



INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to the Order of the District Court of Guam, dated July 15, 2009, the

Guam Department of Public Works Division of Highways ("DPW") hereby submits the

following bi-weekly report. The purpose of this report is to advise on the progress being

made to address the mitigation of the endangered *Partula Radiolata* (Pacific Tree Snail)

at the Ylig River Bridge construction site.

STATUS UPDATE

1. <u>Status of Snail Mitigation Plan</u>:

a. The Snail Mitigation Plan was finalized and submitted to the Department

of Agriculture, Division of Aquatic & Wildlife Resources (DAWR) on October 6, 2009

for approval and permitting. Once DAWR approves the Snail Mitigation Plan, a

determination of the final relocation site for the Ylig snails will be made.

b. According to the Snail Mitigation Plan, out of 22 potential habitat sites

surveyed between August and September 2009, only 11 sites were observed to contain

the endangered snail species, Partula Radiolata. Out of these 11 sites, only 4 were

deemed suitable for receiving the Ylig snails.

c. On October 30, 2009, DPW met with the private landowner of the most

suitable private property site to discuss and propose a possible relocation of the snails to

the site. The landowner is reviewing DPW's proposal and a response will soon be

forthcoming.

d. In the meantime, DPW has recently identified the existence of a small

strip of public property along the riverbank near the Ylig Bridge. The area is being

examined and surveyed to determine if it is a suitable habitat for the endangered snails.

If the area is found to be suitable, a very good possibility exists that the snails will be

relocated to this public Government of Guam-owned site, instead of to a privately-owned

site.

2. Next Steps:

The following tasks are planned:

a. Obtain DAWR's approval of the final Snail Mitigation Plan.

b. Survey and determine the habitat suitability and boundaries of the recently

identified strip of public Government property located along the riverbank near the Ylig

Bridge.

c. Determine the final relocation site for the Ylig snails after considering all

factors, including location and availability.

d. Secure any necessary property rights, approvals, or agreements regarding

the final relocation site.

e. Obtain any necessary permits or approvals from DAWR for the removal

of the snails from the Ylig Bridge site to the final relocation site.

f. Begin and engage in relocating the Ylig snails pursuant to approved

methodology and procedures.

3. <u>Deadlines</u> and Timelines:

The design phase of the Ylig Bridge project continues to progress and is on

schedule. Additionally, because construction is not scheduled to begin until sometime in

Summer 2010, the snails may continue to safely remain at the Ylig Bridge site until then.

Assuming the successful implementation of the snail mitigation plan, and barring

any other unexpected contingencies, the anticipated date for completing the design of the

Ylig River Bridge replacement project and for commencing construction continues to

remain approximately February 2011 (allowing one lane of traffic for haul trucks). In the

meantime, deadlines and timelines detailing the specifics of the snail mitigation plan

continue to be developed as discussed above.
