





AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (f) to SECTION 2, PART III, CHAPTER II OF PUBLIC LAW 31-233, RELATIVE TO MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOR ITS APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that the sum of One Million Six Hundred Eighty-eight Thousand Four Hundred
4 Forty-eight Dollars (\$1,688,448) was appropriated from the Manpower

1 Development Fund (MDF) to the Guam Community College (GCC) for its
2 Apprenticeship Program pursuant to the *Annual Appropriations Act of Fiscal Year*
3 2013 (Section 2(d), Part III, Chapter II, Public Law 31-233).

4 *I Liheslatura* finds that according to the Fiscal Year 2012 audited financial
5 statements for GCC, funds appropriated from the MDF for the GCC
6 Apprenticeship Program have *not* been received by GCC as of February 14, 2013.
7 This, according to the audit, has resulted in cuts to funding contractual services,
8 supplies, and other operational costs across the entire College.

9 *I Liheslatura* finds that GCC continues to receive less funding from the
10 MDF each Fiscal Year. In Fiscal Year 2010, GCC received Two Million Two
11 Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,205,000), or ninety percent (90%) of its
12 appropriation; in Fiscal Year 2011, GCC received One Million Eight Hundred
13 Eighty-one Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$1,881,399). or sixty-
14 two percent (62%) of its appropriation; in Fiscal Year 2012, GCC received Seven
15 Hundred Eighty Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$787,712), or
16 forty-seven percent (47%) of its appropriation. The pattern of reduced funding to
17 the GCC is forcing the Board of Trustees and its Administrators to choose to
18 cancel important programs that are needed to provide workforce development to
19 our community.

20 *I Liheslatura* finds that revenue estimates for the Tourist Attraction Fund
21 (TAF) for Fiscal Year 2013 are tracking at Twenty-five Million Five Hundred
22 Ninety-six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars (\$25,596,688), of which
23 Twenty-three Million Eight Hundred Eighty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Dollars
24 (\$23,888,200) is appropriated.

25 *I Liheslatura* finds that the TAF revenues for Fiscal Year 2013 are projected
26 to exceed appropriations by One Million Seven Hundred Eight Thousand Four
27 Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars (\$1,708,488), *in addition to* the Fiscal Year 2012

1 ending cumulative fund balance of Four Million Sixty-five Thousand Fifteen
2 Dollars (\$4,065,015), and is available for appropriation.

3 It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to add a new Subsection
4 (f) to Section 2 of Part III, Chapter III of Public Law 31-233 to add a new funding
5 source for the GCC Apprenticeship Program and operational needs of the College.

6 **Section 2.** A new Subsection (f) is *added* to Section 2 of Part III, Chapter
7 II of Public Law 31-233, to read:

8 “(f) **Additional Appropriation to the GCC Apprenticeship**
9 **Program.** The sum of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
10 (\$1,500,000) is appropriated from the fund balance of the Tourist Attraction
11 Fund to GCC for the GCC Apprenticeship Program for Fiscal Year 2013. In
12 addition to the authorization contained in §7120 of Chapter 7, Title 22,
13 Guam Code Annotated, the appropriation herein *shall* be available and
14 authorized to be used by GCC to fund the operations of other programs at
15 GCC, as approved by the Board and Administration of the College, after all
16 Apprenticeship Program requirements and obligations have been fully
17 funded.”

18 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to
19 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other
20 provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid
21 provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
