AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW ARTICLE 10 TO CHAPTER 3 OF DIVISION 1, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE GUAM COUNCIL ON CHILD DEATH REVIEW AND PREVENTION (CCDRP).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
that there is an alarming infant mortality rate on Guam. In 2011, there were fortyfour (44) deaths of infants under one year of age; and in 2012, there were forty-six
(46) deaths of infants in the same age range. The 2011 infant death rate for Guam,



at 13.3, is more than twice as high as the national mortality rate of 5.9 for the
United States. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the death rate of children
under the age of eighteen (18) is also disturbingly high. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*finds that the Department of Public Health and Social Services may conduct
multidisciplinary and multiagency reviews of child deaths in order to reduce and
prevent the incidence of child deaths.

Therefore, to address this distressing state of affairs, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish a Council on Child Death Review and Prevention
(CCDRP) to examine, determine, and understand why so many of our children die,
for the purpose of using this information to identify strategies for the prevention of
future loss of young lives.

Section 2. A new Article 10 is *added* to Chapter 3, Division 1, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"ARTICLE 10

21	Department may conduct a multidisciplinary and multiagency review

25	§ 31004. Exception.

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1 Information regarding an ongoing civil or criminal investigation *shall* 2 be disclosed at the discretion of the applicable local or federal law 3 enforcement agency.

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§ 31005. Use of Child Death Review Information and Records.

(a) *Except* as otherwise provided in this Article, all child death review information acquired by the Department during its review of child deaths pursuant to this Article, is confidential and may *only* be disclosed as necessary to carry out the purposes of this Article.

10(b) Child death review information and statistical11compilations of data that *do not* contain any information that would12permit the identification of any person *shall* be public records.

13 (c) The CCDRP *shall* submit a report of child death review
14 information and statistical compilations of data that *do not* contain any
15 information that would permit the identification of any person to *I*16 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the Guam Legislature) on an annual basis.

Department's 17 (d)individual No participating in the 18 multidisciplinary and multiagency review of a child's death may be 19 questioned in any civil or criminal proceeding regarding information presented in or opinions formed as a result of a child death review 20 meeting. Nothing in this Subsection shall be construed to prevent a 21 person from testifying to information obtained independently of the 22 Department's multidisciplinary and multiagency review of a child's 23 death, or which is public information, or where disclosure is required 24 by law or court order. 25

26 (e) Child death review information held by the Department
27 as a result of child death reviews conducted under this Article are *not*



subject to subpoena, discovery, or introduction into evidence in any
 civil or criminal proceeding, *except* that child death review
 information otherwise available from other sources is *not* immune
 from subpoena, discovery, or introduction into evidence through those
 sources *solely* because they were provided as required by this Article.

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§ 31006. Immunity from Liability.

All agencies and individuals participating in the review of child deaths
pursuant to this Article *shall not* be held civilly or criminally liable for
providing the information required under this Article.

\$ 31007. Funding Authorization. Funding to implement and
conduct the provisions and activities authorized pursuant to this Article *shall*be expended from the annual fiscal year appropriation to the Office of Vital
Statistics, and/or from the Office of Vital Statistics Revolving Fund (Title 10
GCA, Chapter 3, Article 2, §3227.1)."

15 Section 3. Effective Date. This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.

16 Section 4. Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its application to 17 any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such 18 invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be 19 given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the 20 provisions of this Law are severable.
