AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW §3117 TO CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DRIVERS LICENSES ISSUED TO INDIVIDUALS WITH HEARING AND SPEECH DISABILITIES; AND TO *ADD* A NEW §57106 TO CHAPTER 57 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO GUAM IDENTIFICATION CARDS ISSUED TO INDIVIDUALS WITH HEARING AND SPEECH DISABILITIES.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. A new §3117 is added to Article 1, Chapter 3 of Title 16,
- 3 Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

1	33117. Hearing/Speech impanied, Driver's License Special
2	Notation, Definitions. (a) As used in this Section, the following terms
3	mean:
4	(1) Deaf person means any person who, because of hearing loss, is
5	not able to discriminate speech when spoken in a normal
6	conversation tone regardless of the use of amplification
7	devices;
8	(2) Hearing-impaired person means any person who, because of
9	hearing loss, has a diminished capacity to discriminate speech
10	when spoken in a normal conversational tone;
11	(3) Speech-impaired person means any person who, because of
12	hearing loss, or physical or emotional disability, has a
13	diminished capacity to speak;
14	(4) HSD is a notation on a driver's license, meaning "hearing or
15	speech disability," that indicates the person is a deaf, hearing-
16	impaired or speech-impaired person who uses alternative
17	communication.
18	(b) Any resident of Guam who is a deaf, hearing-impaired or
19	speech-impaired person may apply to the Department of Revenue and
20	Taxation to have the notation "HSD" placed on the person's driver's
21	license. The Department of Revenue and Taxation shall establish the
22	criteria for placement of the "HSD" notation, such as requiring an applicant
23	to submit certain medical proof of deafness, hearing or speech impairment.
24	This service shall be provided at no additional costs to the licensee."
25	Section 2. A new §57106 is hereby added to Chapter 57 of Title 10, Guam
26	Code Annotated, to read as follows:

"§57106. Hearing/Speech Impaired, Guam Identification Card Special Notation, Definitions. (a) As used in this Section, the following terms mean:

- (1) Deaf person means any person who, because of hearing loss, is not able to discriminate speech when spoken in a normal conversation tone, regardless of the use of amplification devices;
- (2) Hearing-impaired person means any person who, because of hearing loss, has a diminished capacity to discriminate speech when spoken in a normal conversational tone;
- (3) Speech-impaired person means any person who, because of hearing loss, or physical or emotional disability, has a diminished capacity to speak;
- (4) HSD is a notation on a Guam Identification Card, meaning "hearing or speech disability," that indicates the person is a deaf, hearing-impaired or speech-impaired person who uses alternative communication.
- (b) Any resident of Guam who is a deaf, hearing-impaired or speech-impaired person *may* apply to the agency issuing Guam Identification Cards to have the notation "HSD" placed on the person's Guam Identification Card. The agency issuing Guam Identification Cards *shall* establish the criteria for placement of the "HSD" notation, such as requiring an applicant to submit certain medical proof of deafness, hearing or speech impairment. This service *shall* be provided at *no* additional costs to the cardholder."

- Section 3. Effective Date. The Department of Revenue and Taxation and
- 2 the Guam Police Department shall coordinate a meeting prior to the effective date
- 3 to properly orient personnel. This Act shall be effective thirty (30) days after its
- 4 enactment into law.
