AN ACT TO AMEND §§58111 AND 58112 OF CHAPTER 58, AND §73110 OF CHAPTER 73, ALL OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE PENALTY RECLASSIFICATION FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE FIRE CODE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that §58111 (Penalty) of Chapter 58 (Fire Prevention), Title 10 GCA, and §73110
- 4 (Penalty) of Chapter 73 (Fire Prevention), Title 10 GCA, state that, "Violation of
- 5 any provision of this Chapter [fire codes] is a misdemeanor."

1	I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that §30109(a) of Article 1, Chapter 30,	
2	Title 5 GCA states: "The Attorney General is the public prosecutor and, by	
3	himself, a deputy or assistant shall: (a) Conduct on behalf of the Government of	
4	Guam the prosecution of offenses against the laws of Guam which are prosecuted	
5	in any of the courts of Guam, the District Court of Guam, and any appeals	
6	therefrom."	
7	I Liheslatura Guåhan also finds that on January 10, 2013, the Superior Court	
8	of Guam issued a Decision and Order that in the absence of representation from the	
9	Attorney General's Office, citations issued under Chapter 58 and Chapter 73, Title	
10	10 GCA that the "Traffic Violations Bureau (TVB), Courts and Ministerial	
11	Division of the Superior Court of Guam cease and desist from accepting Uniform	
12	Summons and Citation complaints based on violations of any section of the	
13	[Guam] Fire Code until such time as the inconsistencies between statute and rule	
14	are resolved."	
15	It is therefore the goal of I Liheslatura to rectify this situation by	
16	reclassifying the violations of the Fire Code as civil offenses, with increasing	
17	penalties for each recurrence.	
18	Section 2. §58111 of Chapter 58, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is	
19	hereby amended to read:	
20	"§58111. Penalty.	
21	(a) Violation of any provision of this Chapter is a civil violation.	
22	(b) Each violation shall be subject to the following penalties:	
23	(1) First Offense <i>shall</i> be subject to a penalty of up to \$100;	
24	(2) Second Offense of the same fire code provision within a	
25	12-month period shall be subject to a penalty of up to \$400, but not	
26	less than \$100;	

1		(3) Third Offense of the same fire code provision within a	
2	12-month period shall be subject to a penalty of no less than \$1,000;		
3		(4) Fourth Offense of the same fire code provision within a	
4	12-month period shall be punishable as a misdemeanor and the		
5	business license shall be suspended for up to 1 year or until the		
6	violation has been cured.		
7	(c)	All fines shall be deposited into the Fire, Life and Medical

9	Section 3.	§73110 of Chapter 73, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is	
10	hereby amended to read:		
11	"§73110.	Penalty.	
12	(a)	Violation of any provision of this Chapter is a civil violation.	
13	(b)	Each violation shall be subject to the following penalties:	
14		(1) First Offense shall be subject to a penalty of up to \$100;	
15		(2) Second Offense of the same fire code provision within a 12-	
16	month period shall be subject to a penalty of up to \$400 but not less		
17	than \$100;

- 6 Section 5. Severability. If any of the provisions of this law or its
- 7 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law,
- 8 such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this law which
- 9 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the
- 10 provisions of this law are severable.
- 11 Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon
- 12 enactment.
