## **C. SERVICES PROVIDED**

Two hundred two (202) cases or four hundred twenty-three (423) individuals were provided with sixteen thousand nine hundred seventy (16,970) meals. Two hundred sixty-eight (268) cases or six hundred four (604) individuals were provided with two thousand seven hundred seventy-seven (2,777) transportation services. The clients made a total of five thousand seventy-three (5,073) phone calls.

The transportation services were provided to and from the office/shelter, job sites, job search, job interviews, Catholic Social Service Office, home search, workshops, sponsored dinners, Salvation Army, Mayor's Office, Superior Court, Guam Public Guardian, DPHSS, GMHA, DMHSA, AHRD, DOL, DOE, DISID, GHURA, super markets, etc.

Follow ups were made to GHURA and Salvation Army on applications for housing assistance. Follow ups were made on applications submitted to various employers for employment via phone calls and transporting clients to the job sites.

## **D. ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

One hundred four (104) cases or two hundred ninety-eight (298) individuals were able to rent their own or find a place with family or friends, or were accepted into a housing program:

Seventy-three (73) cases or two hundred twenty-two (222) individuals found a place with family and or friends.

Fourteen (14) cases or forty-three (43) individuals were able to rent on their own.

Five (05) cases or seven (07) individuals relocated to family off island.

One (01) case or one (01) individual was accepted into Oasis Empowerment Center.

One (01) case or one (01) individual was accepted into a Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center group home.

Eight (08) cases or twenty-two (22) individuals were accepted into the Salvation Army Emergency Solutions Grant Program for housing assistance.

Two (02) cases or two (02) individuals were accepted into a GHURA housing program.

Twelve (12) individuals were able to find employment.

## E. PROGRAM FUNCTIONS

### Main Shelter at 117Catalina Lane, Dededo

#### **Client**

A couple was housed on October 4, 2012. The female was also pregnant, due to deliver in late October. Both were unemployed, however they receive public benefits. Prior to entry, the couple was living in the pavilion by the Tamuning Mayor's office for several weeks. Family members were unable to assist them with shelter. They are on the waiting list for GHURA. On October 19, 2012 she gave birth to a healthy baby boy. Friends have been assisting them with donations to help with their needs. The male individual is currently looking for employment and shelter. The family moved out on December 3, 2012.

A 29 year old single woman was housed as an emergency for 24 hours on November 27, 2012. Guam Airport Police referred the individual to GSJ. She had been on island for a little over a week from New York. She was hired to work at a club in Tumon. However, she had trouble with the management and her roommates were also stealing from her. She became stressed to a point where she wasn't sleeping and eating well. Prior to coming into the shelter she was at GMH because she fell and hit her head at her apartment. The individual has been in contact with her boyfriend in New York in hopes to purchase a plane ticket back. GSJ provided meals and the use of the computer to contact her boyfriend and family. On November 28, 2012 she retrieved her belongings at GSJ and informed the staff she will be heading back to New York.

A 73 year old woman on her third term with GSJ was able to get assistance from the Korean Association and its president Mr. Richard Chi in regards to temporary housing. She moved out of GSJ on March 18, 2013.

#### **Eviction**

A family of three was housed on October 4, 2012. The male individual is employed full time at a construction company. The family was referred to Salvation Army for possible rental assistance. They also receive public benefits. During their time at GSJ, problems arose with the couple constantly arguing. On October 24, 2012 during the early morning hours, the staff on duty called the police. The female individual stated that she was threatened and slapped by her common law. A call was made to Alee Shelter where the woman was admitted, however, she returned to GSJ later in the day to continue her term. The male individual was evicted on October 24, 2012.

Update: The female individual was evicted on November 7, 2012 for no call, no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A family of seven were housed on October 8, 2012, however, were evicted on October 11, 2012 for no call, no show. The family never returned.

A family of three were housed on October 25, 2012, however, were evicted on October 29, 2012 for no call, no show. The family never returned.



A single mother of three on their second term with GSI was evicted on November 13, 2012 for non compliance with house rules and policy and no call, no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A single woman on her second term with GSI was evicted on November 13, 2012 for no call, no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A single female was housed on November 6, 2012 and was evicted on December 20, 2012 for alcohol intoxication.

