ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of the Trust shall be the Guam Ancestral Land Bank Trust (hereinafter called the "Land Bank Trust" or "Trust").

ARTICLE II - AUTHORITY

A. On June 09, 1999, Public Law No. 25-45 created the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission ("GALC" or "ALC"). The legislative intent of this public law was "to pursue just remedies to redress the harm done to landowners as individuals and to Guam as a whole, resulting from the taking of Guamanian lands by the United States on or after January 1, 1930." ¹

Two classes of landowners emerge:

- 1) Those whose lands have been declared excess by the Federal Government, and
- 2) Those whose lands have *not* been declared excess and may or may not likely be declared excess by the United States in the future.

It was the intent of I Liheslaturan $Gu\mathring{a}han$ to "address the requirements of both classes by enactment of this law."

P.L. No. 25-45 also instructed that a Guam-based trust be established whereby GALC is given the title, as Trustees, of former Spanish Crown Lands and other non-ancestral lands, to manage and place these lands under a Land Bank, and to provide a mechanism for generating income on these properties to be used to provide just compensation for those dispossessed ancestral landowners.

The following is cited under Public Law 25-45, Section 80104.

(e) Land Bank. The Commission shall take title, as Trustees, of former Spanish Crown Lands and other non-ancestral lands that are conveyed by the Federal government to the government of Guam after the effective date of this Act, on behalf of ancestral landowners who, by virtue of continued government or public benefit use cannot regain possession or title to their ancestral lands.

The Commission shall establish a Guam-based trust to administer all assets and revenues of the land bank of the aforementioned lands and manage the lands, and act as the developer of the lands, *if necessary*, to the highest and best use. The Commission shall establish rules and regulations pursuant to the Administration Adjudication Law for the Guam-based trust. The resulting income shall be used to provide just compensation for those dispossessed ancestral landowners.

B. In instances where there is a discrepancy between Public Law and these Rules and Regulations, Public Law shall take precedence.

ARTICLE III - TRUSTEES

The Guam Ancestral Lands Commission as appointed by the Governor, will also assume authority as Trustees of the Trust.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

- A. The officers of the Trust shall consist of a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer. The offices of the Secretary and Treasurer may be combined if deemed desirable.
 - 1. CHAIRPERSON. The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Trust and shall supervise its business and activities. The Chairperson may sign deeds, contracts, or other documents authorized by the majority of the Trustees.
 - VICE-CHAIRPERSON. The Vice-Chairperson shall, in the event of the absence or disability of the Chairperson, possess all of the powers and perform all the duties of the Chairperson.
 - 3. SECRETARY. The Secretary shall be responsible for routine correspondence, posting of notices, and preparation of required reports. The Secretary shall also ensure the meetings are properly recorded and disseminated as required.
- B. The officers of the Trust will be elected by the Trustees at their regular meeting in November or in the case of new appointments, at the first regular meeting following the appointment of the new Trustees. Officers will be elected for one-year terms.
- C. Vacancies. 1) Officer. The unexpired term of an officer shall be filled immediately by regular Trustee election procedures. 2) Trustee. The unexpired term of a Trustee shall be filled by appointment by the Governor.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

- A. The Trustees shall meet regularly on a bi-monthly basis. Special and Interim meetings may be called by the Chairperson at any time upon notice to the Trustees and the general public according the open government laws.
- B. Meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.
- C. Meetings and records shall be consistent with public laws in effect.

ARTICLE VI - PROCESS AND PROCEDURE

A. NOTIFICATION PROCESS:

Every effort will be made to notify the public regarding application taking for those who wish to apply for monetary compensation under Public Law 25-45. Notification through various media of general circulation may include but not limited to printed media of general circulation, radio, television and/or other effective form of communication. Included on this outreach effort may also involve the village mayor's offices and other community organizations to assist in the dissemination of this information.

The information will include at a minimum:

- Explanation on Public Law 25-45 on eligibility for compensation under the Land Bank Trust Fund.
- Where to obtain the Application for Compensation under the Land Bank Trust Fund.
- Deadline for submission of application.
- GALC's hours of operation.

Administrative Procedures:

To keep applicants informed on the status of their application, this information may placed on GALC's web-site not later 120 days of their application. The claimants will be informed on their application package of the GALC's intention to publicize names of applicants for compensation plan on the GALC web-site.

