Dear Madam Speaker:

Enclosed is Bill No. 429-32 (COR), An Act to Add a New Article 5A to Chapter 3, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated Relative to Authorizing the Appointment of Deputies to Enforce Guam's Alcoholic Beverage Control Laws, which I have vetoed.

It is known that the inspection of establishments and facilities serving or selling alcoholic beverages is an event that can lead to great tension. I am concerned about the respective liabilities that the Government, the volunteer, and the alcohol-selling establishment may have to each other in the event that an injury incident occurs. Although Bill 429 authorizes certain privileges and immunities to the volunteers as if they were paid, full-time inspectors, nothing in the bill addresses the liability of the other parties.

Finally, I believe that with the support and funding from the Legislature, the ABC Administrator has the ability to retain full-time inspectors who are authorized employees of the Government, thereby averting the necessity of volunteers.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE 5A TO CHAPTER 3, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF DEPUTIES TO ENFORCE GUAM'S ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL LAWS.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Short Title. This Act *shall* be cited as the "Responsible Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Act."
- 4 Section 2. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 5 that Alcoholic Beverage Control is currently enforced primarily by members of the
- 6 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. The Community Assisted Policing Effort
- 7 (CAPE) volunteers are authorized to issue citations for littering and the

- enforcement of Guam's accessible parking laws. Given the current challenges in 1 2 enforcing Guam's Alcoholic Beverage Control laws, a program establishing 3 Deputies for the enforcement of these laws could greatly improve compliance. 4 It is, therefore, the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to authorize the 5 Administrator to establish an Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program to assist the Board in the enforcement of Guam's Alcoholic Beverage Control laws, 6 7 by adding a new Article 5A to Chapter 3, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated. 8 Section 3. Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program. A new 9 Article 5A is hereby *added* to Chapter 3, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, to read: 10 "ARTICLE 5A 11 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL DEPUTIES PROGRAM 12 § 35A00. Creation. 13 § 35A01. Functions and Duties. 14 § 35A02. Recruitment. 15 § 35A03. Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records. 16 § 35A04. Volunteer: Authority. 17 § 35A05. Same: Eligibility. 18 § 35A06. Same: Oath. 19 § 35A07. Same: Allowance. 20 § 35A08. Same: False Report. 21 Rules and Regulations. § 35A09. 22 § 35A00. Creation.
  - There is hereby created within the Division an Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program, which *shall* be headed by the Administrator. The Administrator, subject to the advice and control of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, *shall* be responsible for carrying out the purpose of this

Article, and *shall* have such additional duties and responsibilities as are authorized herein, or as may be prescribed by the Board.

### § 35A01. Functions and Duties.

The general functions and duties of a member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program *shall* be to serve as volunteer inspectors, as defined in § 3111 of this Chapter, under the general supervision of the Administrator.

### § 35A02. Recruitment.

The Administrator *shall* recruit, on an entirely volunteer basis, local residents who desire to make available their services to assist the Division in carrying out its functions. The Board *shall* further promulgate rules and regulations regarding the age, health and other requirements for recruitment purposes, subject to the Fair Labor Standards Act. The Board *shall* have final approval of candidates to serve as Deputies pursuant to this Article.

## § 35A03. Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records.

The Administrator *shall* devise a training program, approved by the Board, which will provide the members of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program training in operational techniques and procedures for the proper enforcement of the Alcoholic Beverage Control laws. The Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program shall maintain a roster of volunteers who have received the training prescribed herein. In order to maintain membership in the Program, each member must keep up with his scheduled training, and no volunteer may remain in the Program if he or she is unable to keep up with or otherwise absorb the training. Additionally, basic supplies and equipment *shall* be provided to assure proper functioning of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program, including a continuing program for replacement. Each member *shall* be subject to a mandatory

annual assessment of his or her relevant capacities for the proper enforcement of the provisions of this Chapter, failure of which *shall* lead to suspension from the Deputies Program until he or she is able to pass the assessment.

### § 35A04. Volunteer: Authority.

Whenever the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program, and the members thereof are rendering assistance to the Division, such volunteers *shall* have the same powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities, as if they were paid, full-time inspectors.

## § 35A05. Same: Eligibility.

No person shall be a volunteer member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program established under this Article who:

- (a) advocates a change by force or violence in the constitutional form of the Government of the United States or in Guam, or the overthrow of any government in the United States by force, or who has been convicted of or is under indictment or information charging any subversive act against the United States;
- (b) has been convicted of a felony, or of a crime involving moral turpitude, to include a violation under Chapter 52 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, or of driving under the influence pursuant to Chapter 18 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, or equivalent offense; or
- (c) is an employee or owner of an establishment for which an alcoholic beverage license has been issued under this Chapter.

#### § 35A06. Same: Oath.

Every volunteer *shall*, upon entering his duties, take an oath, in writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths in Guam, which oath *shall* be substantially as follows:

"I\_\_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the laws of Guam, against all enemies, foreign or domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties upon which I am about to enter and I do further swear (or affirm) that I do not advocate, nor am I am member of any political party or organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States or of Guam by force or violence; and that during such time as I am a member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program I will not advocate nor become a member of any political party or organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States or of Guam by force or violence."

### § 35A07. Same: Allowance.

Each member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program who successfully completes probationary requirements as established by the Board, and who contributes *at least* forty-two (42) hours per month, *shall* receive an allowance of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per month, to defray the cost of maintenance of their equipment and uniforms. The

Department of Revenue and Taxation *shall* identify funds within their Department appropriations to satisfy the intent of this Section.

## § 35A08. Same: False Report.

A member of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program who makes a false verbal or written report *shall* be subject to disciplinary action, including which may include removal from the Program. Any alleged violations of the provisions of Chapter 52 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, *shall* be reported by the Administrator to the Office of the Attorney General. Any member who has been indicted of a felony, or of a crime involving moral turpitude, or of driving under the influence, pursuant to Chapter 18 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, or equivalent offense, or a violation of Chapter 52 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, *shall* be suspended from the program until the case is dismissed or a decision is entered. If the member is found guilty, he *shall* be removed from the program and become permanently ineligible to become a member.

### § 35A09. Rules and Regulations.

The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board *shall* promulgate rules and regulations for the implementation of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Deputies Program, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, within one hundred eighty (180) days from the enactment of this Act."
