

7. Description of Project:

Releases of the endangered Guam rail on the island of Rota, CNMI, began in 1989 in order to establish a population. Between 1989 and 2013, over 1000 rails have been released in nine locations along the eastern (Dugi, Gampapa, Saguagaga) and southern (Apanan) areas of Rota. Many releases at the onset of the program focused on release methodology, determining appropriate release sites, as well as collecting data on survivorship. Eleven years after the first release, rail preferred habitat was determined. Nineteen years after the first release, the Dugi release site proved the most promising. Rails released in Dugi from 2002 to 2004 continued to persist at this site even when releases moved to the Apanan area (2005 to 2008) 12km away.

The 2013 annual survey result for the population of Rota Guam rails is estimated at 135 rails. The goal is to release 100 birds a year for five consecutive years in Dugi yet this has not been accomplished due to limitations with the captive breeding program. From 2009 to 2013, only 50 birds a year have been released and no release is scheduled for 2014 due to difficulties in reproduction.

A yearly survey in June monitors Rota's rail population growth. Sightings of unbanded rails in Dugi are increasing and rails are currently detected in Gampapa and As Matmas. Increased monitoring is necessary.

8. Project Need:

Rails are secretive birds and are a challenge to survey when numbers are low. The Rota rail population is not established, yet a small population founded from released captive-bred rails currently exists. The annual June rail survey uses a series of playbacks to determine the presence of rails as well as reproductive activity and population growth. With a 50% response rate as well as quick habituation to playback calls, new methods for measuring the Rota population are needed.

9. Objectives:

- 1. Census rails at stationary point counts in Dugi, Gampapa, and As Matmas during the months of November, February, March, and August.
- 2. Record rails with acoustic monitors at three transects. Recording will cover at least a 24 hour period. Point count surveys will be conducted during times when monitors are recording.

10. Benefits:

Increased and improved rail monitoring techniques will provide more accurate population estimates on Rota rails.

11. Approach:

- 1. Continue to survey stationary points established in FY2014 along roads and trails in Dugi, Gamapapa, and As Matmas. Observer will spend ten minutes at each station before walking 50 meters to the next station. Observer will document all rail calls, call types, visuals, number of rails, location and distance of calls from the station, date, time, weather conditions, moon phase, and habitat. A map will be drawn if necessary. The morning census will ensure at least two points are surveyed in darkness (prior to sunrise) and the evening census will require two points surveyed in darkness (post sunset). A total of eight to ten surveys will be accomplished during a five day trip to Rota. The point count survey will be repeated during the months of November, February, March, and August.
- 2. Acoustic monitors purchased in FY14 will be used to augment the rail data collected. At least 36 hours of sound will be recorded at three survey transects (24 hours per location). The point count survey will be conducted simultaneously while acoustic monitors are running. Monitors will run prior and post survey to determine if staff are surveying during optimal rail calling time. The three transects to be recorded are yet to be determined. The final survey for FY14 will be completed in August and data from the four surveys will be used to determine placement of the monitors.
- 3. Improve and/or modify Rota rail monitoring techniques. Analyze data collected in FY14 and adjust survey methods accordingly. Compare data collected on sound monitors to data collected during silent point count surveys and modify protocol if needed.
