AN ACT TO AMEND §76212 OF TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO **SPECIFYING** THE **DEPOSITORY FOR ALL HISTORIC PROPERTIES; TO ADD** A NEW SUBSECTION (e) TO §76511 OF TITLE 21, GUAM **CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE PENALTIES FOR** FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH A CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL; AND TO ADD A NEW §76512 TO ESTABLISH HISTORIC PRESERVATION ARCHAEOLOGICAL AN **MITIGATION FUND.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Statement. Guam's historic preservation laws will
be severely tested in the years to come as our island experiences its next surge in

A review of the laws across the United States guiding the 1 development. 2 ownership, repatriation, caretaking, and exhibition of prehistoric and historic 3 properties reveals a wide range of allowable actions, mitigation remedies, and 4 penalties and fines for non-compliance with approved actions. Guam's statute relative to historic preservation has also gone through changes over the twenty (20) 5 6 years of its existence, and it is situated almost midway between the extremes found 7 in other jurisdictions. It is the intent of these proposed amendments to further 8 highlight the need for vigilance when it comes to the preservation of Guam's culture and history, and to deter, by the imposition of hefty fines and/or terms of 9 10 imprisonment, the unauthorized destruction of irreplaceable properties that make up Guam's unique place in the world. 11

Section 2. §76212 of Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to read:

"§76212. Prehistoric or Historic Objects; Public Property. The Department shall, subject to the provisions of this Chapter, determine the 14 disposition of such prehistoric or historic properties wheresoever located 15 within the territorial limits of the Island of Guam. Any person who disturbs 16 17 properties of prehistoric or historic significance or removes such properties 18 from their sites without approval or concurrence from the Historic Preservation Office shall be guilty of a felony of the third degree. 19

When a private landowner or lessee in the territory discovers 20 properties which may be of historic significance on his property, he shall 21 report the location of such objects, without disturbing the properties, to the 22 Department. 23

All prehistoric and historic properties *shall* be returned to the people 24 of Guam, with the Guam Museum serving as the depository for said 25 properties." 26

Section 3. A new subsection (e) is *added* to §76511 of Title 21, Guam
 Code Annotated, to read:

3 "(e) After a Certificate of Approval *or* permitting approval has been
4 issued for a requested action as enumerated in subsection (a), any
5 unauthorized disturbances of prehistoric *or* historic properties *shall* be
6 subject to fines of up to Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) and/or
7 imprisonment of up to three (3) years for each violation."

8 Section 4. A new §76512 is *added* to Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, to
9 read:

10 **"§76512.** Preservation Archaeological Historic Mitigation Fund, established. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, there is 11 12 hereby created, within the Department of Parks and Recreation, the "Historic Preservation Archaeological Mitigation Fund", which shall be a fund 13 14 separate and apart from the General Fund and from any other special funds 15 of the government of Guam. Any and all funds generated through fines imposed by the Historic Preservation Office of the Department of Parks and 16 Recreation shall be deposited into the Historic Preservation Archaeological 17 Mitigation Fund. The Director of the Department shall administer said 18 funds independently from the General Fund, with a minimum requirement of 19 dual signatures for the expenditure of any funds within the authorized 20 guidelines. 21

- (b) Expenditures of the Fund *shall* be restricted to the following
 areas, and for the following purposes:
- 24 (1) the contracting of archaeological services as determined
 25 by the Historic Preservation Office;
- 26

(2) public education and awareness activities; and

(3) the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment to support the activities outlined in Subsections (1) and (2) above.

Funds from the Historic Preservation Archaeological Mitigation Fund shall *not* be expended for personnel services, but used *solely* for operations as highlighted above. The Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation *shall* provide to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a monthly financial report on the funds generated each month, within ten (10) days following the preceding month."
