

PROJECT 1: Masso Reservoir Monitoring

A. NEED

The Masso Reservoir Restoration project was completed in FY2011, and provides a safe and easily accessible freshwater fishing experience for the people of Guam. The opportunities for freshwater fishing on Guam are limited. Fena Lake, the island's largest reservoir, is on Navy property, and access to the general public is restricted or not available. The Masso Reservoir will require periodic restocking of native sport fish, as the Kuhlia are unable to complete their life history in a closed system such as the Masso Reservoir.

B. OBJECTIVES

- 1. Monitor the status of the fishery in the Masso Reservoir by restocking, collecting length-weight data, tagging, and surveying the reservoir.
- 2. Maintain the Masso Reservoir and continue enhancement of the reservoir's fish habitat, and the endangered moorhen by controlling the outbreak of hydrilla, and other non-native aquatic plants that may dominate the reservoir.

C. EXPECTED RESULTS

The development of Masso reservoir and the continued maintenance will prolong the useful-life of the facility, and replace the components of the floating platform for recreational fishing activity. This will also keep the reservoir suitable habitat for the endangered Marianas Moorhen (*Gallinula chloropus guami*)

D. APPROACH

1. Annually, monitor the status of the fishery in the Masso Reservoir. This will be accomplished in a variety of ways, to include stocking of the reservoir with native fish (Kuhlia rupestris), collecting length and weight data on the fish, tagging for

growth and recapture studies, and surveying the reservoir during fishing activity to ensure stocking efforts are adequate for the usage at the reservoir. Kuhlia will be collected from other rivers on Guam, and relocated to the Masso Reservoir. As Kuhlia are unable to complete their life history in the reservoir, the number of Kuhlia relocated to Masso will be the total number in the reservoir. Surveys will be conducted to monitor the mortality of Kuhlia through fishing or other causes. Trail cameras will also be installed at the reservoir, to monitor fishing activity while DAWR personnel are not on site, and for security purposes, to discourage vandalism or theft of the platform and its components.

- 2. Maintain the Masso Reservoir and continue enhancement of the reservoir's fish habitat, and the endangered moorhen by controlling the outbreak of hydrilla, and other non-native aquatic plants that may dominate the reservoir.
