PROJECT TITLE: Maintenance of the Merizo Pier and Boat Ramp Facility

A. NEED

Boating access facilities enhance fishing opportunities, but they must be maintained in order to provide a safe and enjoyable experience for boaters and recreational fishermen. Currently, the Merizo facilities have been heavily used since they provide easy and safe access to boating, fishing, and recreational activities by the general public. However, heavy use of these facilities have fallen into disrepair for various reasons, such as vandalism, general wear and tear, exposure to the elements including storms, heavy use by recreational and commercial boats, community festivals, and sporting events, and a lack of local government funds to maintain the facilities.

A contract to repair damages on the pier, boat ramp walkway, and lights was awarded during FY2013. This contract will repair the most significant damage at the facility. However, a total of four (4) stainless steel ladders were damaged during the fiscal year, most of them removed by the Mayor's office since they had become a hazard. These ladders, used by boaters accessing the pier from their boat and by fishers on the pier, will be replaced in Fy2014. In addition, several routine maintenance jobs will be completed. This includes purchasing a water blaster to remove algal growth from the boat ramp, water blasting the ramp twice a month, conducting two days of in-water trash removal around the pier and boat ramp, and providing for the power at the facility.

B. OBJECTIVES:

1. Complete Memorandum of Understanding with Merizo Mayor's Office by December 2013.
2. Have a contract in place to remove and replace the four damaged ladders on the Merizo Pier by September 2014. This is a one-time construction contract to address current damage to the pier. (\$60,000.00)
3. Conduct at least two (2) clean-up days by fisheries staff to remove trash and fishing gear that may have entered the waters immediately around the Merizo Pier due to recreational and subsistence fishing activity. Agriculture will be responsible for this objective annually.

4. Conduct water blasting on a monthly basis by fisheries staff to remove algal growth on the boat ramp. Agriculture will be responsible for this objective for this fiscal year by purchasing a water blaster for this objective which will be used for the Agana boat basin and the Agat marina as well. (\$2,000)
5. Pay for the power at the Merizo pier and boat ramp facility, ensuring lighting for the facility to provide safe and adequate recreational boating and fishing activities. Agriculture will be responsible for this objective annually. (\$7,000)

C. EXPECTED RESULTS OR BENEFITS

A regular maintenance program will prolong the lifespan of the boat ramp facility and the pier, providing recreational boaters and fishermen with access to marine and fishing resources. Providing power to the facility will ensure safe recreational boating and fishing opportunities.

D. APPROACH

This facility is heavily used by recreational and subsistence fishermen of all ages, and is a safe area for fishing at all hours of the day. To encourage this activity year round, Agriculture assists the Merizo Mayor's office by providing contractual work to do major repair work. In addition to contractual work, Agriculture will be responsible for several routine maintenance jobs such as water blasting algal growth on the boat ramp, conducting two in-water trash removal days, and providing for the power at the facility. Currently, the Department of Agriculture has a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Merizo Mayor's office to ensure that the facility is open free of charge to the general public.

Boating Access Site Needs Assessment

Fisheries staff from the Department of Agriculture conduct creel surveys twice a month at the Merizo Pier. Damage to the facility is usually reported to the project coordinator. In addition, the pier is visited at least once a month to inspect for wear and tear. These visits and reports are the driving force with ensuring that damage to the facility is documented and added as a potential project the following year, pending approval by Federal Aid. In addition, a visit to the Merizo Mayor will be conducted once a quarter to discuss any current issues with use of the pier, including any changes to the Memorandum of Understanding that may be necessary. Currently, the Mayor's office is responsible for trash collection, grounds upkeep, water, and restroom upkeep. During FY2013, the Mayor's office requested that Agriculture consider repairing damaged wood planks on the pier and consider placing a shore-based platform in the vicinity. This will be considered for fiscal year 2015.

Additional work provided by the public is also considered and will be added as work items if deemed eligible and can be accommodated based on urgency, safety, and available funding. Federal Aid, Honolulu Office, is always consulted on potential projects to ensure that jobs proposed meet the requirements of Sport Fish Restoration's Boating Access grant.

OBJECTIVES:

1. Complete Memorandum of Understanding with Merizo Mayor's Office by December 2013.
2. Have a contract in place to remove and replace the four damaged ladders on the Merizo Pier by September 2014. This is a one-time construction contract to address current damage to the pier. (\$60,000.00)
3. Conduct at least two (2) clean-up days by fisheries staff to remove trash and fishing gear that may have entered the waters immediately around the Merizo Pier due to recreational and subsistence fishing activity. Agriculture will be responsible for this objective annually.
4. Conduct water blasting on a monthly basis by fisheries staff to remove algal growth on the boat ramp. Agriculture will be responsible for this objective for this fiscal year by purchasing a water blaster for this objective which will be used for the Agana boat basin and the Agat marina as well. (\$2,000)
5. Pay for the power at the Merizo pier and boat ramp facility, ensuring lighting for the facility to provide safe and adequate recreational boating and fishing activities. Agriculture will be responsible for this objective annually. (\$7,000)


