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Findings and recommendations were issued by the Step III Grievance Committee on March 25, 2013. At the June 6, 2013 hearing before the Commission, DOE Management represented that it was moving toward payment of any outstanding increment payments in light of the issuance of Executive Order 2013-004, which lifted the freeze on increments. Although DOE Management attempted to ensure that all payments could be made to all employees to whom such increments were owed in a timely manner, by the time this matter returned to the Commission for a further hearing on August 6, 2013, full payment of all increments, inclusive of any retroactive pay, had not yet been paid to the Employees grieving here. As a result, the Commission thus orders that these thirty eight (38) Employees be paid in full for any increments due that were unpaid as a result of the issuance of Executive Order 2011-14, including any retroactive amounts.
