Hafa Adai! Pursuant §3131, Division 1, Chapter 3 of Title 5 GCA, the Division of Environmental Health (DEH) of this Department held a public hearing to receive public comments on the division's existing fee schedules for Sanitary Permit, Health Certificate, Deratting Certificate, and the Guam Controlled Substances Registration. The hearing was held on April 22, 2009 from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. The procedures provided in the Administrative Adjudication Law (Title 5 GCA Chapter 9, Article 3) were followed in notifying and conducting the public hearing.

An Economic Impact Study was not necessary since the Department is not seeking to amend the existing fee schedules for any permits, certificates, or registrations issued by DEH. A notice of public hearing was announced in the local newspaper on April 8, 2009 and April 22, 2009.


NATION Supreme Court tackles race issue **USA TODAY** WASHINGTON - In his first

major speech as attorney general. Eric Holder tried to spur a conversation on race by bluntly describing America as 'essentially a nation of cowards" and saying people "simply do not talk enough with each other about race." Two months later, the issue of race

is squarely before the Supreme Court, which begins hearing this week four cases that could dramatically alter the landscape of civil rights law. The cases also could provide a revealing look at how the administration of the nation's first African-American president will address racial matters before the Supreme Court, led by conservative Chief Justice John Roberts.

The disputes come to the high court just months after the election of Barack Obama as president and the confirmation of Holder as the nation's first black attorney general. They also arise at a time when a majority of the nine justices have signaled they want to end government policies that favor racial minorities to remedy past bias or enhance diversity.

The cases encompass fundamental issues --- voting rights, employment, housing and education - and will test the court's stance on civil rights more comprehensively than at any time in the past decade. Their outcomes will determine, for example, the Justice Department's authority to screen state election policies that might hurt minority candidates. The justices also will examine the

GCSR is required of all practitioners and institutions who manufacture, distribute, and/or dispense controlled substances on Guam. Today's public hearing is held pursuant to Section 3131, Division 1, Chapter 3 of Title 5 GCA, which requires all Government of Guam agencies to seek public comments on their existing fee schedules. The fee schedule for the Guam Controlled Substances Registration was established through the adoption of "Rules Governing the Manufacture, Distribution and Dispensing of Controlled Substances" on November 14, 2001. Section 67.301 of Title 9 GCA, Chapter 67, otherwise known as the "Guam Uniform Controlled Substances Act", authorizes the Department of Public Health and Social Services to adopt rules and charge reasonable fees relating to the registration and control of controlled substances.
