AN ACT TO REPROGRAM AND APPROPRIATE **FUNDS FROM** THE LIMITED OBLIGATION HIGHWAY BONDS AUTHORIZED BY PUBLIC LAW 19-2, RELATIVE TO IMPROVING THE AVAILABILITY OF **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS** BY THE SCHOOL **BUSES** REFURBISHING **SELECTED SCHOOL BUSES**: **PERFORMING OVERDUE PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE SERVICES: PURCHASING TOOLS OF** AND EQUIPMENT FOR BUS MAINTENANCE; AND THE **FACILITIES DPW** REPAIRING OF \mathbf{AT} SUBSTATIONS: AND TO REPAIR VEHICLES OF THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT, AND THE GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. Following a series of oversight hearings, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the Department of Public Works (DPW) has in its inventory two hundred eleven (211) school buses. The status of these buses can be described as follows: eighty-seven (87), or forty-one percent (41%), are operational; thirty-six (36), or seventeen percent (17%), are *not* operational and are awaiting repair parts; and the remaining eighty-eight (88), or forty-two percent (42%), are inoperable and require major repairs. According to the DPW Bus Operations Superintendent, the optimum number of buses needed to provide timely bus services is one hundred seventy-nine (179). However, the average number of buses available to provide the pick-up services is only eighty-eight (88), or forty-nine percent (49%) of the optimal number.

The shortage of operating buses has been exacerbated by the travel delays caused by the highway construction that is ongoing at the tri-intersection of Routes 8, 10 and 16. The combined impact of both shortcomings has resulted in student pick-ups being delayed for as long as two (2) hours, before and after school. Many in the community have raised concerns that the loss of up to four (4) hours daily waiting for a school bus to arrive has a significant negative impact on students. The most significant concern, however, relates to the public safety aspect of standing at the bus stops, which are generally unsupervised.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that there exists an unreserved balance of approximately Two Million Two Hundred Fifty-four Thousand Four Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$2,254,413) in the Limited Obligation Highway Bonds, 1985 Series A Account authorized by Public Law 19-2. I Liheslatura intends to appropriate the amount of Two Million Two Hundred Fifty-four Thousand Four

- 1 Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$2,254,413) for the purpose of refurbishing DPW buses
- 2 requiring major repairs, performing overdue preventative maintenance services,
- 3 purchasing maintenance tools and equipment needed to effectively maintain the
- 4 DPW buses, repair DPW's bus substations, build bus shelters, and to repair public
- 5 safety vehicles as specified below.

Section 2. Appropriation.

- (a) *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* hereby appropriates the total sum of Two Million Two Hundred Fifty-four Thousand Four Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$2,254,413) from the unreserved balance of the Limited Obligation Highway Bonds, 1985 Series A Account authorized by Public Law 19-2 to the Department of Public Works (DPW) for the amounts and purposes, and in the order of priority, as follows:
 - (1) One Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,200,000) for the repair and restoration of *no less than* twenty (20) of the inoperable DPW school buses;
 - (2) Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) for the performance of, at a minimum and in accordance with the original equipment manufacturer's specifications, a quarterly preventative maintenance service on *no less than* sixty (60) of the currently operating DPW school buses;
 - (3) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) for the purchase of tools and equipment to support the maintenance of DPW's school buses;
 - (4) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) for the procurement of rental buses to temporarily augment the DPW school bus fleet;

11	(b)	Any surplus funds resulting from the purposes referenced above
12	shall be used solely to fund preventative maintenance for additional school	
13	buses as spe	ecified in (a) (2) of this Section.
14	Section 3.	Timely Completion of Maintenance Services.
15	(a)	The DPW Director shall exercise best management practices to
16	ensur	e that Subsections (1), (2) and (6) of Section 2(a) of this Act can
17	be co	mpleted within ninety (90) days, but not later than one hundred
18	twent	y (120) days.
19	(b)	The Department of Public Works, Guam Fire Department and
20	Guan	Police Department are hereby authorized, through the
21	applic	cable procurement rules and regulations of the General Services
22	Agen	cy, to augment maintenance service capacity by procuring the
23	servio	ces of private sector maintenance businesses capable of
24	comp	leting the purposes referenced in Section 2 of this Act.
25	(c)	All amounts appropriated by this Act which are not encumbered
26	or ex	pended within one hundred twenty (120) days of the effective
27	date	of this Act shall revert to the original sources.

(d) The Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to maximize the funding for and the construction of wooden bus shelters as authorized by this Act by partnering with the Guam Trades Academy.

Section 4. This appropriation is *not* subject to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan's* transfer authority *or* the Bureau of Budget and Management Research's allotment process. The Department of Administration *shall* release this appropriation for immediate expenditure and encumbrance of the Department of Public Works upon receipt of certification by the Director of the Department of Public Works that the Limited Obligation Highway Bonds projects have been completed and vendors have been paid.
