PROJECT TITLE: Maintenance and Repair of Fishing Platforms

A. NEED

Fishing platforms enhance fishing opportunities, but they must be maintained in order to provide a safe and enjoyable experience for inshore recreational fishermen. Facilities fall into disrepair for various reasons, such as vandalism, exposure to the elements, heavy use, and lack of local government funds to maintain the facilities.

B. OBJECTIVES

1) To upkeep, maintain, and repair the three (3) fishing platforms located on the reef flats of Ylig and Togcha Bays, over a five year period starting October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014. This will include but not be limited to removal of accumulated trash in the vicinity of the platforms, inspecting, maintaining, and repairing fishing platforms. The type of repair will depend on the type of damage encountered and will be provided as needed.

C. EXPECTED RESULTS OR BENEFITS

A regular maintenance program will prolong the lifespan of the three fishing platforms and enhance the fishing experience for users. Assessments conducted in the past by the department's staff had indicated that a maintenance plan was needed for this project as seen in attachment photograph number one A. After the removal of the trash on the fishing platforms, below the fishing platforms, as well as ten feet surrounding the platforms (two fishing platforms at Togcha and one at Ylig) the type of debris collected was an indicator of the amount of fishing activity and use of the fishing platforms by members of the public to be fishing related. In addition, the east side of the island had claimed many of fishermen's lives due to rip currents along this side of the island. Aerial survey photo seen on attachment photo one B shows rip current activity outside the fishing platform located along the east side of Guam. The Guam Fire Department along with residence has used these fishing platforms as a staging area for search and rescues thus, the fishing platforms provide a dual purpose by providing safer locations for fishermen to use as well as a safe staging area for search and rescue units to assist in saving fishermen lives.

Past site visits to the fishing platforms which included an interview by one of the local fisher people who uses the Ylig fishing platform on a daily basis, Mrs. Lucia stated that her family uses

the fishing platforms for it provides a safer area for her and her family to fish. Her statement was taken while at the platform site visit on August 14, 2009. Refer to attachment photograph one C and D for site inspection and interview photos.

From January 01, 2011 thru December 31, 2011 the department had identified through near shore aerial surveys conducted twice a month with randomly selected dates one falling on a weekend and one on the weekday whereas fishing activities are cataloged per date, time, locations, number of fishermen and gear units, weather codes, reef zones as well as types of fishing activities seen on these aerial surveys. The data base was west up by the Western Pacific Fisheries Information Network also known as WESPACFIN. The data extracted from the database identified the following fishing activities have been recorded at the fishing platform locations;

Number of Fishermen

D. APPROACH

The department's staff will perform the inspections, maintenance and repairs of the three fishing platforms.

No vessels except possibly a kayak or float and hand held non-powered tools will be used for the upkeep, repair and maintenance of the fishing platforms. Marine paint will be applied above water line to avoid contact with the water.

Because the project involves removal of trash to include marine debris such as fishing lines, nets, and ropes, the project should enhance the survival of threatened, endangered, or protected species by avoiding future entanglement.

In addition to the inspection of the fishing platforms, staff will remove all trash to include paper, monofilament (fishing line) plastic wastes, aluminum cans, batteries and metal debris located on the platforms, all lines tied to platforms, rope, monofilament (fishing lines), strings, and tuna cords and chains, to remove any debris below platforms (3) deck, and surrounding areas 10 feet surrounding platforms, including channel in front for small debris weighing 50lbs or less. This includes drift nets, tuna cords, metal debris, trash, batteries and cans. The use of heavy equipment such as back hoes, jackhammers and diggers are not allowed on the shores throughout

this project. Staff will use floatation devices such as kayaks to transport any materials and supplies (paints and tools) to and from the platforms to minimize any spillage and to transport any debris collected to the shore for extraction and proper disposal.

In the event any federal protected listed species is seen stranded injured alive or dead the work will cease until the department staff has completed the assessment, and has deemed appropriate action is taken to either rehabilitate or gather genetic samples and the samples will be sent to the appropriate federal agencies as stipulated in the department's federal permits.

All protected species encountered or reported and confirmed by the staff will be included within the annual progress reports.

Plans to proceed with this project will be based on available funding.


