Dear Speaker Won Pat:

Hafa Adai! Transmitted herewith please find Bill No. 83(COR) "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000) FROM THE TOURIST ATTRACTION FUND TO THE GUAM COCONUT RHINOCEROS BEETLE ERADICATION PROGRAM" which I have vetoed.

Guam's natural beauty must be preserved. This fact is beyond contestation and I therefore take no pleasure in vetoing Bill No. 83. Like you, I understand the frail nature of our tourism sector and the indispensable role our natural heritage plays in that industry. Yet, our Government faces a myriad of critical fiscal challenges; challenges which force us to limit our financial obligations to those programs which have a viable and available funding source.

Unfortunately, Bill No 83's funding source, the Tourism Attraction Fund, is projected to experience a shortfall of nine hundred seventy five thousand dollars this fiscal year, because signing this Act would appropriate monies that do not exist, I am vetoing this measure and seeking a viable method to fund its intent.

Today, my office sent a letter to Senator Daniel Inoue, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Appropriations, seeking his assistance in funding this program via Congressional appropriation

As you may know, Senator Inoue's assistance was vital in funding our efforts against the brown tree snake, as the presence of harmful invasive species on Guam could invariably affect Hawaiian soil.

Though my office will do everything in its power to seek alternate funding, we must address the serious financial problems we face, or many other well-intentioned programs will go unfunded. I ask that you and your colleagues to take seriously the federal receivership this government has been placed under, its recent impact on our cash position, and that each of us begin to work on a comprehensive plan to address both our short and long term financial challenges

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000) FROM THE TOURIST ATTRACTION FUND TO THE GUAM COCONUT RHINOCEROS BEETLE ERADICATION PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds 3 that since the detection of the Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle (CRB) in Tumon on 4 September of 2007, the efforts made to contain the infected area has been met with 5 varying success. The University of Guam Cooperative Extension Service created 6 the Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle Eradication Program (Program) and has been tasked with the eradication of the CRB. Although the Program shows signs of success, the funding provided by *I Liheslatura* has *not* been released for use by the eradication team and has greatly hindered the Program from fully accomplishing its goal. To date, the Program has relied on federal grant program funds which are insufficient to accomplish its mission to totally eradicate the CRB from further destroying our coconut trees.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Public Law 29-104 appropriated 7 Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) from the Fiscal Year 2008 8 9 General Fund to the Program to strengthen Guam's eradication efforts against this 10 invasive alien species. It is crucial that the Program be provided the necessary 11 resources to eradicate the CRB and ensure that it does not further infiltrate other parts of the island. The expansion of CRBs presence from Tumon to other areas of 12 13 Guam is bordering on being catastrophic and must be addressed if we want to save 14 our coconut trees, which represent our island's culture and is the icon portrayed on 15 our Guam Seal. Any further funding delays to the Program diminishes, if not 16 extinguishes, the opportunity to eradicate the CRB throughout our entire island.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that it would be devastating for our island and our tourism industry if we allow the CRB to destroy our coconut trees. For over four (4) millennia, we have utilized every part of the coconut tree for various purposes stressing the importance of protecting the coconut tree and our way of life. Today, our people continue to use the coconut tree for the same purposes. The tourists also enjoy the coconut trees so essential to our image of a tropical paradise.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan intends to fund the CRB Eradication Program
through the Guam's Visitors Bureau Tourist Attraction Funds, as it would affect
the quality of Guam's tourism industry.

Section 2. Authorization to Expend Five Hundred Thousand Dollars 1 (\$500,000) from the Tourist Attraction Fund for Eradication of the Coconut 2 3 Rhinoceros Beetle. Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) from the Tourist Attraction Fund unexpended cash surplus from Fiscal Year 2007 as previously 4 authorized in Section 18 of Part II, Chapter IV of Public Law 28-150, is hereby 5 appropriated to the University of Guam Cooperative Extension Service for the 6 funding of the Guam Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle Eradication Program. This 7 8 funding shall continue to be available until expended, shall not be subject to I Maga'lahi's transfer authority, and is exempt from the Bureau of Budget and 9 10 Management Research's allotment control.

11 Section 3. Severability. *If* any of the provisions of this Act or the 12 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity 13 shall *not* affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given 14 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of 15 this Act are severable.

SUBJECT: Request for Emergency Declaration for Bill No 83 (COR)

I am requesting that Bill No. 83 (COR), AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000) FROM THE TOURIST ATTRACTION FUND TO THE GUAM COCONUT RHINOCEROS BEETLE ERADICATION PROGRAM, be declared an emergency for the purpose of waiving public hearing requirements.

Bill No. 83 (COR) seeks to address the funding problem with the University of Guam's program to eradicate the Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle. Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund in P.L. 29-104 has not been released by the Administration, and the corresponding lack of funding for the eradication program could be devastating for our island and our visitor industry.

Thank you for your kind consideration of this important request, and I look forward to the bill's discussion and swift passage.