A family of seven was housed on November 13, 2012 and was evicted on December 23, 2012 for non compliance to house rules and policy. Prior, the Acting Program Manager spoke to the female head of household regarding previous incidences of non compliance.

A couple was housed on December 24, 2012 was evicted on December 26, 2012 for two consecutive days no call, no show.

A family of five were housed on January 3, 2013, however, were evicted on January 6, 2013 for no call, no show for more than two consecutive nights. The family never returned.

A family of three was housed on January 7, 2013. On February 11, 2013 they were evicted for no call, no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A family of five was housed on January 16, 2013. On February 23, 2013 the male individual was evicted for alcohol intoxication. Guam Police were called.

A family of four was housed on January 17, 2013. On February 23, 2013 the female individual was evicted for alcohol intoxication and belligerent behavior. Guam Police were called and officers took the individual. The remaining household members decided to move out on February 25, 2013 to live with family.

A family of five was housed on May 6, 2013, however, they were evicted on June 5, 2013 for non compliance with house rules and policies. Clients were counseled previously on the matter.

A single woman was housed on May 13, 2013, however, she was evicted on June 4, 2013 for non compliance of house rules and policies. Client was counseled previously on the matter.

A family of four was housed on May 20, 2013, however, they were evicted on June 6, 2013 for non compliance with house rules and policies. Clients were counseled previously on the matter.

On July 17, 2013 a male individual was evicted for noncompliance with house rules and policies. His girlfriend and 3 children are still in the program. They entered the program on July 2, 2013.

A family of four was housed on June 20, 2013 was evicted on August 8, 2013 for non compliance with house rules and policy.

A family of seven was housed on June 18, 2013. The male individual was evicted on August 14, 2013 for noncompliance with house rules and policy. The remaining family members moved out on August 17, 2013 to live with other family.

A family of five was housed on September 3, 2013. On September 15, 2013 they were evicted because of drug paraphernalia. Guam Police were called to the shelter. The couple was reported to Child Protective Services.

A single female was housed on September 12, 2013. She was a Guam Behavioral Health & Wellness Center referral and was evicted on September 27, 2013. Client was unstable, very moody, angry, not safe when she acts out, very disruptive, complained a lot, had too many personal issues and just didn't want to follow the rules.

#### **Placement**

A single mother of 3 was housed on September 5, 2013 and exited on September 29, 2013 into an apartment of her own. Client was reunited with her parents and they will assist her with the rental payments.

#### **Program Needs/Discrepancies**

A new washing machine and two new refrigerators were purchased during the first quarter. The new refrigerators are to replace the current ones, which are leaking and have problems with temperature.

October 5, 2012 plumbers from Guam Plumbing cleared a clogged pipe that was causing a back up in the kitchen sink on the right wing of the building.

October 9, 2012 workers from J.C. Reyes Construction began working on the left wing kitchen counters and both ADA restrooms.

New and recurring leaks and water bubbles have been spotted in several parts of the facility ceilings. This was due to the heavy rains. The building contractor Arvin Builders and GHURA were contacted regarding the matter and we are awaiting their response.  
Update: October 12, 2012 contractors assessed the damages. October 20, 21 & 27, 2012 contractors came to work on repairing the roof and ceiling.

October 17, 2012 Tanglao General Contractors assessed the office air conditioning units.

October 19, 2012 Representative from Phoenix Pacific assessed the fire alarm panel.

November 7 & 8, 2012 Tanglao General Contractors assessed and cleaned the office air conditioning units.

November 16, 2012 Benny San Nicolas and Yuki Tsukahara from ECOLAB installed the dispenser for the cleaning solutions.

November 23, 2012 Support Service staff assessed the right wing kitchen faucet, which is leaking.

Update: On December 3, 2012 the kitchen faucet was replaced.

January 24, 2013 Tanglao General Contractors assessed two office air conditioning units.

January 30, 2013 the contractors came and cleaned the two units.

January 25, 2013 Support Service staff assessed the electrical panel. The restroom located in the far left wing of the facility has electrical problems with the switch and lighting.

January 29 & 31, 2013 Support Service staff assessed the clogged pipes in the kitchen faucets and the ADA restroom of the left wing of the facility.

