



C. SERVICES PROVIDED

Forty-six (46) cases or one hundred nine (109) individuals were provided with four thousand one hundred seventy-three (4173) meals. Sixty-four (64) cases or one hundred eighty-two (182) individuals were provided with seven hundred seventy-three (773) transportation services. The clients made a total of one thousand two hundred ninety-five (1295) phone calls.

Transportation services were provided to and from the office/shelter, job sites, job search and interviews, Catholic Social Service Office, home search, workshops, sponsored dinners, The Salvation Army, Mayor's Office, Superior Court, Guam Public Guardian, DPHSS, GMHA, DMHSA, AHRD, DOE, DISID, GHURA, supermarkets, etc.

Follow ups were made to GHURA, The Salvation Army on applications for housing assistance. Follow ups were made on applications submitted to various employers for employment via phone calls and transporting clients to the job sites.

D. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

A total of twenty-four (24) cases or seventy-five (75) individuals were able to rent their own home, find a place with family or friends, or were accepted into a housing program. Of the twenty- four cases:

Twelve (12) cases or thirty-eight (38) individuals moved in with family or friends.

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Nine (09) cases or twenty-three (23) individuals found their own place to rent.

Three (03) cases or fourteen (14) individuals were accepted into The Salvation Army Emergency Solutions Grant Program for housing assistance.

Eight (08) individuals found employment.

E. PROGRAM FUNCTIONS

Main Shelter at 117Catalina Lane, Dededo

Eviction

A Chuukese family of five was housed on May 6, 2013, however, they were evicted on June 5, 2013 for non compliance with house rules and policies. Clients were counseled previously on the matter.

A single Caucasian woman was housed on May 13, 2013, however, she was evicted on June 4, 2013 for non compliance of house rules and policies. Client was counseled previously on the matter.

A Chuukese family of four was housed on May 20, 2013, however, they were evicted on June 6, 2013 for non compliance with house rules and policies. Clients were counseled previously on the matter.

Program Discrepancies/ Needs

April 2-3, 2013-Tanglao General Contractors assessed, cleaned and repaired the air conditioning units that were causing water leakage. This was due to the drainage located in the double wall needing to be vacuumed.

April 10, 2013-JMI Edison Sales & Services assessed the electrical issues in the facility. On April 16 – 17, 2013 they checked the outlets and electric panel, replaced the light bulbs on the light fixtures and tested and replaced the light fixture electrical bales that were not working. They also replaced the electrical ceiling fan light kit that was not working.

April 19, 2013-Sodexo Services Guam volunteers began construction of the facility's right wing kitchen area. The construction is ongoing and in the meantime clients have been utilizing the left wing kitchen.

Update: the construction/renovation was completed on May 3, 2013 and provided by Sodexo Service and JMI and other corporate donors.

April 25, 2013-Representatives from Advance Management Inc. came to assess the mattresses, sofas and office chairs in the facility. They will sanitize the mattresses and clean the upholstery. Update: On May 7 - 8, 2013 the Advance Management Inc. workers cleaned and sanitized all beds, office chairs and couches.

On June 28, 2013 Volunteers from US Navy HSC 25 Chiefs Association began repairing the door jam in the ADA bathroom, changing the two restrooms counters, installing 3 each electric ceiling fans, and repairing the bathroom shower fixture. Due to the heavy infestation of termites, the left wing pantries repair is pending until termite treatment is performed. All construction materials are provided by Home Garden Center in Dededo of \$1500.00 with help from the US Navy HSC 25 Chiefs Association community outreach.

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They also provided lunch that included hotdogs, hamburgers, boneless chicken breasts, chips, hotdog and hamburger buns, box juices, sodas, bottled water for Guma San Jose clients and staff. A 20 lb. bag of rice was also donated. Ceiling leaks and water bubbles have been spotted in several parts of the facility. Arvin Builders have been informed and we are waiting for their response.

Men's Shelter at 119 Chapel Road, Barrigada

the Caseworker that he is working on some things and said he doesn't feel the need to inform her of his progress regarding employment. In terms of housing, he is listed as a caretaker on a GHURA Public Housing application for a disabled sister. His sister is currently at GMH. In the meantime, he is hoping to move into the housing unit in Toto with his sister by the time searching for employment since his first term. He stated that he's been searching for outdoor related jobs, however, he has a doctor's note limiting his outdoor activity. He mentioned to A 53 year old Chamorro male has been housed at GSJ for four terms. He receives public assistance through DPHSS. He suffers from Diabetes. He has not been aggressively his term ends at GSJ.

A 55 year old Chuukese male was housed on March 20, 2013. He was under the Guma San Jose meals program. He was able to apply and receive his MIP insurance through DPHSS. He had been transported on several occasions to Department of Labor for employment assistance. On April 27, 2013 he was evicted for alcohol intoxication.

Program Discrepancies/ NeedsThe 2010 Dodge Caravan company vehicle has been in the shop since April 3, 2013. Technicians are working on the realignment of the wheelchair ramp. In the meantime, the shop provided a vehicle to be utilized by the program.

Update: the Dodge Caravan was picked up on May 13, 2013 from the shop.

May 8, 2013 Advance Management Inc. workers cleaned and sanitized all beds, office chairs and sofas in the home.

The Men's Shelter is in the process of relocating. Acting Program Manager and the Men's Shelter Manager are negotiating with the prospective owner/landlord. Update: The program was not able to get out of its existing lease. However, we are in the process of cleaning and renovating a duplex owned by the Archdiocese of Agana, which will eventually be used as the men's shelter in the coming months when the existing lease expires.

Fire exit signs, smoke detectors and electrical conduits for emergency lights are needed. Two ceiling fans and front & back screen doors need to be replaced. Support Service Division was informed and repair is currently pending.

G. CLIENT PROFILE

Case # 31306

A 42 year old Chuukese woman and her two kids were housed on March 12, 2013. They were living temporarily with other family members in Yigo. The family moved to Guam from Chuuk in the summer of 2012 for a better education and employment opportunities. The woman has an associate degree in nursing, however, does not have a license to practice on Guam. She has been searching for employment prior to entry into Guma San Jose. While at Guma San Jose, staff informed her of the company Health Services of the Pacific. She applied and was later given an interview. However, the company informed her of a required valid Guam driver's license which she does not possess. Therefore, during the next few days she began studying for the driver's permit. On April 15, 2013 there was a housing opportunity provided by a family member who had an extra room in their home in Malojloj. The woman with her two kids moved out that day.
