs Office; I Maga'lahen Guåhan's Legal Counsel; Guam Housing and 22 Urban Renewal Authority; Judiciary of Guam; I Mina'Bente Nuebe Na Liheslaturan Guåhan; Guam Police Department – Victim Assistance Unit; 23 Guma'Mami, Inc.; Inafa'Maolek; Mayor's Council of Guam; Media; Mother's 24 Against Drunk Driving (MADD); Public Defender Service Corporation; 25

Superior Court of Guam – Client Services and Family Counseling Division;
 Judicial Council; Superior Court of Guam – Probation and Marshal's
 Divisions; Sanctuary Inc; University of Guam; and the Victim Advocates
 Reaching Out (VARO); and

5 WHEREAS, the efforts, compassion, and dedication of these volunteers,
6 professionals, and organizations should be recognized and applauded; now,
7 therefore, be it

8 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does 9 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize the month of October 2007 10 as "Family Violence Awareness Month", and commend the practitioners and 11 advocates who help raise awareness and support victims of family violence, 12 as well as the significant contributions these individuals and organizations 13 have made, and continue to make, to reduce the crime of family violence; and 14 be it further

15 **RESOLVED,** that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the 16 Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be 17 thereafter transmitted to "the Family Violence Awareness Month" Task Force; 18 and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