February 28, 2013 Tanglao General Contractors assessed and cleaned the air conditioning unit in the study room.

April 2 – 3, 2013 Tanglao General Contractors assessed, cleaned and repaired the air conditioning units that were causing water leakage due to the drainage being located in the double wall that needed to be vacuumed.

April 10, 2013 JMI Edison Sales & Services assessed the electrical issues of the facility. On April 16 – 17, 2013 they checked the outlets, electric panel and replaced the light bulbs on the light fixtures and tested and replaced the light fixture electrical bales' that are not working. Replaced the electrical ceiling fan light kit that is not working.

April 19, 2013 Sodexo Services Guam volunteers began construction of the facility's right wing kitchen area. The construction is ongoing and in the meantime clients have been utilizing the left wing kitchen.

Update: the construction/renovation was completed on May 3, 2013 and provided by Sodexo Service and JMI and other corporate donation.

April 25, 2013 Representatives from Advance Management Inc. came by to assess the mattresses, Sofas and office chairs of the facility.

Update: On May 7 – 8, 2013 the Advance Management Inc. Workers cleaned and sanitized all beds, office chairs and couches.

On June 28, 2013 Volunteers from US Navy HSC 25 Chiefs Association began repairing the door jamb change the ADA bathroom door, change two restrooms counters, 3 each electric ceiling fans installed in the facility, repaired the bathroom fixture on one of the shower. Due to the heavy infestation of the termite on the left wing pantries pending the door jamb repair until a termite treatment is perform. All construction materials are provided by Home Garden

Center in Dededo of \$1500.00 dollars by the help from the US Navy HSC 25 Chiefs Association community outreach.

They also provided lunch, the Chiefs Bar B Q hotdogs, hamburger, boneless chicken breast, chips, hotdog, hamburger buns, box juices, soda's, bottle water for Guma San Jose clients and staff and donated 20 lbs. of rice.

**Update:**

On July 8, 2013 - The Pacific Pest Control treated the left wing area affected by termites before the installation of the door jamb/frames.

On July 19, 2013 - The volunteers returned to work on the door frames and closet doors.

Ceiling continues to have a serious leak, water bubbles is also a serious problem in several parts of the facility. The leaks have caused electrical problems in the light fixture and ceiling fan in one of the rooms. For the safety of everyone, the room was closed. There are other leaks in other rooms. Guma San Jose staff continues to notify GHURA and Arvin Builders of the leaks and problems they have created. Arvin Builders water blasted the roof in August which created more leaks and nothing has been done since then. Is it okay to ask the Board to help us out with this leaking problem? Thank you.

**Men's Shelter at 119 Chapel Road, Barrigada**

**Client**

A 51 year old male is on his second term with GSJ. He does not receive food stamps therefore he is under GSJ meals program. He has been actively searching for employment. With the assistance of the Men's Shelter Manager, he was hired as a gas attendant for SHELL in early October. Currently he is saving his wages and searching for a place to rent. The individual moved out on December 15, 2012.

A 53 year old male has been housed at GSJ for four terms. He receives public assistance through DPHSS. He suffers from Diabetes. He has not been aggressively searching for employment since his first term. He stated that he's been searching for outdoor related jobs; however, he has a doctor's note limiting his outdoor activity. He mentioned to the Caseworker that he is working on some things and said he doesn't feel the need to inform her of his progress regarding employment. In terms of housing, he is listed a caretaker on a GHURA Public Housing application for a disabled sister. His sister is currently at GMH. In the meantime, he is hoping to move into the housing unit in Toto with his sister by the time his term ends at GSJ.

**Eviction**

A single 60 year old male on his third term with GSJ was evicted on November 10, 2012 for alcohol. This individual had been evicted prior for alcohol intoxication.

A single 46 year old male on his second term with GSJ was evicted on November 16, 2012 for no call no show for more than two consecutive nights.

A single 25 year old male on his second term with GSJ was evicted on November 18, 2012 for belligerent attitude toward the staff. This individual had been warned of prior incidences.

A single 22 year old male, also a DMHSA client, was evicted on November 29, 2012 for belligerent attitude toward the staff. This individual had been warned of prior incidences.

A single male was housed on November 20, 2012 and was evicted on December 12, 2012 for consecutive two days no call no show.