- A staff may reject the submission of an incomplete application.
- If too many applicants requesting assistance with the completion of their application obstruct the daily functions of the GALC, then the Executive Director may designate a certain day of the week for such purpose.
- The Executive Director will be given authority to accept incomplete applications if minor information is missing, but the applicant's provided information is sufficient for the GALC to determine their eligibility. This means that the Executive Director may proceed with his recommendation of eligibility or ineligibility to the Board of Commissioners because he was able to glean needed information from other evidence/documents submitted or from the GALC's archives. The Board still reserves the opportunity to accept, postpone or reject an application.

B. ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPENSATION FROM LAND BANK TRUST FUNDS:

Ancestral Land NOT Returned:

An ancestral land owner may be eligible and benefit from the Land Bank Trust if they lost their property by federal condemnation or taking on or after January 1, 1930; and their ancestral property has not been returned to them.

These ancestral land owners shall be grouped under the following:

1) Group 1: The property was taken and land owner received no compensation.

2) Group 2:

- a) The property was taken and land owner received compensation \underline{only} at the initial taking or
- b) The property was taken, no compensation was received at the initial taking however compensation was accepted from the 39.5 million (re: land takings between July 21, 1944, and August 23, 1962; John A. Bohn)
- 3) Group 3: The property was taken and land owner received compensation BOTH at the initial taking and also received additional compensation from the 39.5 million.

The amount of compensation awarded to a claimant will be adjusted by the amount or amounts already received by the claimant. i.e. Group 1 claimants will qualify for 100% compensation while Group 2 and Group 3 will have their compensation adjusted by the amount already awarded.

PROCESS FOR EXTINGUISHMENT OF CLAIMS FROM THE LAND BANK TRUST:

The process for determining eligibility for compensation or benefits under the Land Bank Trust will mirror the process for the return of lands as outlined in Public Law 25-178 **EXCEPT**, there will be no return of lands and a legal representative (Administrator) of ancestral land claim must be appointed.

- The claimant must prove their ancestral lands claim.
- The claimant must be a court appointed administrator for the estate of an ancestral land claim.
- The claimant must sign a legal document that relinquishes future claim to the property in exchange for receiving monetary compensation from the Land Bank Trust fund.
- The claimant must assign their claim of interest to the related real properties to the Ancestral Lands Commission.

FILING OF ANCESTRAL CLAIM:

Applicant in this first step submits an application to the Commission containing applicant's assertion that applicant and others, if any, hold ancestral title in relation to a specified lot of land by virtue of inheritance. Based upon the information provided, the Commission shall make a determination if in fact a valid basis for an ancestral title claim exists. The ancestral title claim shall then be entered in the Claims Registry. The Claims Registry shall contain the information required to be entered, as established by the Commission by rules and regulations.

Eliqibility Determination:

To ensure that unnecessary expenses are not incurred by those applicants who may not be eligible to benefit from the Land Bank Trust, a preliminary application with minimum requirements will be used to determine applicant's eligibility. Those applicants who pass the preliminary screening will be requested to finalize their application by submitting additional documents/evidence required by the Commission in support of their ancestral land claim.

The GALC staff will accept claimant's preliminary application provided the following minimum requirements are met:

- 1) The application in the prescribed form, as established by the Commission is completely filled out;
- 2) The applicant provides accompanying documents at the very minimum of which include:
 - i. a sworn affidavit (form #4) that the applicant:
 - 1. believes that the ancestral title has not been extinguished in relation to any part of the land claimed; and
 - 2. believes that all of the statements made in the application are true;
 - ii. a statement containing all information known to the applicant about their interest (form #2) in relation to any of the land identified in their claim.;
 - iii. a description and map of the area over which the ancestral title is claimed;
 - iv. evidence of heir ship;
 - v. name and address of the person who is to be considered the claimant (The name of the person given under this item will become the registered ancestral title claimant).
 - vi. a legal document showing the applicant as the court appointed administrator authorized to represent the estate of an original land owner.

Applications for preliminary determination of eligibility will be accepted by the GALC during normal hours of operation. The GALC staff will place a stamp and date received on completed applications upon submission. A control number will be assigned on each application.

The claimant must pay the required processing fees at the time of submission.

The GALC will notify applicants in writing of their preliminary eligibility within 90 calendar days from date of submission.

