GUAM COUNCIL ON THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES AGENCY (CAHA) Application Narrative FY 2013 (October 1, 2012 – September 30, 2013)

Despite having a small staff, CAHA accomplished and executed successful programs and projects in Fiscal Year 2013, as well as, maintained a visible and viable presence in the community. Total funding expenditures reflect \$298,300 in programming and administrative support inclusive of the \$152,300 for twenty-seven grants that CAHA awarded to individuals and organizations for projects in various artistic disciplines encompassing folk arts (3), media arts (4), performing arts (6), special projects (3) and visual arts (5) with emphasis placed on arts-in-education (3) and programs that benefit the underserved community (3). Grant and fellowship awards supported traditional arts apprenticeship programs, art instruction and presentations in schools, musical and theatre productions, music recordings and video documentation, literary works and publications, cultural and art events/activities and traditional/contemporary art exhibitions.

The Guam Masters Award created through Public Law 30-139, enacted in 2010, was established to recognize master practitioners of Guam's traditional and folk arts. In November and December 2012, CAHA presented the Guam Masters Award to four (4) individuals for their dedication and commitment to the promotion and perpetuation of a traditional art form: ninety-six year old Josefa Certeza, Sainan Suruhana (Master Healer); Francisco Lizama, Sainan Hereru (Master Blacksmith); Eileen Meno. Sainan Bailan Chamorro (Master of Chamorro Dance) and Greg Pangelinan, Sainan Lalasque (Master Carver), 1997 was the last year that cultural practitioners were officially bestowed the title of "Master" by CAHA. In March 2012, in conjunction with the Annual Chamorro Month Celebration, these Masters were honored and received further recognition with the unveiling of individual posters reflecting their contributions towards the perpetuation of the traditional art form they excel in. Furthermore, as a result of a continuing partnership with Louis Vuitton Guam Inc., a company synonymous with high-end luxury fashion pieces and a long history of passing down traditions through generations, a photographic exhibit entitled "Masters' Voyage: A Story of Tradition and Innovation" featuring black and photographs of master artisans and their apprentices practicing carving, coconut leaf weaving and blacksmithing was displayed at Louis Vuitton's flagship store in Tumon from August to September 2013. Louis Vuitton Guam Inc. plans to donate this collection of photographs to the new Guam Chamorro and Educational Facility a.k.a. the Guam National Museum set to open it December 2014. In addition, monies donated by Louis Vuitton Guam Inc. will continue to support a Masters Apprenticeship program in traditional arts set for Fiscal Year 2014. The partnership between CAHA and Louis Vuitton Guam Inc. was established in 2010 to safeguard and support the continuing transmission of the knowledge and skill related with traditional artistry through the continued practice of the craft within the community.

In 2016, Guam will host the 12th Festival of the Pacific Arts or Festpac as it is known in Guam, a regional traveling festival showcasing the diversity of arts and performances from 27 island nations and territories throughout Oceania. Held every 4 years, this two-week event is the largest cultural gathering in the Pacific that provides over 2,500 participants an opportunity to showcase their unique indigenous culture with others, as well as contemporary art forms and forums on issues that affect not only the Pacific, but the global community. In preparation for FestPac 2016, along with the opening of the Guam and Chamorro Educational Facility (Guam National Museum), it is imperative that opportunities for capacity building, product development, marketing and product sustainability are made available to our local artists. In FY 2013, CAHA sponsored two workshops "Cultural Design with History in Mind" (February 2013) and "Protecting Intellectual Property" (August 2013). Presenters provided information about ancient cultural designs found in the Mariana Islands based on archeological and historical research during the first workshop. The workshop was intended to provide inspiration for various areas of artistic expression and information that is vital for instilling confidence and pride among local artisans to appropriately use ancient traditional designs and motifs and to share their stories with other FESTPAC participants, island residents and tourists. The second workshop was an informative and educational presentation on intellectual property, trademark and copyright for visual and performance artists, writers, cultural producers and entrepreneurs. These workshops and future workshops will be geared towards inspiring, educating, empowering and providing local cultural entrepreneurs in all artistic disciplines with the information and resources to produce high caliber products that highlight Guam's uniqueness.

In June 2013 CAHA held its first grant writing workshop. Attendees including artisans, educators and nonprofit organizations were given an overview of the application process, program guidelines and advice about how to effectively present their project ideas in a grant application. CAHA staff size increased to five full time employees with the hiring of a new Program Coordinator I in August 2013. For FY 2013, eleven (11) exhibits featuring works created by visual artists and school groups, as well as, photographic and historical displays by nonprofit organizations were showcased at the CAHA Art Gallery. CAHA continues to coordinate the Annual Congressional Arts Competition and the Annual Christmas Pageant of Peace/Ornament project as well as, collaborate with the government and private sector to plan and implement annual festivals, village celebrations and signature events, such as the Guam Micronesia Island Fair, Mango Festival, Veterans Arts Showcase and other activities. CAHA continues to partner with public and private schools to ensure that the arts play a role in our children's education. CAHA remains proactive in raising arts awareness; promoting and perpetuating cultural heritage; and enriching the quality of life and learning in Guam by encouraging excellence in the arts through programs, leadership, grants and technical assistance.