A single male was housed on November 6, 2012 and was evicted on December 10, 2012 for threatening another client.

A single male was housed on November 15, 2012 and was evicted on December 13, 2012 for two consecutive days no call no show.

A 55 year old male was housed on March 20, 2013. He was under Guma San Jose meals program. He was able to apply and receive his MIP insurance through DPHSS. He had been transported on several occasions to Department of Labor for employment assistance. On April 27, 2013 he was evicted for alcohol intoxication.

On August 6, 2013 A 35 year old client was evicted for no call/no show for two consecutive days.

On August 26, 2013 A 62 year old client was evicted for no call/no show for two consecutive days.

A 34 year old male individual was housed on August 30, 2013. He was evicted on September 17, 2013 for noncompliance with house rules and policies.

#### **Program Needs/Discrepancies**

October 6, 2012 Guam Plumbing repaired the broken water line after the meter connection.

November 17, 2012 Benny San Nicolas and Yuki Tsukahara from ECOLAB installed the dispenser for the cleaning solutions.

December 17, 2012 the circuit breaker that provides power to the office in the home went down. Support Service was informed and waiting for their response.

Update: January 2, 2013 Men's Shelter Manager and a Shelter Worker replaced and fixed the socket to the circuit breaker.

The both restrooms in the home are backed up with plumbing problems. February 23, 2013 Island Plumbing, along with Support Service staff, came to work on the plumbing however the restrooms continued to be backed up. February 25, 2013 Detry Plumbing Service, via BHI Realty, repaired the problem.

The 2010 Dodge Caravan company vehicle has been in the shop since April 3, 2013. Technicians are working on the realignment of the wheelchair ramp. In the meantime, the shop provided a vehicle to be utilized by the program.

Update: the Dodge Caravan was picked up on May 13, 2013 from the shop.

May 8, 2013 Advance Management Inc. workers cleaned and sanitized all beds and office chairs, Sofa's in the home.

The Men's Shelter is in the process of relocating. Acting Program Manager and Men's Shelter Manager are negotiating with the prospective owner/landlord.

Update: The program was not able to get out of its existing lease. However, we are in the process of cleaning and renovating a duplex owned by the Archdiocese of Agana which eventually will be used as the men shelter in the coming months when the existing lease expired.

We are in the process of cleaning and renovating the duplex at 122 Tun Bihu Street, Ordot owned by the Archdiocese of Agana. It will be used as the Men's Shelter hopefully before the New Year. The lease for the Barrigada house will expire in January 2014. Power and water is connected at the new facility. Meters and shut off valves were also installed.

.Fire exit signs, smoke detectors and electrical conduits for emergency lights are needed. Two ceiling fans and the front & back screen doors need to be replaced. Support Service Division was informed and the request is pending for the reporting month. A Shelter Manager is working closely with Support Services Division in regard to the renovation of the Ordot house.

#### **Company Van**

Transportation service was difficult for both shelters during the first quarter. The 2012 Dodge Caravan is wheel chair assessable, however, can only hold four non wheel chair passengers. The van is being utilized by both shelters. A van for the usage of the Men's Shelter is pending Executive Director's approval.

Update: November 28, 2012 Acting Program Manager and Men's Shelter Manager picked up a 2013 leased Nissan Quest van from Nissan Corp.

## **G. CLIENT PROFILE**

Case # 101324

A 63 year old Military Veteran was housed on October 8, 2012. He had been on Guam for two days staying at a motel in Tamuning. The individual came from the Philippines with no prior living arrangements and no family on island. He receives Social Security, has a pension from the military and was under GSJ meals program. Veteran Affairs Office was informed of client's status and a representative came down to meet with him. He was also referred to

Case Management for additional services. However, on October 18, 2012 he departed Guam and returned to the Philippines.

Case # 111309

A single woman was housed on November 9, 2012. She had been evicted by her friend. The individual is currently employed part time at a restaurant in Tumon and receives food stamps and Medicaid. While at GSJ, she was referred to Salvation Army for housing assistance. They informed her that she will be assisted with 3 months of rent under the Emergency Solutions Grant Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program. She has been diligently following up with her GHURA housing applications and submitting the required documents. Currently, she is looking for a place to rent.

