Attached is the FY2014 Supplemental Budget and a draft resolution for consideration at the upcoming GEB Special Session scheduled for Wednesday, May 28, 2014.

A work session was held on May 21, 2014 at which time the details of the \$5.4M Supplemental Budget were discussed. As you may be aware, the Supplemental funding request will cover costs associated with ensuring the Okkodo High School Expansion, Luis P. Untalan Middle School, and the new Tiyan High School have sufficient funding to open the SY2014-2015 in August.

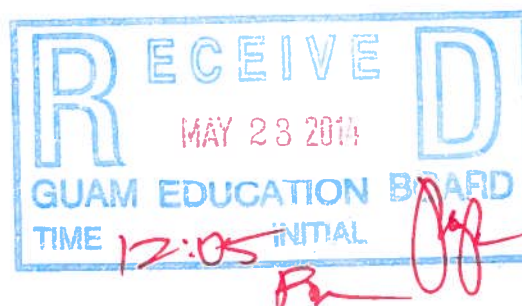
Our request also includes funding for food services for both Summer School and the increase in the cost of our food services contract. Finally, we are also addressing the funding shortfall in projected utilities costs, as well as anticipated costs associated with the relocation of our Central Office.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3121 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated, the Guam Education Board (GEB) on January 31, 2013 passed GEB Resolution 2013-01 adopting the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget for the Guam Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Department of Education has determined a supplemental budget would be necessary to address \$2,628,028 in projected (water and power) shortfall; \$1,573,146 in projected food services costs; \$58,969 for Summer School Food Services; \$313,383 to cover the reopening of the Luis P. Untalan Middle School's (LPUMS) Barrigada campus; \$56,584 to cover the expense of moving the GDOE Central Offices; \$131,829 for costs related to the opening of the Okkodo Expansion; and \$657,656 for the opening of the Tiyan High School in Tiyan ; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Department of Education Supplemental Budget is submitted to meet the goals of the "Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act," which fall within the statutory responsibility of the Guam Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, the LPUMS re-opening of its Barrigada campus will require the movement, from its interim Tiyan campus, of personnel and equipment, the referenced expenses herein represent associated costs (moving costs, utilities, and essential contractual services) needed in Fiscal Year 2014 to ensure the Barrigada campus is appropriately operational for the upcoming SY2014-2015; and

WHEREAS, the Okkodo Expansion and the Tiyan High School will also be opened and operational in SY2014-2015 (commencing August 15, 2014), and the related expenses represent the necessary funding of 33 personnel, supplies, utilities, and essential contractual services (custodial, solid waste and cash collection, photocopying and ERATE); and

WHEREAS, Okkodo Expansion includes an additional serving area requiring 6 new cafeteria personnel, the GEB concurs and hereby approves such hiring pursuant to Section 3101(m) of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated; and

First new food code training conducted at PHARE

THE Department of Public Health and Social Services conducted its first training session related to the new Guam food code during the Guam Hotel & Restaurant Association's Pacific Hotel & Restaurant Expo (PHARE) yesterday at Hyatt Regency Guam.

PHARE, a GHRA event, opened Wednesday and concluded yesterday. Yesterday's session included training that focused on the changes made to the food code, which dictates how food is handled and stored in restaurants and other establishments that sell food.

GHRA President Mary Rhodes said this is the first outreach DPHSS has done. Additionally, the department will work with GHRA to conduct similar monthly trainings throughout the rest of the year. Personnel who may have missed the training offered yesterday will have the opportunity to undergo it in the coming months, she said. Interested individuals should contact GHRA for more information.

Six food code courses were offered yesterday, including general knowledge, demonstration of general knowledge, consumer advisory, hazard analysis and critical control points (HAACP), variance in HAACP, a "no bare-hand contact" course and a "time-

and-temperature" course.

HAACP is a system of preventive measures to ensure food is stored and handled safely. SGS Guam conducted the HAACP training during yesterday's PHARE. The ideal number of participants for the training course would be 20. About six people attended the HAACP training yesterday, according to Josie Bahaan, consumer manager for SGS Guam.

