

- 3 estimate of the 2014 Section 30 taxes owed to Guam by the Office of Insular
- 4 Affairs, United States Department of the Interior be used to support the
- 5 priorities of education.
- 6 Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the sum of
- 7 Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) is appropriated from the Section 30 tax
- 8 revenues to the Guam Department of Education (GDOE). These funds shall

- be used to implement the authorizations contained in Guam Public Law No.
- 2 31-29 relative to the implementing Public-Private Partnerships to address the
- 3 management of the maintenance operation, and repair of GDOE facilities in
- 4 the Guam public school system.
- Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application

- 7 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which