Case # 101328

A 62 year old single female was housed on October 18, 2012. She is employed with Department of Labor Senior Citizen Employment Program (SCEP) and is detailed at Guam Energy Office. She receives public assistance. She had been homeless for several months. While at GSJ, she was referred to Salvation Army Emergency Solutions Grant Program for housing assistance. She was approved for assistance in November and began searching for a place to rent. On December 16, 2012 the individual moved into her own apartment in Tamuning.

Case # 11309

A 45 year old single female with a 5 year old daughter was housed on January 10, 2013. She had been evicted by her common law and spent a few days sleeping in a car. She is unemployed but receives public assistances through DPHSS. GSJ staff assisted her with her resume and was provided with GHURA housing application. She was referred to DOE Head Start Program where a representative came down to meet with her. She was transported to GHURA to submit her housing application and to Department of Labor OneStop Career Center to register and receive employment assistance. Currently, the individual has been utilizing the computers at the shelter to search for employment.

Update: The individual along with her daughter moved out on March 8, 2013.

Case # 21304

A 49 year old single male was housed on February 25, 2013. He was living with his brother and sister in law in Dededo for two years. However, he had an argument with his sister in law and was evicted by her. For two months the individual was homeless, sleeping in parks and beaches. He would eat a hot meal at the soup kitchens in either Agana or Dededo. He did not receive public assistance but had some income working side jobs for cash. He was able to apply for public benefits through Department of Public Health and Social Services and was approved for the SNAP program and cash assistance. However, on February 28, 2013 the individual moved out. He informed the staff that his brother was going to shelter him.

Case # 11315

A 64 year old male was housed on January 18, 2013. He was living with his daughter and her family for a few months. However, he felt he was being mistreated by them. An Adult

Protective Service Social Worker made a visit to the shelter and interviewed the client regarding his prior living situation. He receives Social Security, Medicare and food stamps. He attended the UOG EFNEP Nutrition classes held at the Dededo shelter. He applied for GHURA two days before coming into Guma San Jose. In early March he attended a GHURA housing orientation in Agat. He was then informed that there was a unit available for him in that village. The individual moved out on March 19, 2013.

Case # 31306

A 42 year old woman and her two kids were housed on March 12, 2013. They were living temporarily with other family members in Yigo. The family moved to Guam from Chuuk in the summer of 2012 for a better education and employment opportunities. The woman has an associate degree in nursing, however does not have a license to practice on Guam. She has been searching for employment prior to entry into Guma San Jose. While at Guma San Jose, staff informed her of the company Health Services of the Pacific. She applied and was later given an interview. However, the company informed her of a required valid Guam driver's license which she does not possess. Therefore, during the next few days, she began studying for the driver's permit. On April 15, 2013 there was a housing opportunity provided by a family member who had an extra room in their home in Malojloj. The woman with her two kids moved out that day.

## B. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

### SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES:

GSJ assisted a total of eighty-nine (89) cases or one hundred ninety-nine (199) individuals for the months of **JULY, AUGUST, SEPTEMBER FY' 2013.**

July 9, 2013 - Program Manager had a meeting with all Guma San Jose staff at the Dededo Shelter. An introduction was made, expectations and GSJ rules and CSS personnel policies were shared and discussed. A team building activity for all staff is planned for August 24, 2013 from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm at Matapang Beach. The next meeting will be held on August 23, 2013 at 3:00 pm.

July 13, 2013 - Saint John Episcopal Church sponsored their monthly dinner serving held at their fellowship hall. They also donated milk, laundry soap, toilet paper, bar soap and 20 bags filled with goodies to the clients.

July 1 - 30, 2013 – Twenty-five (25) clients were transported to The Salvation Army to attend a money management class, and to apply for housing, clothing and food.

July 24, 2013 - Kusinan Santa Barbara sponsored their monthly dinner serving held at their parish hall, and clients were given 2 boxes of cereal each. Three gift baskets of assorted canned and dry goods were also donated.

July 25, 2013 - Elizabeth Ignacio of DPHSS/BOSSA monitored both Guma San Jose Shelters and verbally reported that everything looked good. She suggested we include an exit interview survey for the clients that leave the program and also to include the types of services we provide the clients in their files. Program Manager also proposed to BOSSA that all clients be screened for TB before entering GSJ for the safety of all clients and



staff. Ms. Igancio liked the idea and will look into how the screening process can be worked out and funded.

