MEETING MINUTES

Regular Board Meeting of January 22, 2013

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Vice-Chairman Manuel Cruz at 4:30 pm, at the GRTA conference room, Administration Building, Hagatna.

II. Roll Call

Vice-Chairman Manny Cruz and member Ginger Porter, member Ben Gumataotao, member Louise Rivera and member Jason Cruz were present. A quorum was established. Planner III Rudy Cabana and others noted on the sign in sheet were also in attendance. Not in attendance: Chairman Andrew Tydingco and Acting Interim Executive Manager Felix Dungca, out sick.

III. Approval of Minutes

Ben Gumataotao moved to approve and Ginger Porter seconded the motion to approve minutes of December 17, 2012.

IV. Public Comment

Evelyn Duenas: reported that the additional paratransit bus has made a positive impact on scheduling rides to the southern part of the island. E. Duenas reported that on Saturday, January 19, 2013 she requested from KEI dispatch to stay longer at her point of origin but was

informed by KEI that they could not accommodate her request due to the schedule was full. E. Duenas stated that later that afternoon two buses showed up at that location for one individual. E. Duenas stated that one of those buses could have transported her as it was in fact going to her requested destination. E. Duenas stated that we all need to work together to fix these kinds of problems, though small it causes a lot of problems every day.

Ben Gumataotao asked who E. Duenas spoke to that denied her ride. E. Duenas stated that she spoke to the dispatcher at KEI Paul Rabago. E. Duenas stated that she asked P. Rabago if KEI was able to accommodate her request and if not it was fine with her. E. Duenas reported that P. Rabago's response was no they were not able to because the schedule was tight.

Paul Rabago stated that he worked the morning shift and at that time there were no cancellations to the schedule to accommodate E. Duenas request.

Ginger Porter reported that on January 13, 2013 she had done some technical assistance with the dispatchers and schedulers and recommended that at the end of the day they look at the schedules to make sure that they can do adjustments to make it more efficient. This was not their normal protocol but they have been doing that as they go. G. Porter stated that what needs to be done is they need to spend 30 minutes when everything is finished so they have the whole picture. As cancellations come in they need to review the schedule again to see if there are any adjustments that can be made.

G. Porter stated that the software that GRTA is looking to purchase will be easier to see multiple schedules and help in the ability to make the adjustments needed.

Ben Servino (DISID Director): reported that he is speaking on behalf of an individual who called his office to complain about the scheduling issues with the contractor. DISID has also received a number of complaints from the DVR clients are having difficulties getting to work. The employer is now looking at possibly letting them go because of the lack of consistencies of coming to work on time. This presents a real problem for DVR when we are trying to reassure employers that our clients are willing to work but the problem being transportation.

G. Porter stated that she spoke to one of the riders who was having difficulty getting to work from Merizo. The information obtained was passed on to Rudy Cabana who coordinated with KEI to get him on a subscription service as he had established enough days to count towards that service.

- G. Porter reported that the individual also made some recommendations to the fixed route stop for Merizo and that information was provided to KEI and R. Cabana to take a look at. G. Porter asked the individual if there was a stop at that location would he be able to utilize the fix route system and was told yes.
- G. Porter stated that as information comes to her from riders, where it is a matter of getting people to work together, that we follow appropriate policy to do a better job coordinating services, particularly for those who need it for employment.

V. Old Business

1. Recruitment of Executive Manager

Rudy Cabana reported that two candidates were interviewed last week for the position. Teleconference interview Thursday, January 17, 2013 with Mr. Arno Sponeman, a veteran with 20 years of transit services experience from Illinois. The second candidate Mr. Mark Kelley, is a Student Transportation Specialist at Agana Heights DOEDA, Guam, was interviewed on Friday, January 18, 2013.

G. Porter reported that there is still one other individual who is pending to be interviewed. GRTA has received an application but is pending receipt of his resume.

2. Update of the Veterans Transportation and Community Living "One Call, One Click" Center

R. Cabana reported GRTA received FTA approval in late 2012 for this grant in the amount of \$1.3 Million. \$1.Million of this grant will go towards the construction of a new DISID Resource Center. The remaining \$300,000 is allocated for the creation of a One Call-Once Click Center. The status is of this project is GRTA expects to work with DISID during 2013 for completion.

