Dear Madam Speaker:

Hafa Adai! On April 29, 2009, the Guam Education Policy Board (GEPB) passed a supplemental budget that was transmitted to the Legislature on April 30, 2009 (see attached). On August 7, 2009, the GEPB convened a special meeting to address the projected shortfall of \$8,626,371.03 for Fiscal Year 2009. (see attached) As a result of the information presented to GEPB, a motion was made and unanimously passed to request the Legislature to go into an emergency session to address the Department's shortfall.

Among the critical areas that are affected by the shortfall is \$3.5 million that is needed to certify funds for the SY 2009-2010 food service contract. DOE will not be able to complete the contract without this supplemental. Also affected are contractual services for trash pickup and custodial services both are critical to avoid citations from the Department of Public Health and Social Services.

Based on the aforementioned information, the GEPB is requesting that the Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guahan take immediate action on DOE's Supplemental request.

Relative to requesting the I Mina Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guahan (30th Guam Legislature) to approve a Supplemental budget for Fiscal Year 2009 for the Guam Public School System as approved by the Guam Education Policy Board,

WHEREAS, the Guam Education Policy Board is required to approve the budget for the Guam Public School System (GPSS) pursuant to 17 G.C.A. §3112(a)(17); and

WHEREAS, GEPB Resolution No. 2008-08 was passed by the GEPB on April 24, 2008 revising the GPSS Fiscal Year 2009 budget in the amount of \$263,048,293.00; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to statute the revised budget was forwarded via GEPB Resolution 2008-08 to the $29^{\rm th}$ Guam Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature adopted and the Governor approved a total of \$189,753,771.00 for GPSS' F.Y. 2009 budget; and

WHEREAS, there exist a difference of \$73,294,522.00 between what was requested by the GEPB and P.L. 29-113 (F.Y. 2009 GovGuam Budget); and

WHEREAS, as a result of receiving a smaller budget GPSS has implemented austerity measures; and

WHEREAS, despite best efforts, additional funds are necessary for GPSS to open school year 2009-2010 in compliance with P.L. 28-45 the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Education Act; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the GEPB does hereby approve GPSS' supplemental budget request for FY 09 in the amount of \$13,061,549.00 (attached); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the GEPB request expedited legislative action in order to be able to take advantage of the summer break and prepare for the new school year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to *I Mina Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guahan*; and

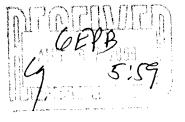

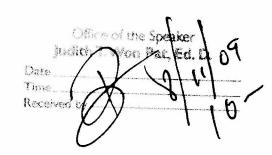

RELATIVE TO REBUILDING OF JOHN F. KENNEDY HIGH SCHOOL

WHEREAS, the Government of Guam is responsible for the provision of an adequate education as established in the Organic Act of Guam, 48 USCA, § 1421(g)(b); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Law 26-26 the Guam Education Policy Board was established to decide policy issues for the Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, JFK High School was closed on June 9, 2008 by the Health and Safety Task Force; and

WHEREAS, the students of JFK High School were in a double session with GW High School for School Year 2008-2009; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Education Policy Board finds that double session is not a conducive learning environment; and

WHEREAS, JFK High School will be housed at a temporary Tiyan facility for School Year 2009-2010; and

WHEREAS, the students of JFK High School should return to their campus located in Upper Tumon, Tamuning, by the beginning of School Year 2010-2011.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Guam Education Policy Board supports the rebuilding of JFK High School at Upper Tumon, Tamuning; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Guam Education Policy Board is in support of rebuilding the campus in a timely manner as possible; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Guam Education Policy Board reaffirms Board Resolution 2008-11 Relative to Supporting the Governor's Option to Provide an Interim John F. Kennedy High School Campus; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Guam Education Policy Board is in support of the lease back, design, demolish and build arrangement pursuant to P.L. 29-114; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of Guam; I Mina Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guahan, Bond Counsel for the transaction and the Administrator of Guam Economic Development Authority; and