August 12, 2013 - Program Manager held a meeting for the clients of the Dededo shelter on house rules and policy.

August 17, 2013 - University of Guam Cooperative Extension Service Expanded Food & Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) classes began. The classes are held Tuesdays & Thursdays at the Dededo shelter and are taught by Ms. Louise Camacho.

August 17, 2013 - Saint John Episcopal Church sponsored their monthly dinner serving held at their fellowship hall.

August 24, 2013 - Josh Clemente, 36<sup>th</sup> OSS, along with friends and family, sponsored a dinner serving held at Guma San Jose lanai.

August 28, 2013 - Kusinan Santa Barbara sponsored their monthly dinner serving held at their parish hall and each client was provided with a bag of canned goods.

August 2013 - Staff and clients were busy preparing for the September 3, 2013 GHURA inspection.

September 3, 2013 - Representatives from GHURA conducted an inspection of the Dededo facility.

September 4, 2013 - Inspection was completed and Guma San Jose passed.

September 5, 2013 - GSI clients completed the University of Guam Cooperative Extension Service Expanded Food & Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) classes. Certificates of completion were given by Ms. Louise Camacho, EFNEP instructor to 15 participants.

September 7, 2013 - 6 Shelter Workers attended a CPI training at CSS.

September 11, 2013 - Program Manager attended a 3 hour COC Training at GHURA with Mark Chandler from HUD, Honolulu, Hawaii.

September 12, 2013 - PM gave a talk to 11 students and their Professor from UOG at Guma San Jose followed by a tour of the facility.

September 19, 2013 - PM attended Marketing & Development Committee and Management meeting at CSS. PM also attended a Donor/Volunteer Appreciation Committee meeting.

September 23, 2013 - 6 parents and 12 children of non-school age were transported to Micronesia Mall for an outing at Kids Play Lollipop. They were there for 2 hours free of charge sponsored by Mrs. Jinhee Park.

September 24, 2013 - Program Manager held a meeting with the clients at the Dededo shelter regarding house rules and policies.

September 25, 2013 - Kusinan Santa Barbara sponsored their monthly dinner serving held at their parish hall. Clients were given a bag of assorted canned goods as well.

September 27, 2013 - PM and Shelter Manager participated in the Donor/Volunteer Appreciation Marienda at CSS. Guma San Jose provided cookies for the function.

September 28, 2013 - Guahan Rota Lion's Club sponsored a dinner serving held at GSI lanai.

### **CONFERENCE AND/OR TRAINING**

July 18-19, 2013 - Men's Shelter Manager attended the Guam Behavioral Wellness Center ASSIST training held at the Guam Marriot Hotel.

July 26, 2013 - Program Manager and one Shelter Manager attended the Modern Man Conference at the Guam Marriot Hotel.

August 3 & 24, 2013 - Guma San Jose staff attended First Aid/CPR training for recertification.

September 7, 2013 - Eight GSI staff attended Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) training held at CSS main conference room. Mr. Pete Cruz from Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center was the instructor.

## **C. SERVICES PROVIDED**

Forty-six (46) cases or eighty-three (83) individuals were provided with three thousand five hundred twenty-two (3522) meals. Sixty-four (64) cases or one hundred thirty-one (131) individuals were provided with six hundred one (601) transportation services. The clients made a total of nine hundred thirty (930) phone calls.

These transportation services were provided to and from the office/shelter, job sites, job search, job interviews, Catholic Social Service Office, home search, workshops, sponsored dinners, Salvation Army, Mayor's Office, Superior Court, Guam Public Guardian, DPHSS, GMHA, DMHSA, AHRD, DOE, DISID, GHURA, supermarkets, etc.

Follow ups were made at GHURA, Salvation Army on applications for housing assistance. Follow ups were made on applications submitted to various employers for employment via phone calls and transporting clients to the job sites.

## D. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Twenty-five (25) cases or sixty-two (62) individuals were able to rent on their own or find a place with family or friends, or were accepted into a housing program:

Sixteen (16) cases or forty-five (45) individuals found a place with family and or friends.

