AN ACT TO AMEND §§1102 AND 1103, AND TO ADD NEW §§3307.1, 3308.1, AND 3308, TO TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE ELECTRIC PERSONAL ASSISTIVE MOBILITY DEVICE (EPAMD).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that 3 personal travel device options are available in the marketplace for the citizens of 4 Guam, and for the benefit of Guam's visitors. One such device is the "Electric 5 Personal Assistive Mobility Device" (EPAMD). The EPAMD is a self-balancing, two 6 (2)-wheeled device designed to transport only one (1) person, *solely* powered by an electric propulsion system, with a maximum speed of twelve and a half (12.5) miles
 per hour.

The EPAMD employs advances in technology and energy efficiency to fully and safely integrate the user with pedestrian transportation, while enabling individuals to travel farther and carry more without the use of traditional vehicles. This can result in gains in productivity, minimize environmental impact, and facilitate better use of public spaces.

8 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that Guam's motor vehicle code must include the 9 Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device to address the use of this new technology 10 for the community of Guam.

11 Section 2. In order to distinguish the Electric Personal Assistive Mobility 12 Device (EPAMD) from a bicycle, and a bicycle with a motor, paragraphs (a), (s) and 13 (oo) contained in Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 1, §1102, "Definitions," 14 are hereby *amended* to read:

- 15 "(a) A *bicycle equipped with a motor* is a two (2) tandem wheeled 16 vehicle or a three (3)-wheeled vehicle equipped with a motor having a power 17 rating *not* in excess of two (2) horsepower and is designed to travel on *not* more 18 than three (3) wheels in contact with the ground."
- 19 "(s) A *motor vehicle* is a vehicle which is self-propelled excluding
 20 bicycle, bicycle equipped with a motor, and electric personal assistive mobility
 21 device (EPAMD)."
- "(oo) A *vehicle* is a device in, upon *or* by which any person *or* property
 is *or* may be propelled, moved *or* drawn upon a highway, *except* a device
 moved by human power *or* used exclusively upon stationary rails *or* tracks *or*an electric personal assistive mobility device."

Section 3. §1103 of Chapter 1, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

"§1103. Definition: Bicycle. A *bicycle* is a motorless contrivance operated with two (2) tandem wheels but *not more than* three (3) wheels in contact with the ground and propelled by human power."

6 Section 4. A new Subitem (rr) is *added* to §1102 of Chapter 1, Title 16,
7 Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"(rr) An Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device (EPAMD) is a self-8 balancing two (2) non-tandem-wheeled device with an electric propulsion 9 system with an average of seven hundred fifty (750) watts (1 horsepower) that 10 limits the maximum speed of the device to twelve and a half (12.5) miles per 11 hour or less and that is designed to transport only one (1) person at a maximum 12 speed of twelve and a half (12.5) miles per hour. An Electric Personal Assistive 13 Mobility Device (EPAMD) shall have a maximum footprint of thirty-nine and a 14 half (39.5) inches in width by twenty-six and a half (26.5) inches in length by 15 16 fifty (50) inches high and shall weigh no greater than one hundred fifty (150) pounds." 17

18 Section 5. A new §3307.1, is hereby *added* to Title 16, Guam Code
19 Annotated, Article 4, Chapter 3, to read:

20 "§3307.1 Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device: Riding on
21 Sidewalks, Roadways and Bicycle Paths.

(a) Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices (EPAMD) *shall*be allowed to operate on and use safety zones, bicycle paths, and
sidewalks. An Operator of an Electric Personal Assistive Mobility
Device (EPAMD) *shall* exercise due care to avoid colliding with, and

shall yield the right-of-way to, persons traveling on foot and those utilizing mobility aids.

(b) Only *if* safety zones, bicycle paths, and sidewalks are *not* available, *or if* available sidewalks are *not* Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant, *shall* EPAMDs be allowed to use Guam's roadways where the posted speed limit is twenty-five (25) miles per hour *or* less.

(c) Persons operating an EPAMD on a roadway shall ride as near 8 to the right side of the roadway as practicable, exercising due care when 9 10 passing a standing vehicle or one (1) proceeding in the same direction. They shall ride in single file; provided that upon paths or parts of 11 roadways set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles, bicycles equipped 12 13 with motors, or Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices, riding two (2) abreast shall be permitted, unless otherwise prohibited by rule or 14 regulation adopted by the Director of Public Works. 15

16(d) An operator of an EPAMD shall be no less than sixteen (16)17years of age with one (1) exception: Operators may be twelve to fifteen18(15) years old *if* accompanied and supervised by an adult who is at least19eighteen (18) years old. Operators under sixteen (16) years of age are20required to wear a Consumer Products Safety Commission-approved21bicycle helmet.

(e) EPAMD tour operators *shall* limit tour customers to a
maximum speed of eight (8) mph while operating within Tumon Bay, as
defined in paragraph C, §3701, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated.

(f) An EPAMD operator *shall* give an audible signal before
overtaking and passing any pedestrian.

(g) An EPAMD shall be equipped with reflectors and a headlamp 1 when operating between one-half (1/2) hour after sunset and one-half 2 3 (1/2) hour before sunrise. (h) Any person violating any part of this §3307.1 is guilty of a 4 misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not 5 6 to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)." 7 Section 6. A new §3308.1 is added to Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, 8 Article 4, Chapter 3, to read: 9 "§3308.1 Operation of EPAMD. While operated on any highway, an 10 EPAMD shall be considered a vehicle for all purposes of highway traffic operation regulations and control as set forth in this Code." 11 Section 7. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any 12 person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions 13 or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or 14 15 application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
