## Department of Public Works: April 22-26, 2013

There was an average of 113 school buses operational.

The Building Permits Section issued 17 building permits and 7 occupancy permits.

Transportation Maintenance Division serviced **21** buses. There are **2** buses being worked on continuously, pending availability of engines and/or parts.

The Building Maintenance crew were active on **39** projects, including:

Working on the newly renovated One Stop Center at DPW – painting, cleaning up, assisting with the window shutters;
Government House – assess drains on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor to detect source of foul odors;
Assisting Parks & Rec troubleshoot power supply for lighting system for basketball court at the Liguan Park in Dededo.

The Office of Highway Safety submitted written testimony in support of the Universal Helmet Law. The staff of this section also began preparations for the upcoming "Click It or Ticket" campaign, scheduled to launch with a Proclamation Signing on May 13, 2013, followed by radio and TV talk shows, outreach programs to daycare centers and elementary schools on child protective services; and, at the high schools island-wide, outreach on the seatbelt law, "Operation Buckle Down," will also take place.

The Highway Maintenance crew continued to clean and paint the raised median along Route 1 (AAFB-Gayinero Road); poured concrete and installed base course, formworks and WWF reinforcement to come into ADA compliance (across George Washington High School, Mangilao), and assisted the villages of Santa Rita and Merizo for their respective fiestas.
