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**AN ACT TO AMEND § 85103(b) OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM  
CODE ANNOTATED; RELATIVE TO THE COMPOSITION OF  
THE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES.**

**1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

**2 Section 1.** 5 GCA § 85103(b) is hereby *amended* to read:

**3** “(b) Composition. The governing board shall consist of eleven (11)  
**4** members to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the  
**5** Legislature. The Governor, when making initial appointments, shall designate six  
**6** (6) members to serve for two (2) year terms and five (5) members to serve for  
**7** four (4) year terms. Subsequent appointments shall be for terms of four (4) years  
**8** except that when a vacancy occurs, it shall be filled by appointment of the  
**9** Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature for the remainder of the  
**10** vacating member’s term. ~~No person shall serve more than one four year~~  
**11** ~~appointment without interruption.”~~

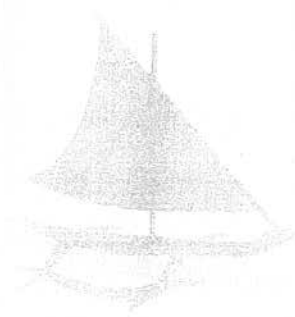

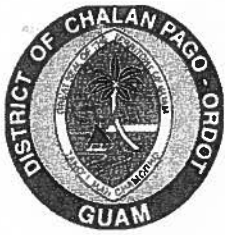


As the current Legislative Liaison for the Mayors' Council of Guam, I have been authorized by a majority vote of the Mayors' & Vice-Mayors', at our regular monthly meeting held on Wednesday, December 3, 2014, to submit testimony **IN SUPPORT** of this bill on behalf of the Mayors' Council. Additionally, during our discussions on this bill, the Mayors' Council is requesting for an amendment to Bill 427-32 that will "add" a voting member to the governing board for the Council on the Arts and Humanities (CAHA), to be appointed by the Mayors' Council of Guam.

First, it is the position of the Mayors' Council, that the basic intent of this bill, to eliminate board appointments for more than four (4) years "without interruption", is reasonable and appropriate. That, the passage of this bill acknowledges the importance of "continuity" within CAHA's governing board in their effort to maintain strong leadership and experience among these volunteers. And, should our request for an amendment to this bill be supported by the Legislature, we believe that this will further add to the continuity of leadership within CAHA's governing board.

It has always been evident throughout our Island's history that most of the arts and humanities programs, for all ages, rests on the support from our community and, often times, the advocacy of our Mayors and Vice-Mayors. With our requested amendment to this bill; to add a voting member appointment from the Mayors' Council of Guam; we believe that this will foster an even stronger relationship between CAHA, their Governing Board, and ALL of our villages. However, it will be up to the Legislature to determine if the board composition remains at eleven (11) appointments by the Governor or, is reduced to ten (10), with the eleventh appointment coming from the Mayors' Council of Guam. And, since an appointment from Mayors' Council does NOT involve any stipend or new financial requirements, there should be no budget concerns linked to this requested amendment.

The Mayors' Council of Guam submits this letter of support and request for an amendment, in hope that it receives favorable support from our Senators; and, if adopted and passed, the support of our Governor. That, often times, our Island leaders seek out the support and assistance of the Mayors' & Vice-Mayors' of Guam; but, in this case, we publicly offer up our assistance to the Council on the Arts and Humanities and its Governing Board.

Dear Mr. Rabon:

*Håfa Adai and Si Yu'os Ma'åse* for your comments regarding the nomination of Mr. Vincent Reyes for Master of Chamorro Dance. Your contributions in interpreting, educating our youth, promoting and preserving our dance traditions are significant accomplishments and as the first recognized Master of Chamorro Dance your thoughts regarding Mr. Reyes' nomination are important, however, as President of the Department of Chamorro Affairs, which is the umbrella organization that oversees the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities I must respond to your comments, practically to the following:

1. "That the individual being nominated should have trained under a recognized master (if any) in the discipline that the individual is being nominated".