Waiver

Rhodes added that GHRA is working with SGS Guam to develop a single waiver for the industry to waive food code processes regarding the preparation of certain foods. "So we're going to be working with them on getting all of the hotel and restaurants to go under a single waiver of the no bare-hand contact (provision) for Japanese food only,"

Rhodes said.

Rhodes said foods like sushi are traditionally prepared without gloves. "Traditionally, there are things that go with sushi that protect against bacteria like vinegar and there's a whole process with making sushi that it's sanitary," she said. "But you have to prove what your process includes and you have to follow HAACP... you have to go through an approval process with the Department of Public Health and Social Services."

The single waiver would ease that process.

About 30 private and public businesses exhibited their prod-

ucts at yesterday's PHARE while food code training took place in a separate ballroom at the Hyatt.

Rhodes said the PHARE is a benefit to the public. "This is where the distributors can test product and test what the consumers like and can better negotiate things with the hotels and restaurants," she said. "You have to remember we import a majority of what's sold and produced on Guam so opportunities like this where our vendors can interact with the public are very important to test whether or not their products make sense for Guam."

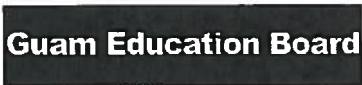

Man behind bomb threats sentenced

Ordered to pay restitution

THE man who made 911 calls on three occasions and made bomb threats against the Guam Superior Court Northern Satellite Court to avoid his small claims hearings was sentenced to serve 18 months in federal prison and pay \$2,389 in restitution.

Michael San Nicolas Santos pleaded guilty on Nov. 14, 2013 to three counts of maliciously conveying false information by telephone.

The court ordered Santos to pay \$639 to the chief of police of the Guam Police Department and \$1,150 to the Judiciary of Guam, Administrative Office of the Court. Santos was also instructed to write a letter of apology to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam; Presiding Judge Alberto Lamorena of the Superior Court of Guam; Hiep T. Nguyen, the owner of Pho Saigon restaurant; Fred Bordallo, the chief of police; and vendors of the Dededo Mall.

On Sept. 26, Oct. 10 and 29, Santos called 911 using a cellphone with a Docomo SIM card he purchased at a Mobil gas station. On each of those dates, Santos was scheduled to appear as a defendant in a small claims case at the Northern Satellite Court which is located in the Dededo Mall.

Each of the phone calls caused the evacuation of the court and other areas of the mall, resulting in a continuance of his case.

An investigation conducted by the FBI, the Guam Police Department, E911 personnel, the Guam Fire Department and the Joint Terrorism Task Force determined that the device used to make the call on Sept. 26 was

the same device used on Oct. 10 but with a different SIM card.

Subpoena

A subpoena to Docomo Pacific traced the SIM card to a Mobil gas station. Mobil personnel advised investigators that for the month of October they sold six SIM cards.

Agents also reviewed the receipts for each card sale and reviewed the surveillance video of the gas station. The video revealed that Santos purchased a SIM card at 9 a.m. on Oct. 10. On Oct. 17, Santos was observed buying another SIM card at the same gas station.

FBI Task Force Officer Jesse L.G. Santos said he has known Santos for approximately three years and positively identified the suspect in the surveillance video and in the E911 recordings.

On Oct. 25, Judge Joaquin Manibusan issued a search warrant which authorized law enforcement personnel to search Santos' residence for the cellphone and the SIM cards he used to call E911. On Oct. 29 he was seen purchasing another prepaid cellphone and proceeded to the Department of Revenue and Taxation parking lot. He was seen working with a cellphone and then drove around the park across the street from the Dededo Mall. A few minutes after he was seen driving on Villago-

mez Road, agents were notified that E911 received another telephoned bomb threat at around 10:41 a.m. Santos went back to the Dededo Mall where he was approached by FBI agents.