Two (02) cases or four (04) individual relocated to family off island.

Three (03) case or six (06) individuals were accepted into the Salvation Army Emergency Solutions Grant Program for housing assistance.

One (01) case or four (04) individuals were able to rent on their own.

One (01) case or one (01) individual was accepted into Oasis Empowerment Center.

One (01) case or one (01) individual was accepted into a Guam Behavioral Wellness Center group home.

One (01) case or one (01) individual was able to find an apartment through GHURA section 8 Program.

Four (04) individuals were able to find employment.

## E. PROGRAM FUNCTIONS

### Main Shelter at 117 Catalina Lane, Dededo

#### **Eviction**

On July 17, 2013 a male individual was evicted for non compliance with house rules and policies. His girlfriend and 3 children are still in the program. They entered the program on July 2, 2013.

A family of four was housed on June 20, 2013 and was evicted on August 8, 2013 for non compliance with house rules and policy.

A family of seven was housed on June 18, 2013. The male individual was evicted on August 14, 2013 for non compliance with house rules and policy. The remaining family members moved out on August 17, 2013 to live with other relatives.

A family of five was housed on September 3, 2013. On September 15, 2013 they were evicted because of drug paraphernalia. Guam Police were called to the shelter. The couple was reported to Child Protective Services.

A single female was housed on September 12, 2013. She was a Guam Behavioral Health & Wellness Center referral and was evicted on September 27, 2013. Client was unstable, very moody, angry, not safe when she acts out, very disruptive, complained a lot, had too many personal issues and just didn't want to follow the rules.

**Placement**

A single mother of 3 was housed on September 5, 2013 and exited on September 29, 2013 into an apartment of her own. Client was reunited with her parents, and they will assist her with the rental payments.

**Program Discrepancies/ Needs**

On June 28, 2013 - Volunteers from US Navy HSC 25 Chiefs Association began repairing the door jam, changing the ADA bathroom door, changing two restrooms counters, installing 3 each electric ceiling fans in the facility, and repairing the bathroom fixture in one of the showers. Due to the heavy infestation of termites on the left wing pantries, the door jam was pending repair until a termite treatment was performed. All construction materials are provided by Home Center in Dededo in the amount of \$1500.00 with help from the US Navy HSC 25 Chiefs Association community outreach. They also provided lunch, the Chiefs Bar B Q hotdogs, hamburgers, boneless chicken breast, chips, hotdog & hamburger buns, box juices, sodas, hottled water for Guma San Jose clients and staff. 20 lbs. of rice was also donated.

**Update:**

On July 8, 2013 - The Pacific Pest Control treated the left wing area affected by termites before the installation of the door jam/frames.

On July 19, 2013 - The volunteers returned to work on the door frames and closet doors.

Ceiling continues to have a serious leak, water bubbles is also a serious problem in several parts of the facility. The leaks have caused electrical problems in the light fixture and ceiling fan in one of the rooms. For the safety of everyone, the room was closed. There are other leaks in other rooms. Guma San Jose staff continues to notify GHURA and Arvin Builders of the leaks and problems they have created. Arvin Builders water blasted the roof in August which created more leaks and nothing has been done since then. Is it okay to ask the Board to help us out with this leaking problem? Thank you.

**Men's Shelter at 119 Chapel Road, Barrigada**

**Eviction**

On August 6, 2013 - 35 year old client was evicted for no call/no show for two consecutive days.

On August 26, 2013 - 62 year old client was evicted for no call/no show for two consecutive days.

A 34 year old male individual was housed on August 30, 2013. He was evicted on September 17, 2013 for noncompliance with house rules and policies.

**Program Discrepancies/ Needs**

We are still cleaning and renovating the duplex at 122 Tun Bihu Street, Ordot owned by the Archdiocese of Agana. It will be used as the Men's Shelter hopefully before the New Year. The lease for the Barrigada house will expire in January 2014. Power and water is connected. Meters and shut off valves were also installed.

Fire exit signs, smoke detectors and electrical conduits for emergency lights are needed. Two ceiling fans and the front & back screen doors need to be replaced. Support Service Division was informed and the request is pending for the reporting month. A Shelter Manager is working closely with Support Services Division in regard to the renovation of the Ordot house.
