Senior Citizens Month Report 2013

The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), Division of Senior Citizens (DSC) coordinated various events for Senior Citizens Month (SCM) 2013, which is observed annually in the month of May. The theme for this year's month long celebration, "Unleash the Power of Age," was derived from the official theme for the nation's celebration of Older American's Month 2013, as developed by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services, Administration on Community Living.

In an effort to plan and coordinate all Senior Citizens Month activities, DSC appointed staff to serve as Chair and a Central Planning Committee (CPC) was created and convened at the office of the Division of Senior Citizens on Tuesday, February 5, 2013. Thereafter, the CPC met on every 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month through April 16, 2013. Members of the CPC included representatives from government agencies and departments and private and non-profit entities, to include: Catholic Social Service (CSS) – Service Provider for the Case Management Services, Adult Day Care, In-Home Services, and Emergency Receiving Home Programs; Mayors' Council of Guam - Senior Center Operations Program; Fisher and Associates - Legal Assistance Services Provider; Kloppenburg Enterprises, Inc. - Transportation Services Provider; Health Services of the Pacific - National Family Caregiver Support Program Service Provider; 32nd Guam Legislature – Office of the Speaker and the Office of Senator Dennis G. Rodriguez, Jr; Inarajan Mayor's Office; St. Dominic's Senior Care Home; Guam Fire Department; Lions Club International - District 204; Guam Coalition on Sexual Assault and Family Violence; Guam Medical Transport and the DPHSS DSC and Division of Public Health Bureau of Nutrition Services and the Bureau of Family Health and Nursing Services.

DSC also promoted participation of Senior Citizens Month events by displaying outdoor vinyl banners proclaiming the month of May as Senior Citizens Month in the villages of Agat and Dededo, and on a billboard at the Paseo Loop. The Department of Parks and Recreation is recognized for waiving the permit fees associated with the Paseo Loop billboard reservation. A traveling banner was also displayed at each SCM event.

DSC also promoted participation of events, particularly, the Centenarian Recognition Event through the placement of a virtual banner in the web-site (homepage) of the Department of Public Health and Social Services. The banner requested for the public's assistance in identifying centenarians (senior citizens whose primary residence is Guam and turning 100 years old or older in 2013) who would be interested in celebrating their longevity as part of an event for Senior Citizens Month. A call for centenarians issued by the DPHSS through Press Release (PR) 2013-011 was also sent to the media on February 15, 2013.

HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights of Senior Citizens Month 2013 were the Proclamation Signing Event, May Crowning, Frail Elderly Mass, Centenarian Recognition Celebration, SMP-SHIP Volunteer Appreciation Banquet, Legislative Reception, Micronesian Fair, and the 2nd Annual Guam Conference on Aging.

Proclamation Signing

The Honorable Governor Eddie Baza Calvo and Lt. Governor Ray Tenorio both signed Proclamation 2013-033 at the Inarajan Senior Citizens Center on Friday, April 26, 2013, officially proclaiming the month of May 2013 as Senior Citizens Month. Inarajan Mayor Doris Flores Lujan volunteered to be the honorary Chairperson, while DSC provided support. For the past 8 years, to include this year's event, the proclamation of Senior Citizens Month has taken place at one (1) of the 12 Senior Citizens Centers. The village center designated to host the proclamation event is selected in the

order it became a Senior Citizens Center (i.e., Sinajana was the first Senior Citizens Center on Guam, thus in 2006, Proclamation Signing was held at the Sinajana Center; in 2007, the Proclamation Signing was held at the Mangilao Senior Citizens Center, etc.) as illustrated below in Table 1. As the Governor is invited to proclaim Senior Citizens Month at the designated village center, the Senior Citizens Center clients graciously host the Governor and other invited dignitaries and guests. Frail Elderly Mass

The Frail Elderly Mass is an event hosted annually by Catholic Social Service (CSS). Micronesian Fair



The MCOG also arranged for the transportation of the center participants to this event as field-trips are not included in the current senior transportation services program agreement due to funding limitations.

2nd Annual Guam Conference on Aging

The 2nd Annual Guam Conference on Aging and Disease Prevention Health Promotion Fair was sponsored by the Department of Public Health and Social Services Division of Senior Citizens (DPHSS-DSC) Guam Senior Medicare Patrol Project, DPHSS-DSC Guam State Health Insurance Assistance Program, DPHSS-DSC Bureau of Adult Protective Services, University of Guam-Cooperative Extension Service, and the Mayors' Council of Guam.

This event was held at the Guam Marriott Resort & Spa Guam on May 21 & 22, 2013 from 8:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. with Mrs. Faye Vasapolli serving as the Mistress of Ceremony. Mrs. Vasapolli is the President of Senior Center Executive Council and President of the Yona/Talofofo Senior Citizens Center.

The program for each day was identical to allow a majority of the seniors the opportunity to attend the event. It included fitness sessions, presentations, exhibitors, health screening, food sampling and demonstrations, gardening and technology for seniors, raffle drawing and games.



A total of six hundred fifty two (652) participants attended the event, as follows:

The morning program included fitness sessions on Zumba Gold and Yoga Stretch which were lead by Hilary Beyrer, Rebecca Davis and Eileen Rivera of Guam International Sports Center for the "early birds". This was followed by the National Anthem and Guam Hymn sung by Mr. Raul Garrido.

The morning presentation commenced with "Estate Planning" by Attorney Sinforoso "Rossi" Tolentino from Carlsmith Ball LLP followed by one (1) concurrent session on "Disaster Preparedness for Seniors" by Ginger Porter of the University of Guam, CEDDERS and "Guam Diabetes Project" by Glynis Almonte and Jina Rojas with Mountain-Pacific Quality Health.

The afternoon presentation consisted of the following concurrent sessions: "Physical Wellness: Let Food be Your Medicine" by Dr. Edwin J. Supit, M.D. and "EmPowering Tomorrows Seniors: Mitigate Guam's Crisis on Non-Communicable Disease" with Patrick Luces from DPHSS; "Financial Wellness" by Alexandra Taitano from Bank of Guam and "Protect, Detect, and Report Medicare Errors" by Maria Blaz from DPHSS-DSC; and "Mental Wellness" by Florence Blas and "Wound Care- Taking Care of Wounds" by Dr. Edna Acuña with Health Services of the Pacific.

Health Screening was an on-going activity and included blood pressure, body mass index and counseling provided by the assistance of the Department of Public Health and Social Services Division of Public Health Bureau of Nutrition Services and Bureau of Family Health and Nursing Services and students and their instructor from the Guam Community College Medical Assistance Program. A total of 184 seniors were screened and 34 seniors received counseling services for elevated readings.

The University of Guam's, Cooperative Extension Service provided on-going activities which included: "Farm to Table - Food Sampling Demonstrations", "Gardening for Seniors - Tips and Recommendations for Easy Gardening for Seniors" and "Technology for Seniors - Using Technology to Promote Mind Stimulation and Physical Activity".

The other day was funded using other sources which include the UOG-Cooperative Extension Services (CES) Program using 100% Federal funds through the Disease Prevention Health Promotion Program and funding provided by the Mayors' Council of Guam (MCOG). Surplus supplies from what was available within DSC were used to support the event. The Senior Medicare Patrol Project funded their SMP Program Volunteer Appreciation Banquet using 100% Federal funds.
