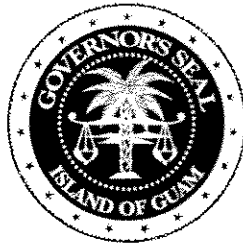



**AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (c) OF § 3209 OF
ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 16, GUAM
CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ALLOWING FOR
THE USE OF CLEAR ULTRAVIOLET (UV) RAY
FILTERING MATERIAL ON THE FRONT
WINDSHIELDS OF MOTOR VEHICLES.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that a preeminent reason the authors sponsored Public Law 29-91 was to ensure
4 that the night vision of drivers was not impaired by dark window tint on the front
5 windshield. Public Law 29-91 enacted a restriction on front windshield

1 tinting/glazing that did not allow any tinting or glazing material to extend below
2 eight (8) inches from the top of the front windshield.

3 *I Liheslatura* further finds that since ultraviolet (UV) rays are the primary
4 factor from sunlight that raises the internal temperature of the passenger
5 compartments of motor vehicles, allowing for the means of filtering out as much of
6 such UV rays, without significantly compromising the level of visible light
7 transmittance (VLT), will create cooler and safer cars, and ultimately, lower fuel
8 costs.

9 It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to allow motorists to install, apply, and/or
10 glaze the entire front windshield of motor vehicles with clear UV screening
11 material as long as the visible light transmittance does *not* fall below an average of
12 60% (plus or minus 5%).

13 **Section 2.** Subsection (c) of §3209 of Article 2 of Chapter 3 of Title 16,
14 Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

15 “(c) *No person shall* install, mount, adhere, affix, or use any sun
16 screening device or combination of devices in conjunction with the glazing
17 material of a motor vehicle windshield, *except* as follows:

18 (1) transparent sun screening film materials which are
19 installed, affixed or applied along the top edge of the windshield so
20 long as such materials measure *no lower than* eight (8) inches below
21 the top of the windshield, when measured from the bottom edge of the
22 top windshield molding;

23 (2) privacy drapes, curtains or blinds, or any combination,
24 installed on the interior of motor vehicles while parked and not being
25 operated on a public highway or roadway of Guam; or

26 (3) full window film or glazing material may be applied to
27 the entire windshield; *provided*, that such film or glazing is clear and

1 filters ultraviolet light rays and still permits a visible light
2 transmittance (VLT) of 60% ($\pm 5\%$).

3 *No* tinting material that is *not* manufactured for use on automobiles, or
4 other motor vehicles, may be used on vehicles. Any tinting film affixed to
5 the glazing material of a motor vehicle windshield must conform to U.S.
6 automotive tinting industry standards.

7 Any person who violates this Subsection *shall* be fined *not less than*
8 Fifty Dollars (\$50), and *no more than* Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) for
9 each separate offense. Said fines *shall* be deposited into the Judicial
10 Building Fund.”