3. Status on Fiscal Year 2013 Budget

- M. Abaya reported on the budget and provided several reports for the Board of Directors information.
- G. Porter stated to project from March September a 15 hour operation for a 5 Fixed Route and 6 Paratransit bus operations.
- G. Porter asked if the contractor KEI has responded to the request for cost detail as described in the RFQ. Myra Abaya stated that there has not been a response. G. Porter asked that the board be apprised via email as to the communication with KEI on the issue.

4. Status Transit (Bus) Procurement

- G. Porter asked the status of this project now that the AG has returned the documents with comments. What needs to be done to make document acceptable. G. Porter stated that Felix Dungca was to go back to Parsons-Brinckerhoff to get the corrections done. G. Porter stated that PB is asking for additional funding of \$80,000 to make clerical corrections based on the review of the AG. G. Porter stated that GRTA had already paid a lot of money for this project.
- R. Cabana stated that GRTA has a balance \$4,000 which was not paid to PB but it is not going to do the math as far as completing the specifications.
- M. Abaya stated that the MOU calls for putting together the specs, going to the AG for review. Upon review or revisions from the AG they would have to fix it until such time that GRTA is ready to procure it to give it to GSA for bid.
- G. Porter asked where GRTA sits with that conversation with PB. R. Cabana stated that F. Dungca is currently working on making the corrections before giving to PB. G. Porter asked that the board get a report in two weeks if GRTA is moving forward and that it doesn't cost the agency more money.
- 5. Status IFB (Invitation for Bid) for GRTA Service Contract Service and new Transit Routes and Schedules + VTCLI + New Fares (NEW ADDITIONS)
- R. Cabana reported that the Scope of Work portion of that IFB is being cleaned up to include other required provisions. GRTA is working closely with the AGO to review this packet and eventually go out to bid in mid-2013.

6. GRTA Office Relocation

G. Porter asked B. Servino if he was able to get any further information as to the rental space for GRTA in the DISID office. B. Servino stated that he has a meeting with the front office Chief of Staff tomorrow. B. Servino reported that DISID is pending receipt of the requisition for the 7th floor at the DNA building.

7. Requesting additional board members

- R. Cabana reported that there has been no word back from Mr. Erskin Sanchez as to his interest to serving on the board. G. Porter asked if Mr. Sanchez has been informed that the board is flexible to meet at a later time.
- R. Porter stated that there is another interested individual Mr. Tony Aquiningoc and if GRTA could proceed with informing him.

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VI. New Business

1. Board of Directors Resolution Approval for Acting Executive General Manager

G. Porter to move to approve the Resolution #2013-01, Interim Appointment #1, the appointment of Mr. Rudy P. Cabana to Interim Executive Manager. J. Cruz seconded the motion. The Resolution #2013-01, Interim Appointment #1, the appointment of Mr. Rudy P. Cabana to Interim Executive Manager was approved unanimously.

FIXED ROUTE SERVICE

There are seven (7) individual bus lines on the fixed route services as described below:

- Greyline servicing the Dededo, Yigo and surround areas;
- Redline servicing the Hagatna, Mangilao, Barrigada, Toto and back to Hagatna areas;
- Blueline 1 servicing the Hagatna, Tamuning, Micronesia Mall, Tumon and back to Hagatna areas;
- Blueline 2A servicing the Hagatna, Asan, Piti, Agat, Umatac and Merizo areas;
- Blueline Express servicing the Hagatna, Tamuning and Tumon areas;
- Greenline servicing the Yona, Inarajan and Talofofo areas;
- Greenline Express servicing the Chamorro Village, Adelup, Agana Heights, Sinajana and Hagatna areas;

PARA-TRANSIT SERVICES

Para-transit service is provided to all ADA Eligible Certified passengers. Certification is a requirement of this service. An application can be obtained at the GRTA Offices in Hagatna, Government of Guam Administration Building.

Reservation for use of this service must be made during normal business hours (8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday excluding all Government of Guam Holidays) on the day prior to your ride request, and up to two (2) days in advance.

A total of six (6) para-transit vehicles are assigned to the para-transit services.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Passengers are encouraged to plan ahead when using GRTA services.

Your plan should include requesting recommendations from our operators on the best or more timely route to take to reach your desired destination.

RIDERS RESPONSIBILITY

Passengers must be at the designated stop for pick up. Please keep in mind that unexpected delays can happen due to such things as traffic conditions, road constructions, bad weather, etc.

Passengers must have readily available for presentation, fare pass/coupon/tickets, identification card (if applicable) and the exact amount of money for a bus ride prior to boarding a bus.

FOLLOW THESE COMMON RULES OF COURTESY

- No eating, drinking or smoking on the bus.
- No riding under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.




