PROJECT TITLE: Maintenance and Redeployment of DAWR's Shallow Water Mooring Systems

A. NEED

The Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources have maintained the Guam' Shallow Water Mooring System since 1999 when 34 individual sites where approved and established that support local boating activities. Initially the SWMs were part of the DAWR's FAD program (F-9-D), however, it was determined to be more effective to divide the programs into two separate grants. SWMS are critical to the well being of Guam's reef habitat, as they provide a safe alternative to anchoring. A wide variety of vessel types and sizes up to 50' and 35 tons partaking in various activities such as fishing, commercial and recreational diving, snorkeling, training etc. utilize the SWMS. A pending military buildup that will increase the Guam population just in the next few years by several thousands will definitely increase activities mentioned above making this program essential to the protection of the resources. In FY' 05 a "no cost to the government" MOU was created with a local nonprofit organization called the Guam Marine Awareness Foundation (GMAF) to maintain the SWMS mostly in response to reduce cost and to stream line the redeployments of the systems in a more effective manner. This agreement included replacement of any buoys or mooring equipment that may have broken free from mooring using materials provided by DAWR. Based on inventory conducted in FY' 13, only 6 sites are operational, all on the southern end of the island deployed by DAWR staff with support from the Department of Agriculture's Law Enforcement section, which proved to be an essential component to subsidize personnel and equipment shortages. Recently, the SWMS program has come under scrutiny due to the lack of systems that are operational and the introduction of Bill 120-31 introduced in the 31st Guam legislator titled "The Guam Coral Reef Protection Act" which impose fee's to violators who damage coral by anchoring. This resulted in legislative oversight hearings to discover information regarding the delays with the SWMS program. The delays have been due to GMAF not re-deploying SWMS. The Department wrote a letter to GMAF, contacted GMAF, and delivered SWMS components to GMAF to re-deploy all the SWMS. However, GMAF has not re-deployed the SWMS. For these reasons, DAWR has made a decision to terminate the MOU with the GMAF and seek a contractor to perform the maintenance and redeployment of the SWMS. Additional setbacks to the SWMS program included the lack of an operational vessel pending equipment procurement and replacement and a shortage of personnel which resulted in the decision to seek aid from the law enforcement section. Plans to

utilize stainless steel materials to replace the currently used galvanized material are favorable based on observations made by DAWR staff and research conducted on similar systems used in other areas, it is evident that the galvanized metal material used on the eye connectors and shackles are the weak points of the system as all the original stainless steel eye anchors used to permanently anchor the systems to the substrate are all intact and in good condition.

B. OBJECTIVES

- 1. GDAWR staff will maintain, and replace as needed Guam's the 34 shallow water mooring buoys located in 30-60 ft. of water off the coast of Guam.
- 2. Procure 17 new stainless steel materials and equipment to improve the design of the SWMS to support longevity of the systems.
- 3. Maintain the inventory and inspection schedule conducted at least quarterly or as needed by DAWR staff to include Law Enforcement to verify inventory and condition of systems throughout the year. Mooring lines, Buoys, anchor points will be inspected for wear and damage as well as human interaction within the general location of the SWMS.
- 4. Provide a SWMS map handout and distribute to all boating and fisheries related retailers and establishments and will be made available on the DAWR website.

C. EXPECTED RESULTS OR BENEFITS

- 1. SWMS are critical to the well being of Guam's reef habitat, as they provide a safe alternative to anchoring. A variety of vessel types and sizes up to 50' and 35 tons utilize SWMS for up to 3 hours at a time partaking in various activities such as fishing, commercial and recreational diving, snorkeling, research and training to name a few. All 34 SWMS are expected to on line by the end of FY' 14 and DAWR staff will be able to stream line operations and be more efficient in regards to redeployments.
- 2. Improving materials such as upgrading hardware to stainless steel to replace the traditional galvanized hardware will increase the life span of the systems reducing the cost to operate and further protect the resources.
- 3. A maintenance schedule will increase accountability in regards to providing a safer and user-friendly system as well as help further identify any improvements that may be needed to include any human interactions with the surrounding environment that the SWMS may have.
- 4. SWMS map handouts will increase awareness and provide an accurate inventory for all users of the SWMS to be informed of the status of each location. The SWMS maps will be distributed throughout the island at different establishments and made available at the department of agriculture website.

D. APPROACH

- To reduce cost GDAWR staff will replace the SWMS buoys, ropes, and floats only and not the anchors. DAWR will assemble the SWMS systems, locate original anchor points using GPS, and replace the SWMS systems as needed. If DAWR does not find a SWMS anchor then the SWMS buoy will not be reinstalled. DAWR will insure all pertinent local and federal permits and applications are obtained and followed. Depending on staff availability, DAWR may seek the assistance of Law Enforcement to conduct re-deployments of SWMS.
- 2. DAWR will procure new stainless steel metal materials through the Guam GSA based on research already conducted by DAWR staff that included information from inspections and observations obtained from stakeholders, the Guam Marine Awareness Foundation and DAWR staff.
- 3. DAWR staff will conduct inventory and maintenance at least quarterly throughout the fiscal year or as needed. This schedule will include assistance from the Department of Agriculture's Law Enforcement Section.
- 4. DAWR staff will print SWMS map handouts and update at least once every quarter to help increase awareness and provide an accurate inventory for all users of the SWMS to be informed of the status of each location. The SWMS maps will be distributed throughout the island at different establishments and made available at the department of agriculture website.



- 4. Provide a SWMS map handout and distribute to all boating and fisheries related retailers and establishments and will be made available on the DAWR website.