*Nowhere in the legislation or selection criteria does it indicate that the nominee must have trained under a recognized master.*

2. "... the nomination and selection of Master of Chamorro Dance was to occur ever four (4) years...."

*Due to the long lapse since the last awards in the 1990's, it was the CAHA Board's decision to award up to 4 masters per year for the next two years.*

3. "...Rites of Passage (Chalan Fuesá) for members in the organized Guma (cultural houses)...."

*There is no question that the work that you and Pa'a have done to develop rites of passage and stages of cultural practice is commendable, however, as you pointed out, this is for your Guma' members to pursue their passion. These stages only apply to Pa'a and have not been sanctioned by Guam CAHA who is the government entity responsible for the selection of masters.*

4. "...Manfa'ana'guen Bailan Chamorro" (Tribal Council) introduced adopted and recognized by I Mina Trentai Dos Na Liheslaturan Guahan on July 2, 2014 - Resolution 412-32.

*To translate "...Manfa'ana'guen Bailan Chamorro" as Tribal Council is misleading because Chamorro people (I taotao tano') have never referred to their people as a tribe. This is troubling as a legislative resolution. Pa'a is a non-profit organization and not a government agency and therefore this "tribal council" will only function as a council for Pa'a groups. It has not been sanctioned by a government agency, namely Department of Chamorro Affairs or CAHA. This is commendable work is Pa' is functioning as a tribe.*

5. The thirteen (13) "individuals have gone through their "Rites of Passage" achieving their title as Fafana'gue being trained under a recognized Master of Chamorro Dance."

*This is very commendable work by Pa'a, but is has not been adopted by CAHA or the Department of Chamorro Affairs. If it were to be adopted, these rites of passage would apply to all Chamorro dance groups*

*and not just to the Guma' members of Pa'a. The Traditional Masters Program is a CAHA initiative; therefore, any adopted rituals would be the responsibility of CAHA. In 2010, Mr. Reyes and Intenon Gef Pa'go were listed as a Pa'a Guma'. He was initiated and given the title of Fafana'gue. Sometime after 2010, Pa'a established a certification step for all Fafana'gue and Mr. Reyes was not included. Why was Mr. Reyes dropped from the Pa'a membership?*

6. "As I review Mr. Reyes' nomination packet I find no beginning, no roots, no ties to completing his "Rites of Passage" to receive his certificate of "Fafana'gue", or trained under a recognized Master of Chamorro Dance." ..." The title of "Master of Chamorro Dance is much more deeper, more profound and represents a significant value in the traditional world of indigenous people than a certificate of accomplishments."

*Pa'a publications and press releases from 2010 to 2013 list Mr. Reyes as being a Fafana'gue and Intenon Gef Pa'go as being a Guma'. By bestowing the Fafana'gue title, you verified that you recognized his roots and his training to that point. In academia, a PhD title cannot be taken away once it has been bestowed. Has Mr. Reyes' title been removed by you as a Traditional Master or by Pa'a or by the Counsel? If so, why?*

*Yes, the title of Master of Chamorro Dance has significant value in the traditional world. Foremost in the responsibilities of this title is for the Master to continue to practice, to inspire and to teach. The title does not bestow any powers beyond the recognition of artistic excellence and the dedicated perpetuation of their traditional art form. This is what we are asking from the master in making recommendations for a nominee. We invite you to specifically address the concerns you have with the way Vince Reyes is practicing and promoting Chamorro dance.*

The main issue that you stipulate is that you alone singly has the "rights of passage" and exclusivity to train people on Chamorro Dance. There is no known patent for the expression of Chamorro Dance, nor is there is no one Chamorro Dance group or its teacher that can tout that they are the only conduit to perpetuating Chamorro Dance traditional or contemporary forms of expression.

The Council has followed all processes and adhered to the guidelines relative to the Guam Masters Award.

Again, *Si Yu'os Ma'ase* for your comments that are now public record.