Santos told FBI agents that he was scared of going to court and confessed that he made the bomb threats on Oct. 29, Sept. 26 and Oct. 10 in order to avoid his court hearings.

Arrivals up for first half of May

FOR the first half of the month, the island welcomed more than 44,000 tourists, a 6.5 percent increase compared to the same period last year.

According to the preliminary arrival report from the Guam Visitors Bureau, the day with the most arrivals was Saturday, May 3, when a total of 5,921 visitors landed on island. On other subsequent days, 2,000 to 3,000 tourists arrived at one time.

So far, for the entire year, just more than 500,000 people visited Guam, which is almost equal to the numbers from 2013. In 2013, 501,496 people

had arrived on Guam by this time, which is slightly less than the 508,525 who have arrived on island as of May 15 this year.

The difference with this year's numbers is the continued growth in different markets. According to the report from GVB, numbers from Japan show a continued decrease in arrivals. This month so far, GVB recorded an 11.2 percent decrease in the month-to-date arrivals for the island's leading visitor market.

However, like last month, GVB reveals that Korea "again more than made up for the slight decline in Japan's visitor numbers." More than 3,000 more Koreans chose Guam as a vacation spot in the first half

of the month than last year, an increase of 38.8 percent.

As has been the case since the beginning of the year, Russian and Chinese visitor numbers indicate promise. With the recently announced direct flights from China to commence next month, the number of Chinese travels is expected to rise over the course of the year.

For the first half of May, about 700 more Russians and 70 more Chinese arrived on island. According to a statement from GVB, the direct flights, which will be operated in partnership with Dynamic Airlines, could bring up to 235 passengers to Guam on each trip.

Proposed Issuance of Underground Injection Control System Operating Permits for DFS Guam Ltd. Public Review and Comment Period: May 21, 2014 to June 20, 2014

The Guam Environmental Protection Agency (Guam EPA) runs the Underground Injection Control (UIC) Program, as mandated by the Safe Drinking Water Act and approved by U.S. EPA.

The Agency regulates all applicable activities as set forth in the Guam's UIC Regulations. The UIC Program requires operating permits for all existing injection wells systems. This includes wells built prior to the approval of the regulations are still in operation, and wells/system constructed after the effective date of the regulations.

Guam EPA has received applications from DFS Guam Ltd for three injection systems located at DFS Tumon Galleria San Vitores Road, Tumón, Guam. The building has offices, gift and novelty stores, and souvenir shops with subsurface drainage system at parking areas.

On the basis of a preliminary UIC requirement review, the Administrator has proposed issuing UIC permits to allow discharges of stormwater runoff into the injection systems.

The discharges contain stormwater runoff only. No industrial discharges or any discharges are allowed into the systems.

- The permits for these applications will require:
- 1 - Only stormwater runoff to be discharged into the injection systems
 - 2 - Semi-annual monitoring of water quality for MBAS, Oil and Grease, NO3-N, Endrin, Lindane, Toxaphene, 2, 4-D, 2, 4, 5-TP, Silvex, Heptachlor, Methoxychlor, Lead, Benzene, Ethylbenzene, Xylene, Toluene, MTBE, Boron, CO2, and pH;
 - 3 - Assurance regarding repairs, replacement, or abandonment of the well/system in the event of failure.
 - 4 - A laboratory analysis report of runoff water taken from the designated sampling point of the system, and
 - 5 - Compliance with other UIC requirements.

A copy of the Draft Permits and Permit Applications for the above applicant and all other supporting documents are available for public inspection from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. Monday through Friday at the Water

Resources Management Program Section of the Water Division, Guam Environmental Protection Agency, located at 15-6101 Mariner Ave., Tyan, Barrigada 96913.

If there are no appeals, the Draft Permits become final. Operation of the injection systems identified by the applicant may proceed subject to the conditions of the permits and other applicable legal requirements.

The final decision to set conditions and issue the final permits or deny application for the permits will be decided after all comments have been considered. If no comments are received within the 30-day waiting period, the final permits shall be issued immediately after the commenting period closes.
