PROJECT TITLE: Maintenance of the Agat Marina Boat Ramp

A. NEED

Boating access facilities enhance fishing opportunities, but they must be maintained in order to provide a safe and enjoyable experience for boaters and recreational fishermen. Currently, the public boat ramp at the Agat Marina is used by recreational fishers and boaters from the southwest of Guam, the Naval Base, and island-wide boaters wishing to access Guam's southern banks. In addition, the Agat Marina is a site used for the Guam International Fishing Derby which targets pelagic fish.

The Agat boat ramp walkways were repaired during FY2013. With these objectives completed, routine maintenance proposed by this new grant consists of maintaining the public boat ramp. This will be done by purchasing a water blaster to be used by Agriculture staff to provide the maintenance for the boat ramp. In previous fiscal years, challenges with the government procurement process prevented Agriculture from providing consistent maintenance of the boat ramp. The Port does not provide this type of maintenance for trailered boaters and fishers. Therefore, providing Agriculture with the equipment would enable the boat ramp to be regularly maintained by water blasting algal growth on the public boat ramp twice a month.

B. OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Purchase a water blaster for use by Agriculture staff to provide routine maintenance of the Agat marina public boat ramp. (\$2,000)
- 2. Complete two (2) water blasting days a month by fisheries staff, pending purchase of water blaster by December 2013.

C. EXPECTED RESULTS OR BENEFITS

Waterblasting the ramp will be conducted by Fisheries staff this fiscal year. Difficulties with obtaining a contract through the government's procurement office made it necessary to consider an alternative. Agriculture will be purchasing a water blaster by December 2013, and staff will be responsible for keeping the ramp algae-free this fiscal year.

D. APPROACH

In previous years, challenges by the government procurement process prevented contractual work from being obtained in a timely manner. This prevented the boat ramps from being maintained regularly. In addition, the Port does not provide this type of routine maintenance for recreational boaters and fishers. Therefore, purchasing a water blaster would allow Agriculture staff to provide routine maintenance of the public boat ramp by water blasting excess algal growth on the boat ramp.

Boating Access Site Needs Assessment

Fisheries staff from the Department of Agriculture conduct creel surveys twice a month at the Agat Marina. This is the opportunity that most fishers and boaters engage in conversation, reporting damage to the facility that impacts their fishing and boating activity. In addition, the Agat Marina is visited at least once a month to inspect for wear and tear. These visits and reports are the driving force with ensuring that damage to the facility is documented and added as a potential project the following year, pending approval by Federal Aid. Input is also obtained from the Port Authority of Guam quarterly, including any changes to the Memorandum of Understanding that may be necessary. During this fiscal year, additional input from the public will be solicited. Holding public outreach meetings will be conducted to allow recreational boaters and fishers that utilize the Agat marina to provide input towards the use of boating access funds at the Agat marina.
