18 Before the court is the Government of Guam's Request for Extension of Time to File its
 19 Response to the Receiver's proposed financing plan as outlined in the Quarterly Report
 20 submitted at the January 14, 2009 hearing. See Docket No. 333. Based upon the representations
 21 by the Receiver, the court finds the additional time requested to file a Response is warranted.
 22 See Docket No. 336. The court is encouraged that after 23 years, the Executive and Legislative
 23 branches are working together, with the Receiver, toward meeting the challenges of this crisis.
 24 The Government of Guam is ordered to continue its work with the Receiver in this regard.
 25 Accordingly, the court **GRANTS** the Government of Guam's Request to file its Response on
 26 February 2, 2009 by 12:00 noon.^{1/}

28 ^{1/} The court notes that the United States also does not object to the Request. See Docket No. 335.

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1 The court agrees with the Receiver, however, that this extension of time should be
2 limited for the purpose of addressing alternative financing for the closure of the Ordot Dump and
3 the opening of the new Municipal Solid Waste Landfill Facility at Layon.