The applicant will be given up to 90 days after notification to submit any additional information required. Extensions to this deadline may be granted by the Executive Director of GALC. The Executive Director must make his judgmental decision on any request for extension and ensure that his decision on the approval of any extension will not cause an inequity on the distribution of Land Bank Trust funds that may be unfavorable to the applicants requesting for the extension.

The extension does not affect the methodology on distribution of funds established by the Commission on the applicant's Group classification. This means that the methodology to be used for compensation has not yet been adjudicated at the time of • DRAFT 02-19-2014, Page 7 of 8 •

applicant's request for extension, or other applicants under the same Group classification have submitted similar request.

The request for extension must be submitted in writing on or before the deadline set for submission of required documents.

Untimely submission of required documents may result in elimination of claimant's application for compensation under the Land Bank Trust funds.

Final Determination of Eligibility:

All applications will be presented during a Public Hearing for review and final approval by the Guam Ancestral Lands Commission.

A claimant's formal application (with required documents) will be submitted to the Board of Commissioners for review and approval during a regular public hearing for "Hearings on Applications for Compensation under the Land Bank Trust".

Claimants will be notified of these public hearings through the newspaper of general media circulation and will be invited to attend the scheduled Commission Meeting when their applications will be presented.

All claimants determined eligible for compensation will be entered into the Claims Registry. This registry may be inspected by any member of the public during normal business hours. No part of the Claims Registry is to be kept confidential from the public. The GALC will ensure that the Claims Registry is kept updated with details of any claims contained in applications given to the Commission, or of any amendments made to a claim.

COMPENSATION APPLICATION.

A claimant may exercise the claimant's right to extinguish an ancestral claim by submitting an application to the Commission for a determination of compensation award.

The Commission must accept an ancestral compensation application provided the requirements are met as follows:

- 1. It is in the prescribed form, as established by the Commission;
- 2. It contains the information required and as prescribed in relation to the specific claim.
- 3. Provide any additional documents requested to supplement the minimum requirements previously submitted.
- 4. Pay all required fees as prescribed by the Commission.

CERTIFICATION OF AWARD OF JUST COMPENSATION:

In awarding just compensation, the Commission shall issue a Certification of Award of Just Compensation on Condition of Extinguishment of Ancestral Title Claim. The Certification of Award of Just Compensation shall be entered into the Conditional Awards Registry. The Conditional Awards Registry shall contain as much of the information in relation to each determination as must be entered into the Register, at minimum of which shall consist of:

- 1. The name of the Commission or designee that made the determination.
- 2. Date on which the determination was made.
- 3. Area, location, and description of specific land covered by the determination.

 - 4. Other details about the determination or decision as the Commission deems appropriate.

The Conditional Awards Registry shall be made available for the public's inspection during normal business hours.

EXTINGUISHMENT OF ANCESTRAL LAND CLAIM:

An eligible ancestral land claimant is granted compensation from the Land Bank Trust Fund on the condition that the ancestral title holder surrenders all rights and interests in relation to their ancestral land claims after their court appointed administrator of their ancestral land executes an "Extinguishment of Ancestral Land Claim" form (form provided by GALC) thereby permanently extinguishing all rights, interests and claims.

Upon the Commission's award of just compensation and extinguishment of claims, the ancestral title holder's name is removed from the Conditional Awards Registry, and is entered into the Land Bank Trust Fund list of beneficiaries by the Commission.

The Commission shall prescribe the appropriate form to effectuate issuance of compensation and extinguishment of ancestral claims.

Once listed as a beneficiary to the Land Bank Trust Fund, after acceptance of specifically described compensation, the holder and all of holder's heirs, successors and assigns, and those who may assert subsequent claims derived from the holder, are forever barred from reentry into the Claims Registry.

INELIGIBILITY FOR COMPENSATION FROM THE LAND BANK TRUST

Any ancestral land owner who had their original land returned or they made an exchange for other lands will not qualify to receive funds from the Land Bank Trust fund.

Applicants determined ineligible for compensation may request for an informal hearing to the Executive Director of GALC within 20 working days from the date of their letter of ineligibility. The Executive Director or his duly assigned designee is authorized to review the applicant's letter appealing their ineligibility determination and is further authorized to both rescind the letter of ineligibility and have the applicant proceed with the necessary documents required from all eligible applicants.


If ineligibility is upheld, the applicant shall be notified as such.
